 - Now known as 1.2.9 Royal Oak will resolve to achieve the remainder of its GHG reduction goals by negotiating with its utility to supply the community with enough renewable energy to make up any shortfall required to meet GHG reduction goals.
 - Now known as 1.2.10. If negotiations with the utility to achieve the city's GHG reduction goals are unsuccessful, explore the creation of a community cooperative utility.
 - Long discussion of how this may work. What is reasonable?
 Negotiations with DTE to provide renewable energy must be reasonable in price. (no price gouging by DTE)
