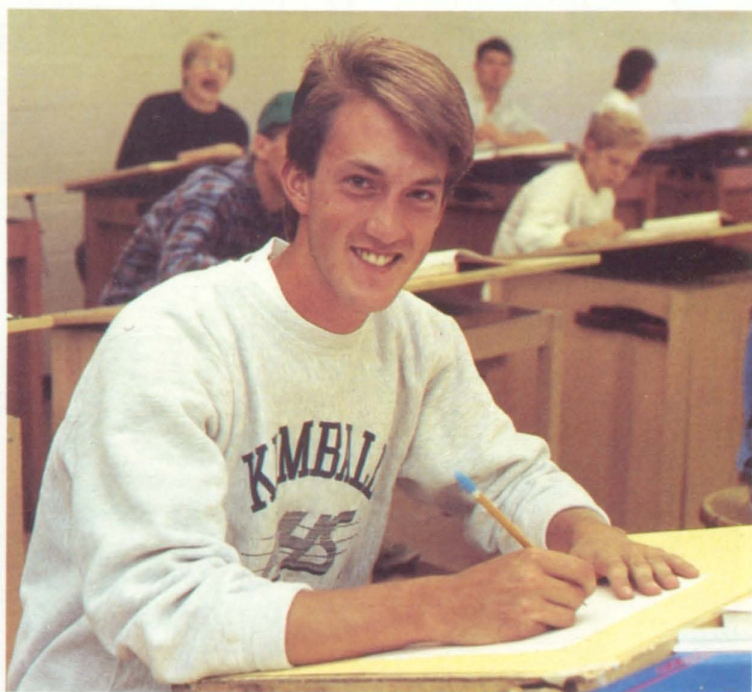
Choosing to go on to college, staying home and working, and join-

Underclassmen should understand how quickly they, too, will become seniors and will be faced with the same decisions my peers and I have had to make concerning our lives in the coming decade.

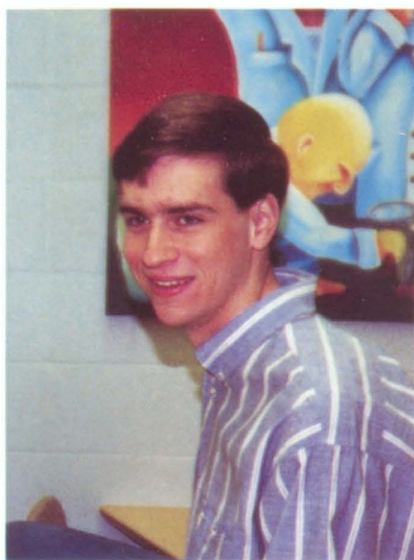
No matter what happens in the future, we will always remember our time spent at Kimball. Be thankful for these times and the time we are given to make the most of our lives.

Jenna Novic has been a member of the Varsity Track team for 4 years. She provided excellent leadership as a team captain.

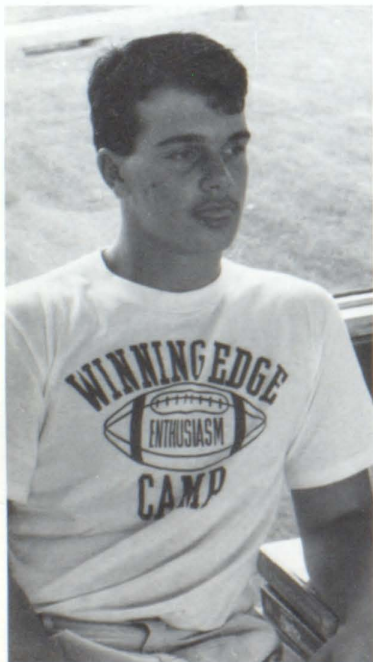

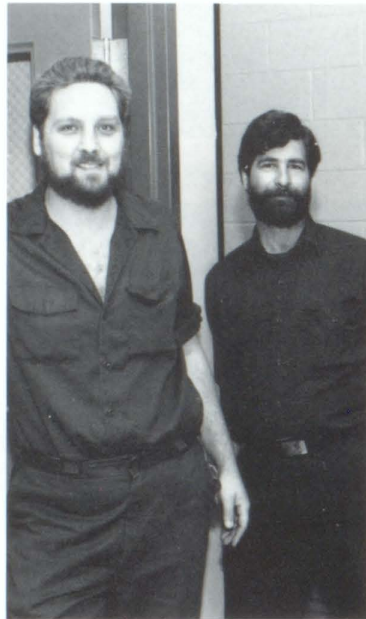

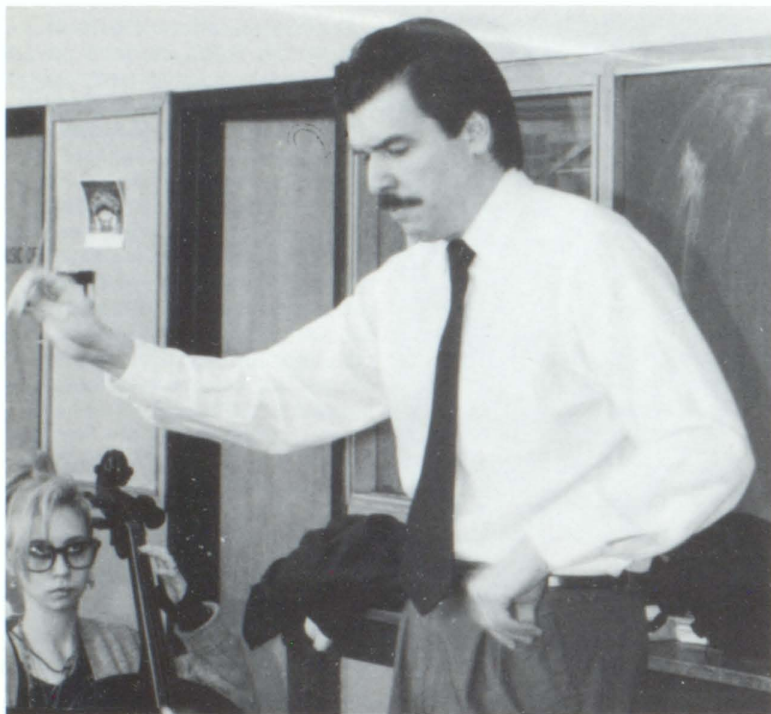

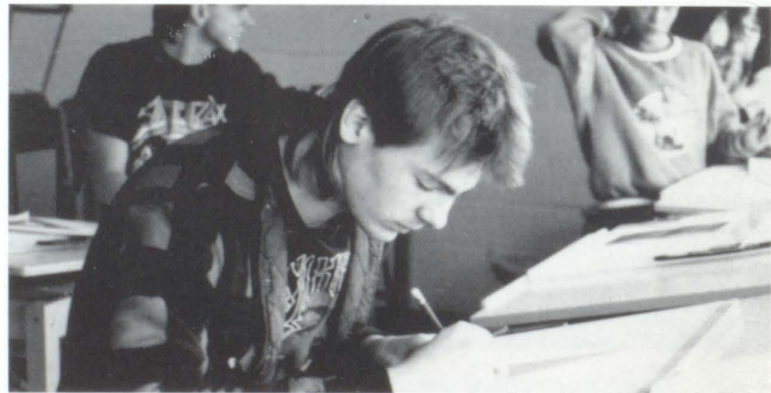

Co-op students are busy people. They maintain a good grade point average, and work a minimum of seventeen hours per week. Co-op is very popular both in high schools and also in colleges. Students in the Co-op program are pursuing a vocation, a good, a skill. While working, students are also in a related vocational class. The related vocational class helps to identify the needs of the employers, assess the students and works to educate the individual so that employability skills are met. Many students in this program will go directly from high school to full-time employment with benefits. Those who do not continue with the same employer will at least have the chance to try out their vocational choice. Others will have gained that ever important need for experience.

Rising expenses pose a problem, whether in high school or college. Co-op jobs provide students with a certain amount of financial independence. Many students are saving for college while others are meeting more immediate financial needs.

Credit is offered to students on Co-op who meet the requirements. Students must work a minimum of 300 hours per semester, must have a class related to the job they have, and are evaluated by the employer each marking period. The final result for Co-op students is credit, early release employability with skills.

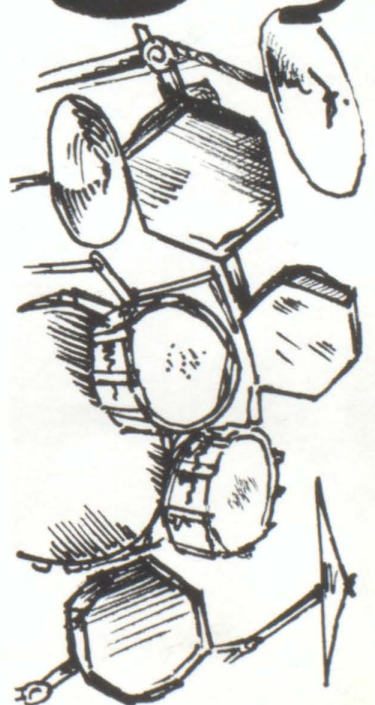


Think about how boring school would be if we just went to our classes then left. It would hardly be exciting!

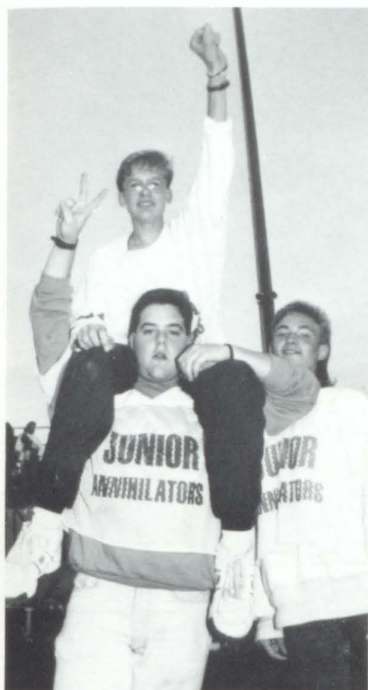

Our theme this year was "A Mid-Night Snack" and every class did a great job with their floats. The Sophomore float won this year with their version of a hamburger.

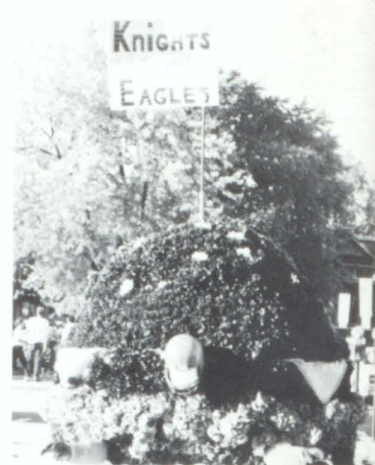
Though the varsity Knights tried their best, our football team did lose the game to Ferndale 10-0. Oh well, at least it didn't rain!

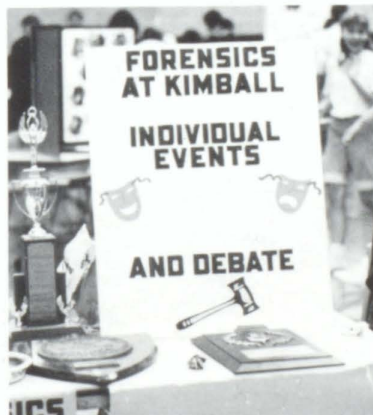

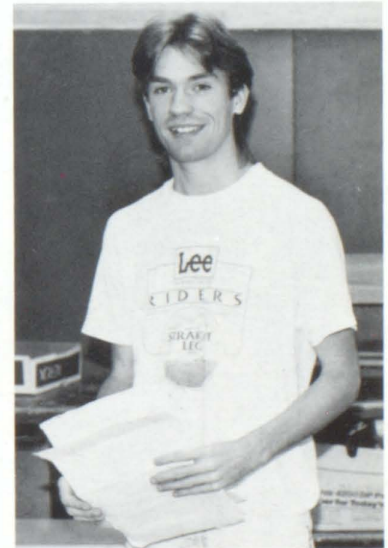

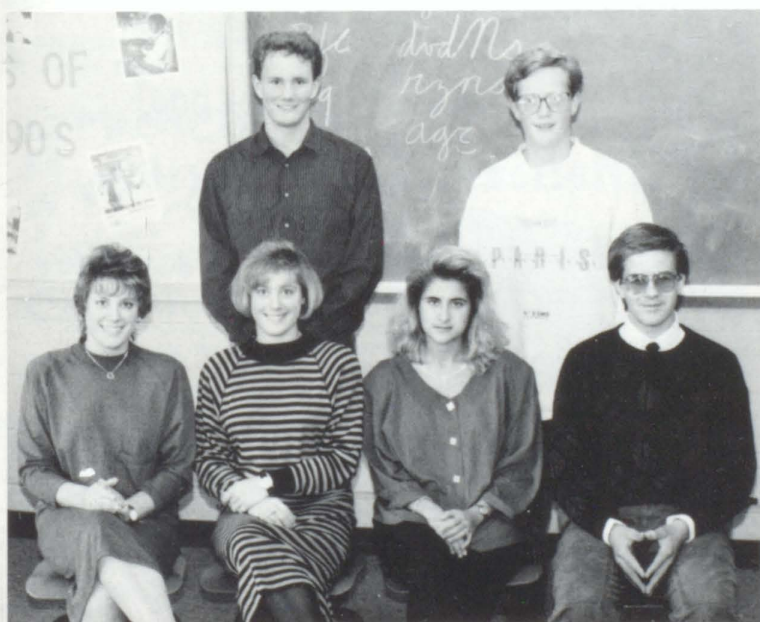

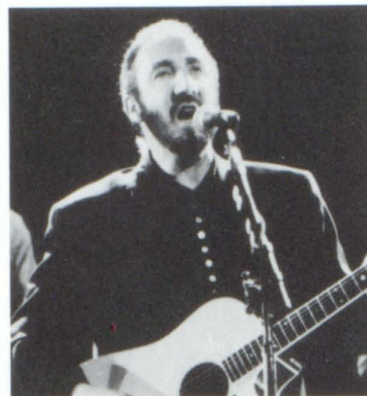

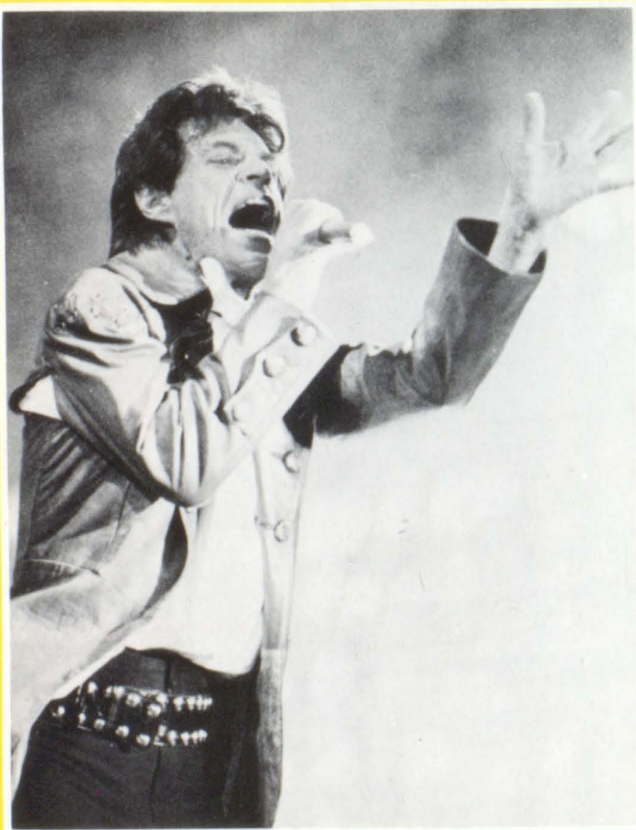

ROYAL OAK — Kimball High School students will have the opportunity to participate in a unique social studies academic 'bee' which could lead to a scholarship and a study trip to Washington D.C. in June 1990.

The Close Up Foundation Citizen Bee is an academic competition that focuses on social studies and progresses through school, regional and state events.

The high school will choose three students to compete at the regional competition at Oakland Schools in March 1990.

So far, Jeanne Ackerman, Bill Staten, Jason Field, Joe Cope and Caroline Joyce have chosen after taking tests given to interested history students to compete for these three spots. The students will be

tested on American history, government, economics, geography and current events.

State winners earn a trip to Washington to participate in the Foundation's government studies program and the national competition. Winners of the national event receive \$7,000, \$5,000, or \$3,000 college scholarships. The national Citizen Bee is funded by the Milken Family Foundation, with additional support from KPMG Peat Marwick, RJR Nabisco, Inc., Kraft General Foods, and the Monsanto Fund. On the state level the Bee is sponsored by the Michigan Department of Education and The Detroit News.

In last year's competition Kimball's Jason Field won a \$200 bond. Andrew Popovetz, of the social studies department at Kimball will coordinate the Citizen Bee at the school.

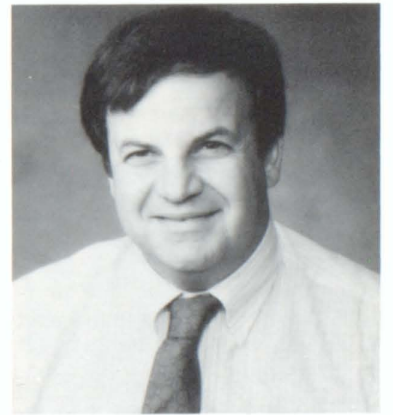

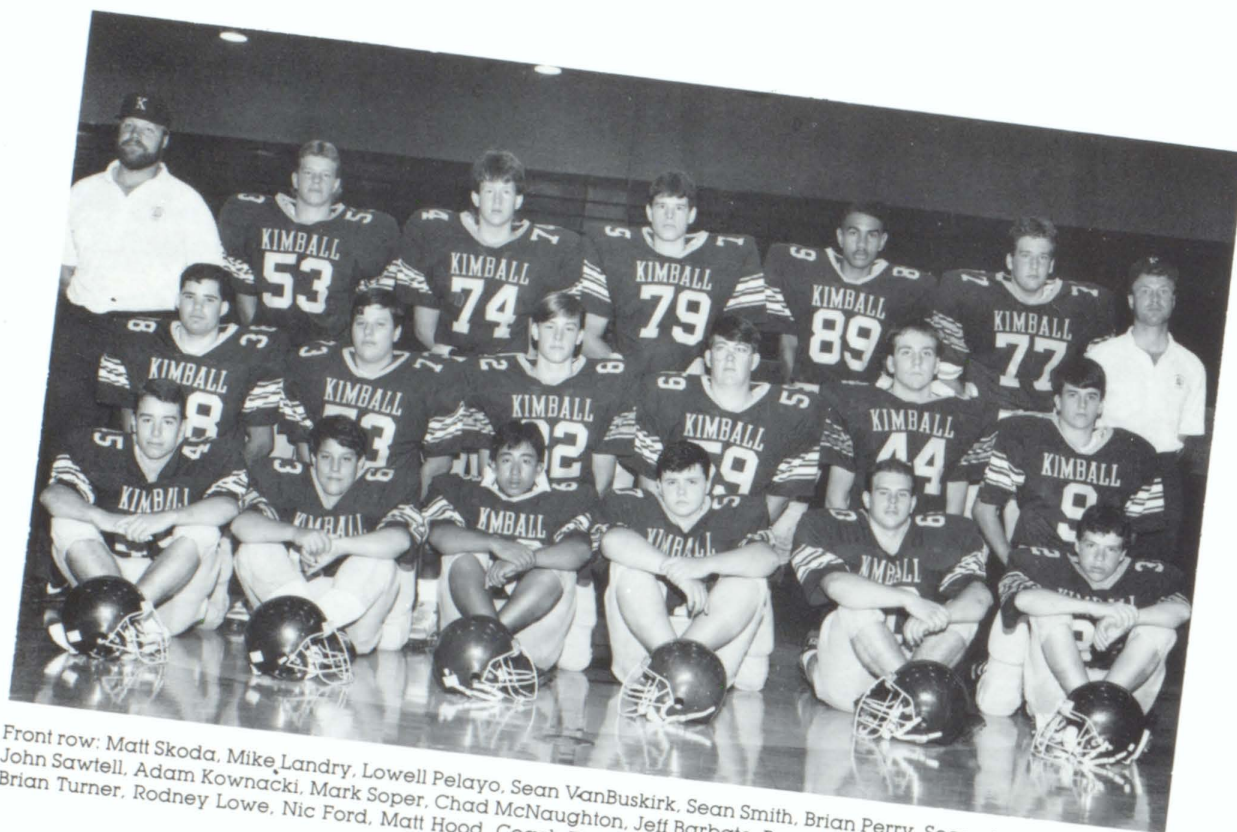

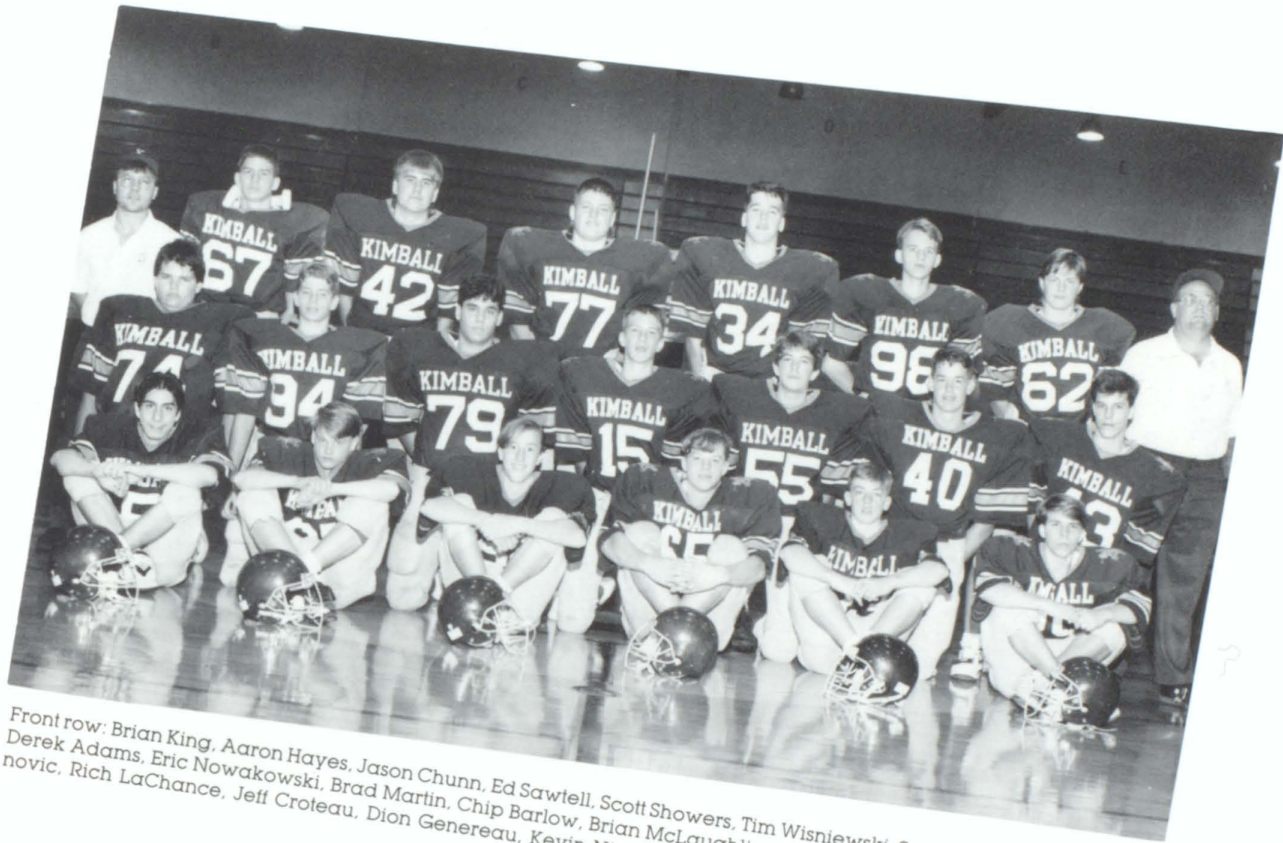

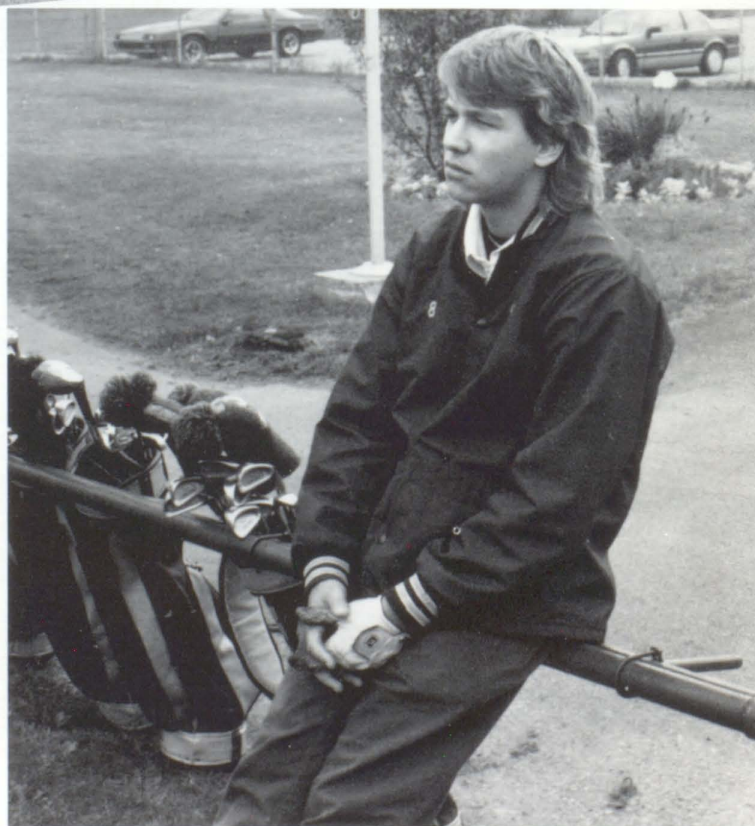

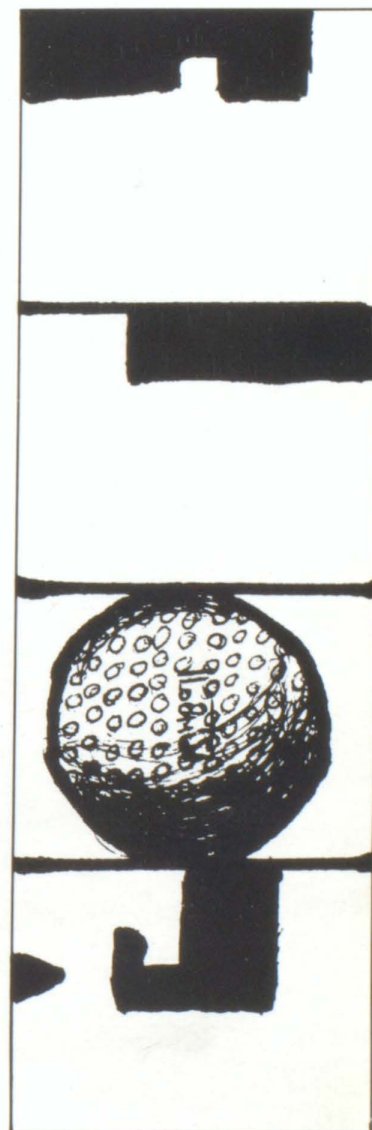

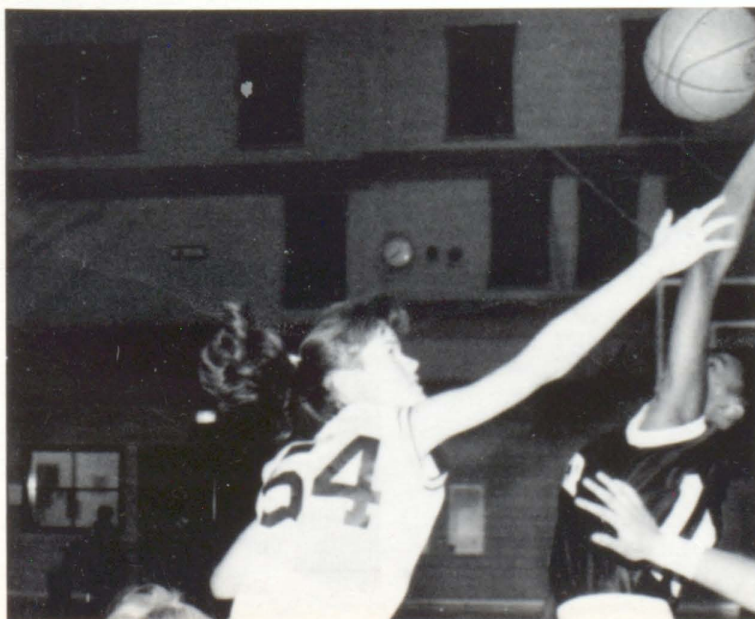

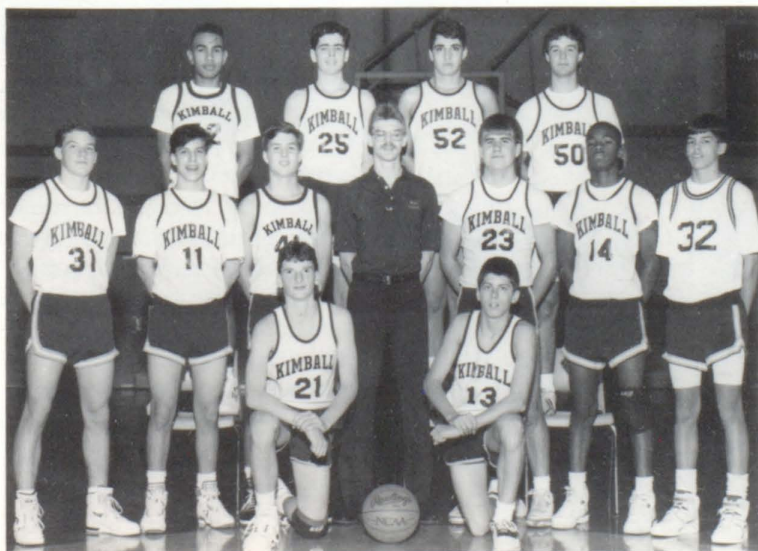

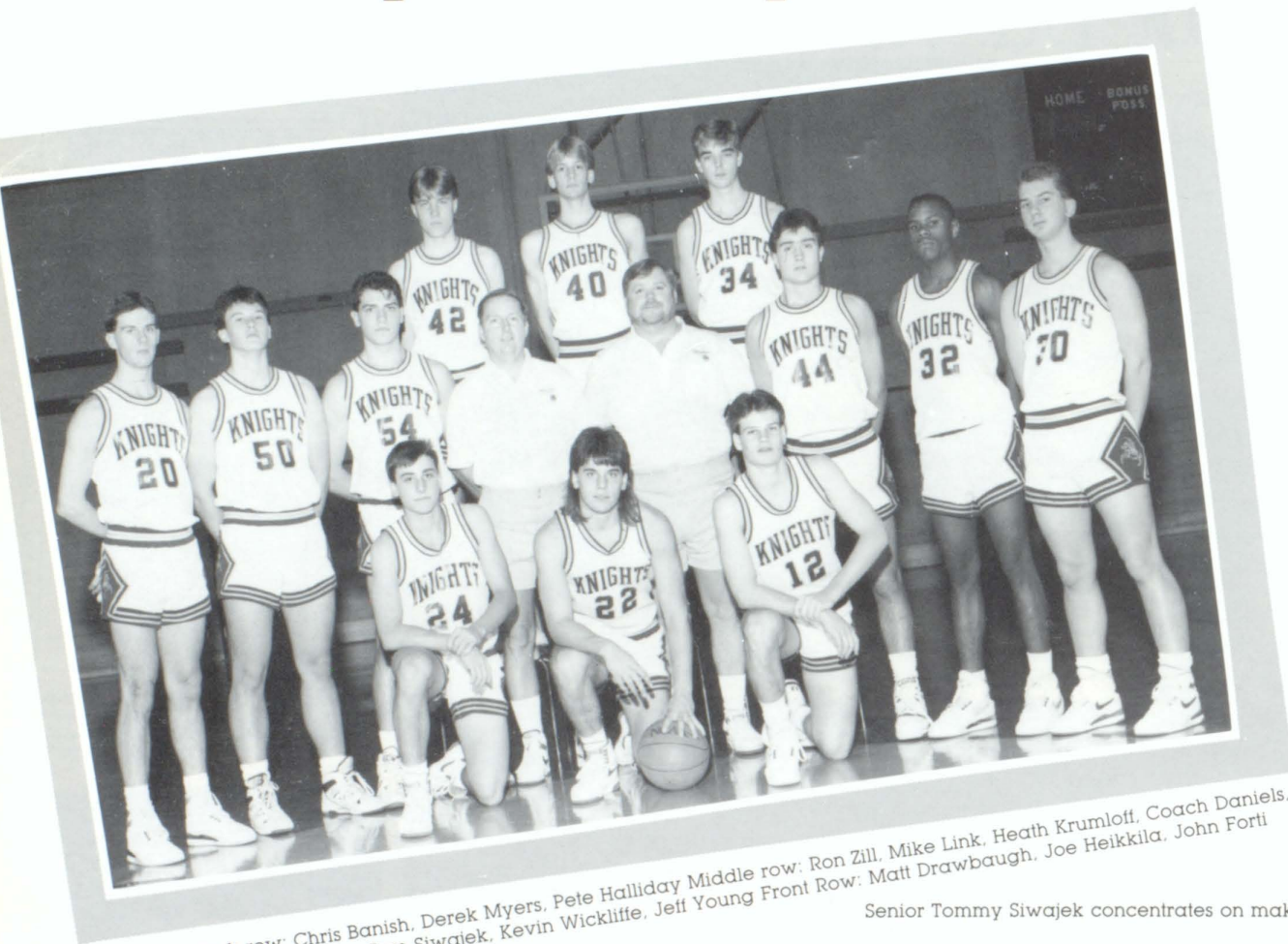

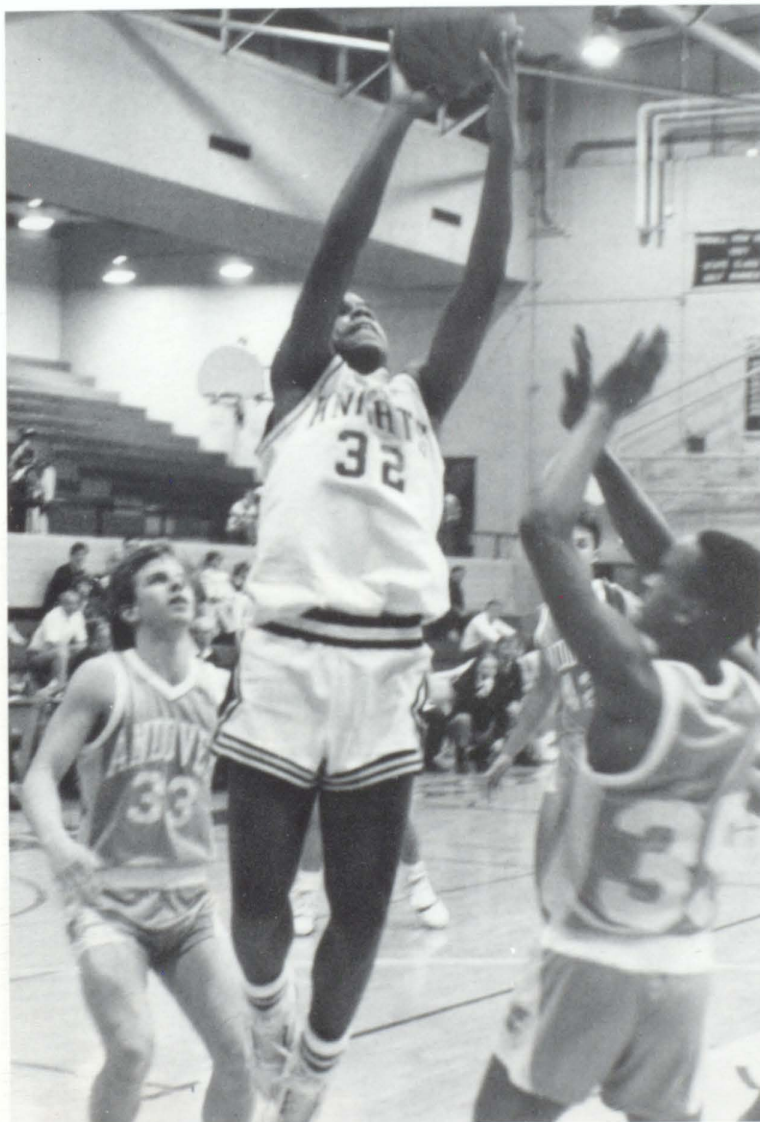

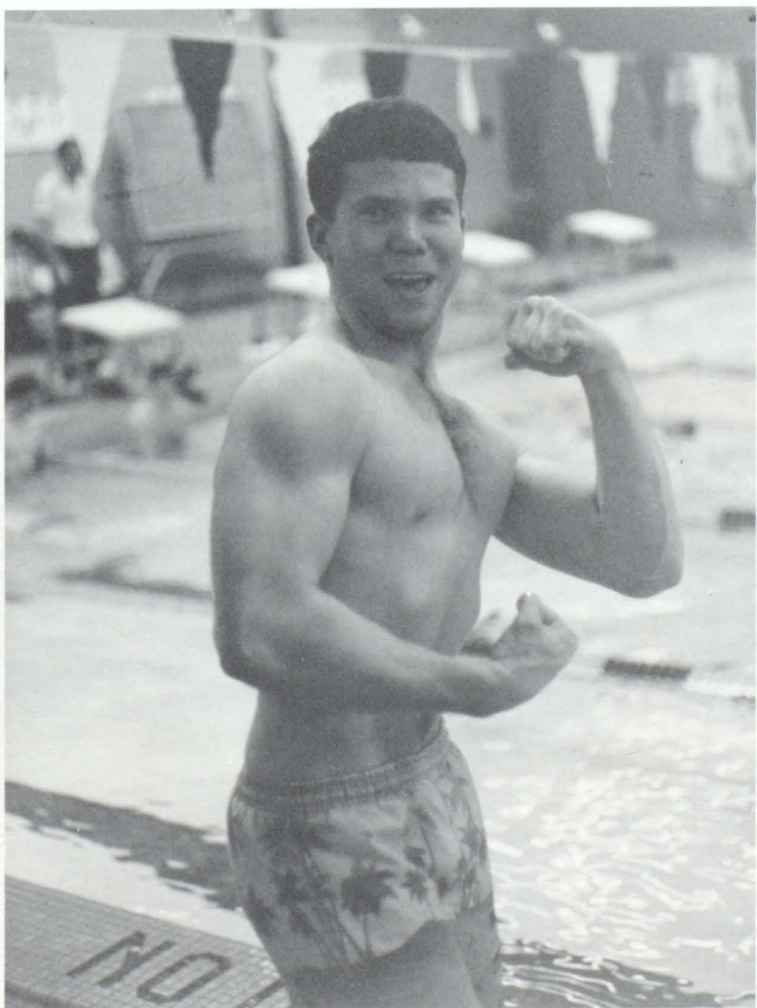

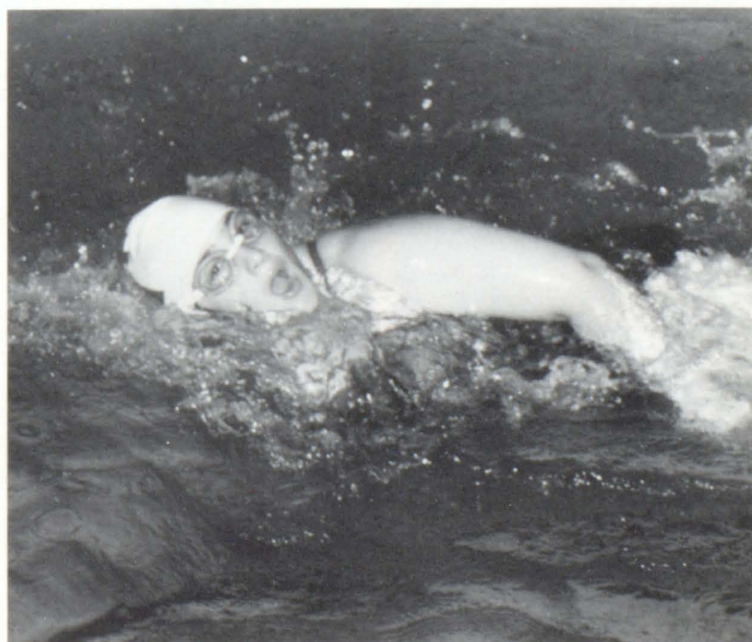

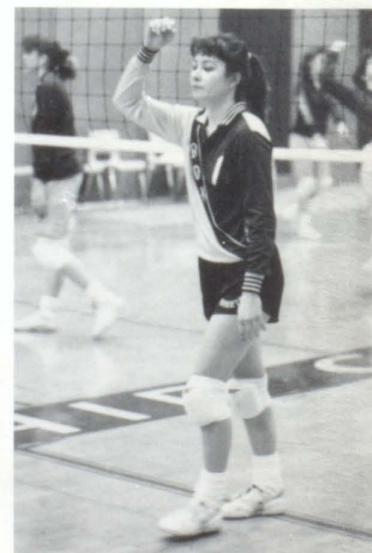

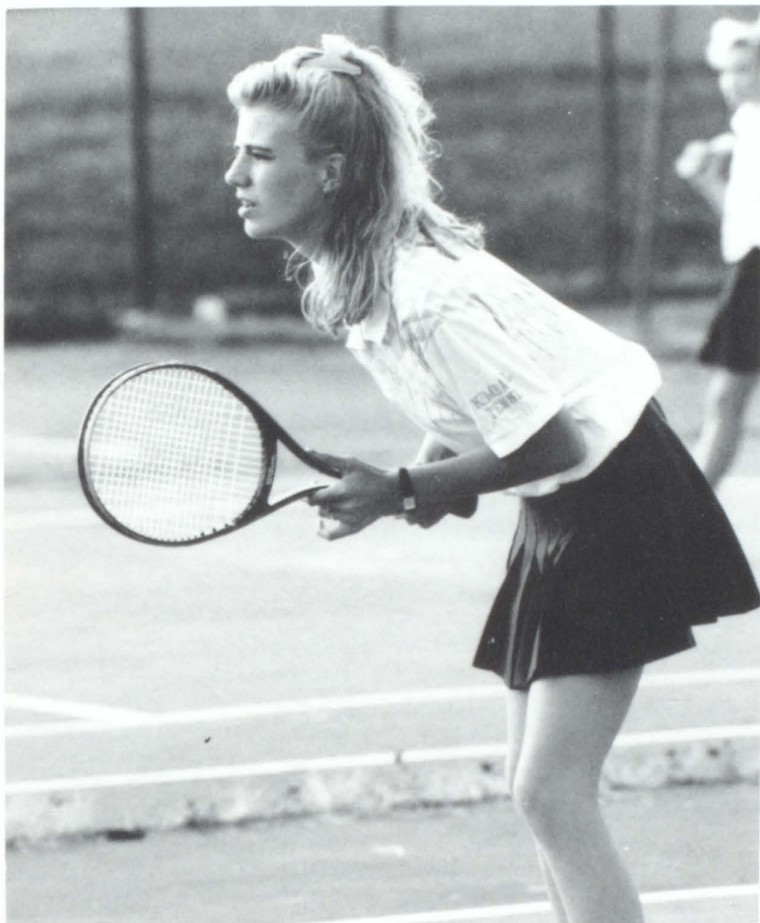

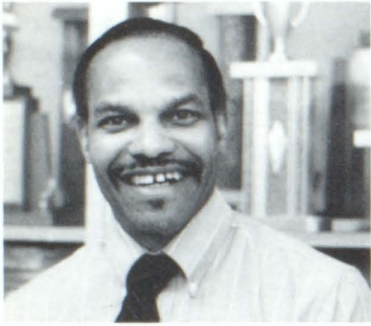

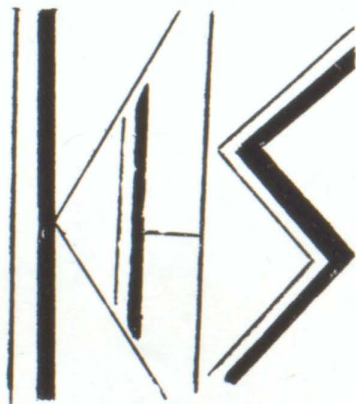

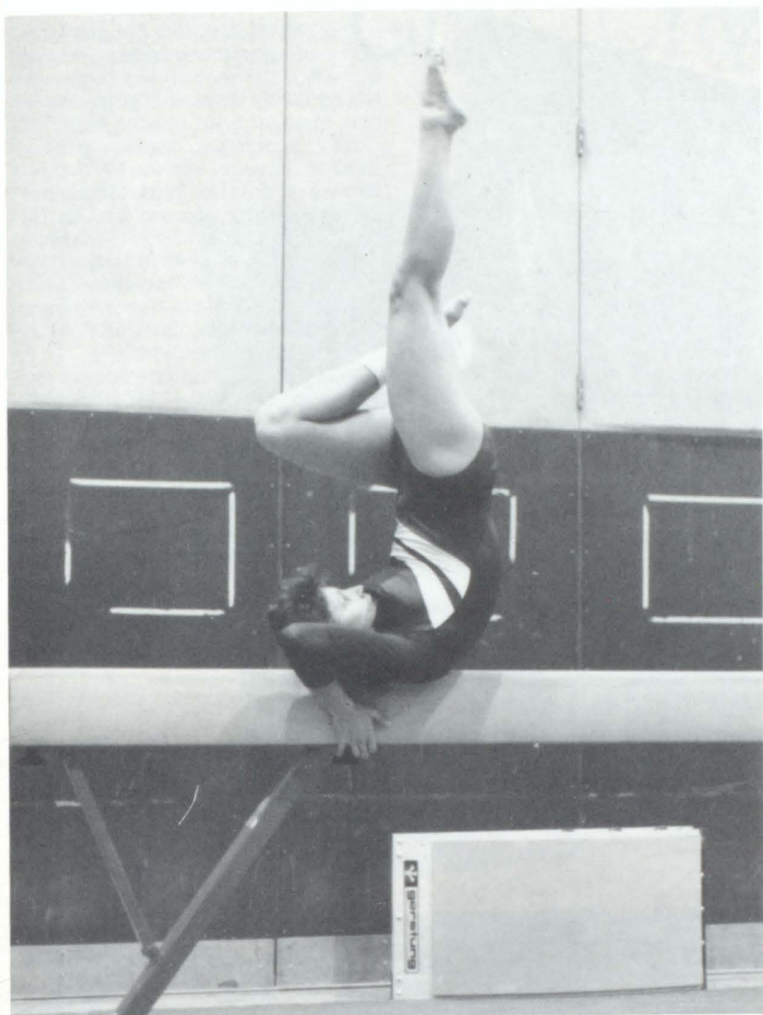
Gymnastics

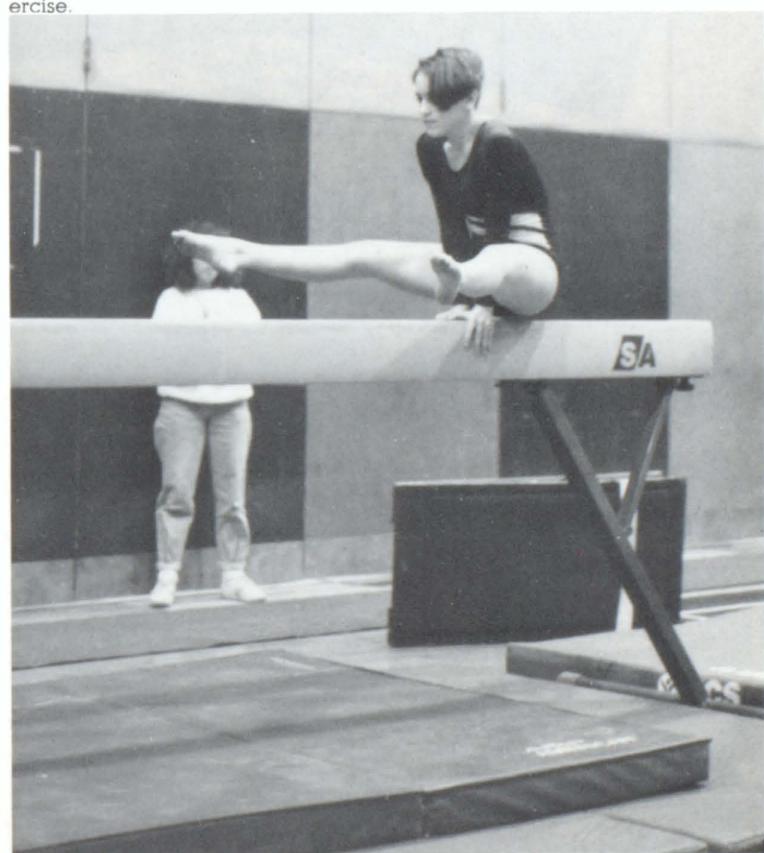
