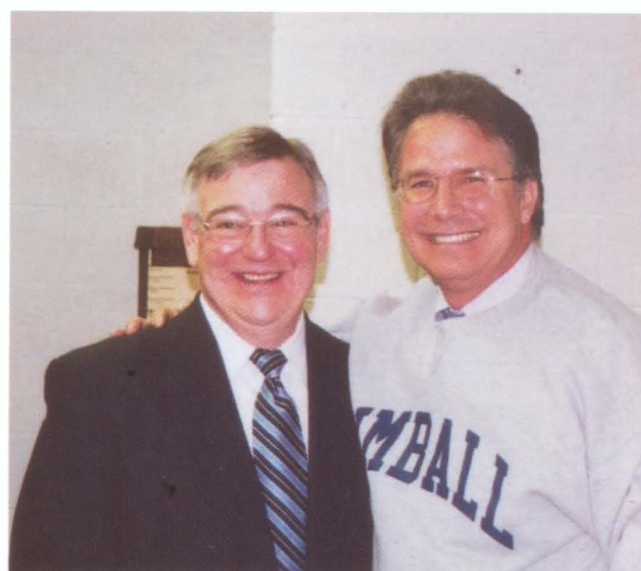
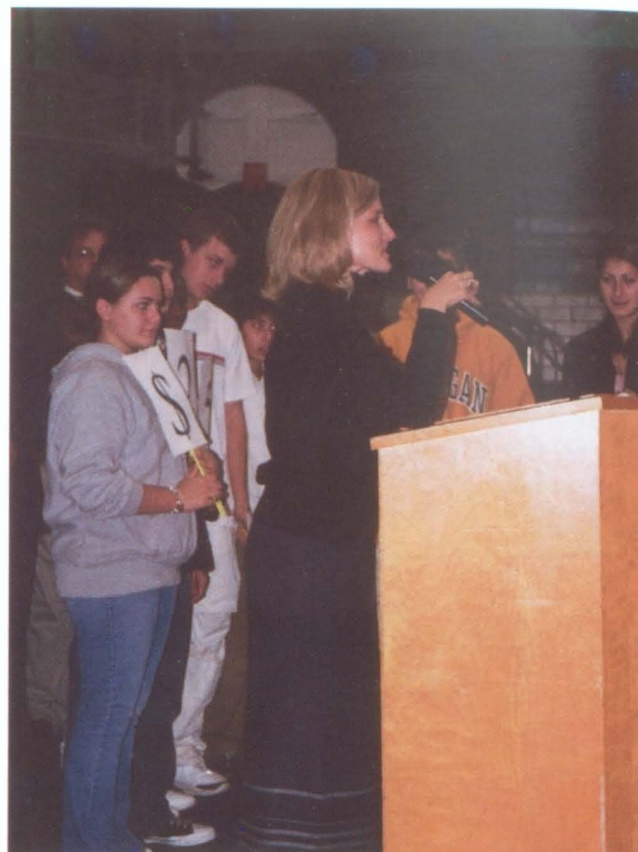

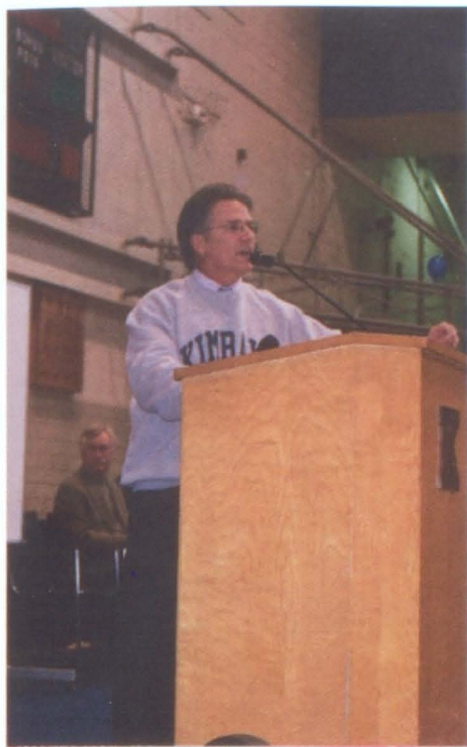

On November 6, 2003, Kimball educator Leah Barnett was presented with the prestigious Milken National Educator Award and a check for \$25,000, given by members of the State Board of Education, including State Superintendent Tom Watkins.

Students and educators from across the district filled the stands of the Kimball gymnasium in eager anticipation of what they thought was going to be an assembly discussing education in Michigan. Principals from surrounding elementary schools were introduced and acknowledged for their dedication prior to the presentation of the Milken Award to Barnett.

Before the presentation commenced, the band serenaded the crowds, led by senior and sophomore drum majors, respectively Jeff Janssen and Natalie Unsworth. Audrey Kline proceeded to then enchant all present with a melodious and impressive rendition of the National Anthem. Barnett was then presented and surprised with her honor.

Senior Sean Grier, who witnessed firsthand this event while reporting for *The Herald*, said of Barnett, "she is such an excellent teacher who is more than just an educator, but a friend, as well. She really got to know me inside and outside of the classroom and she deserves this very much."

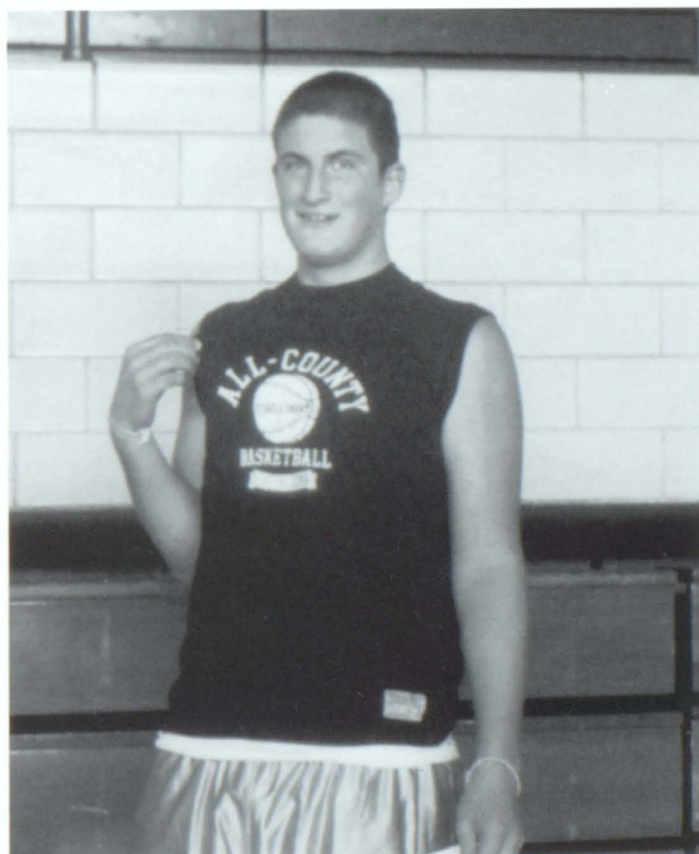

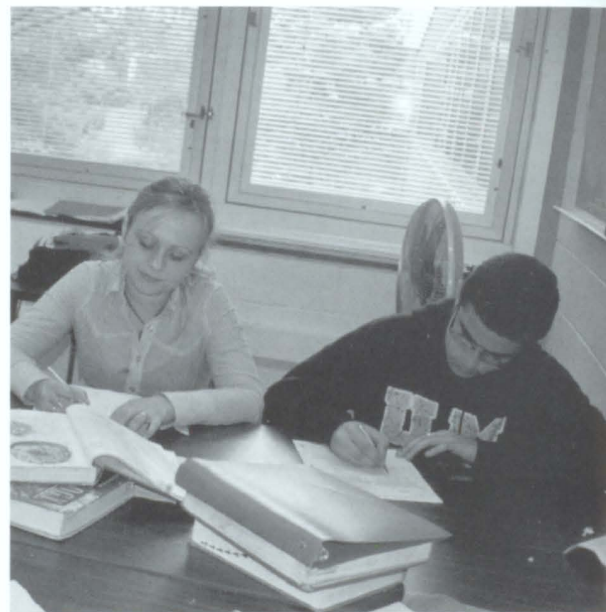
# Diversity at Kimball

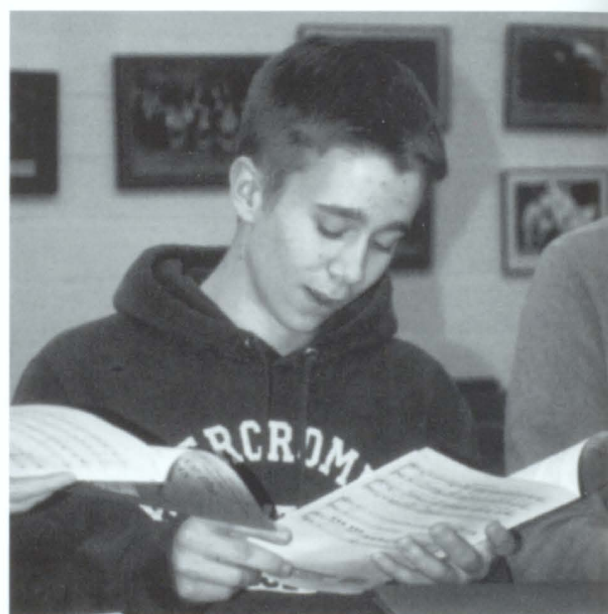
# In Perfect Harmony

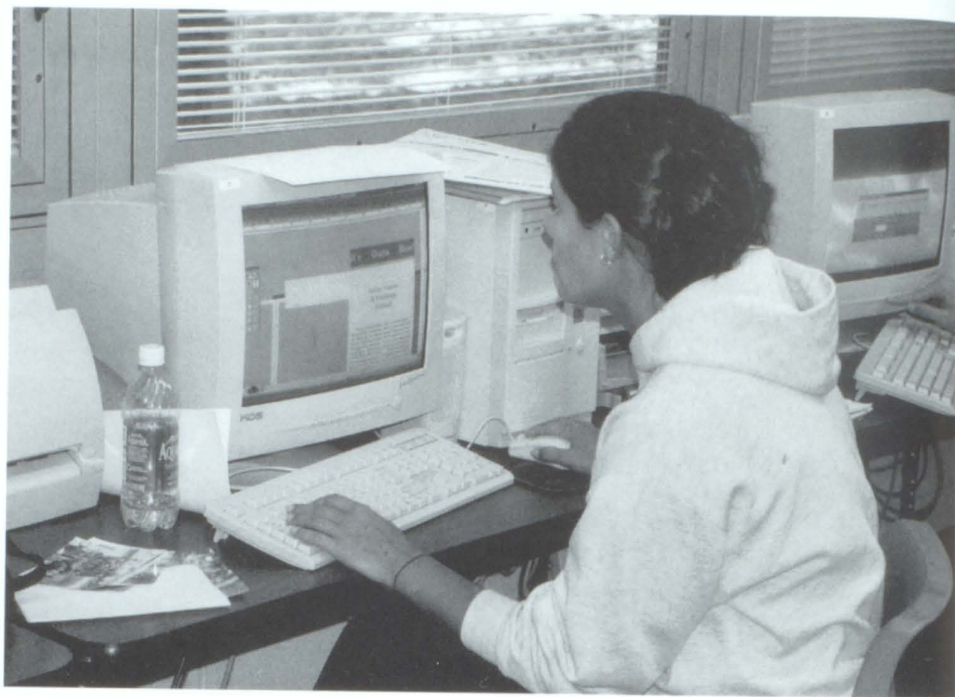

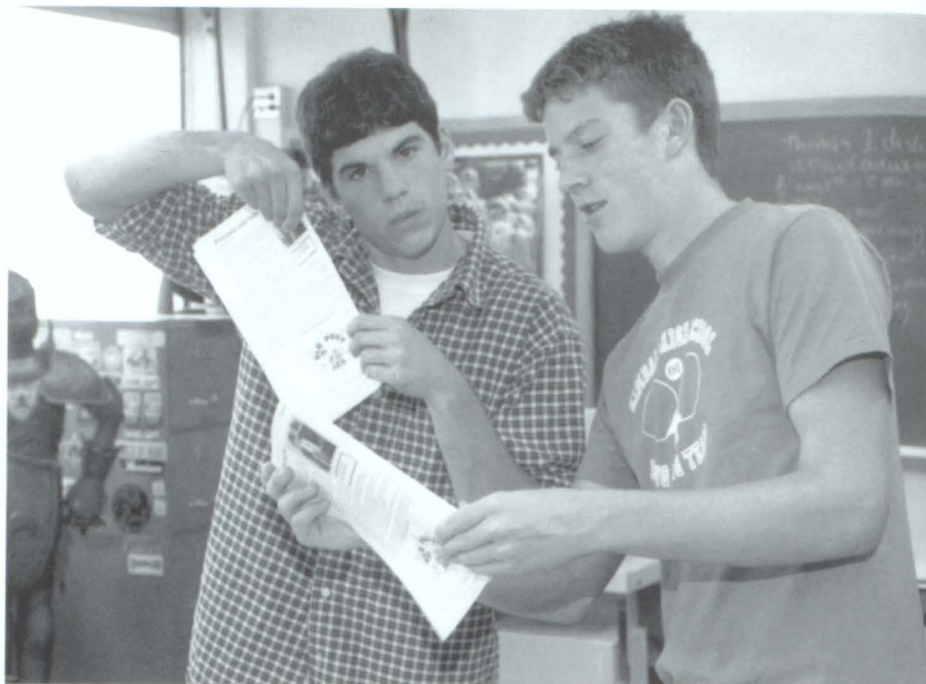

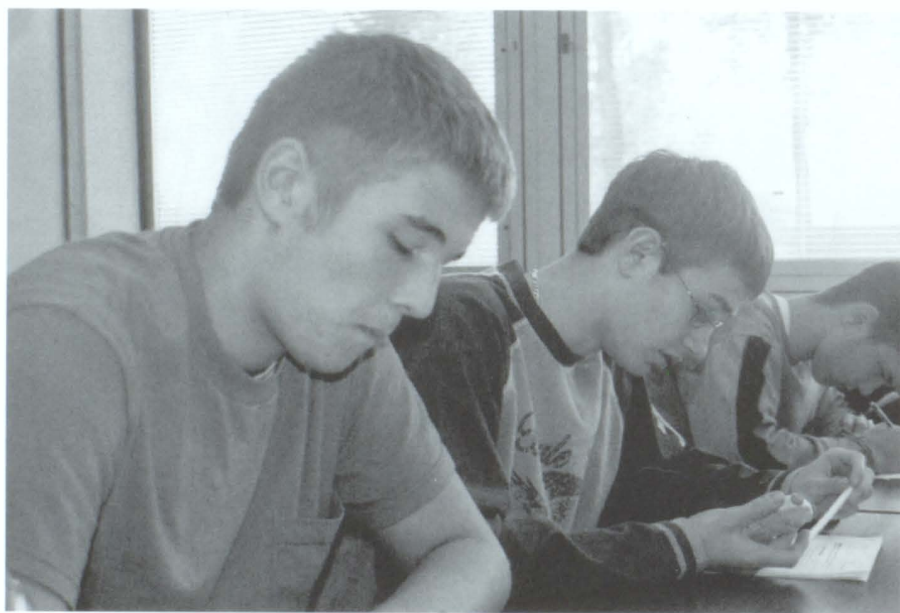

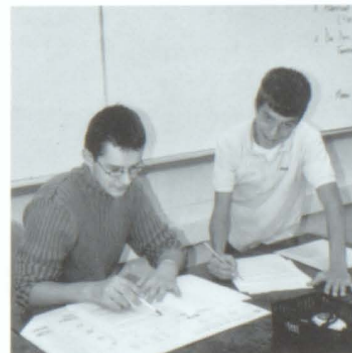

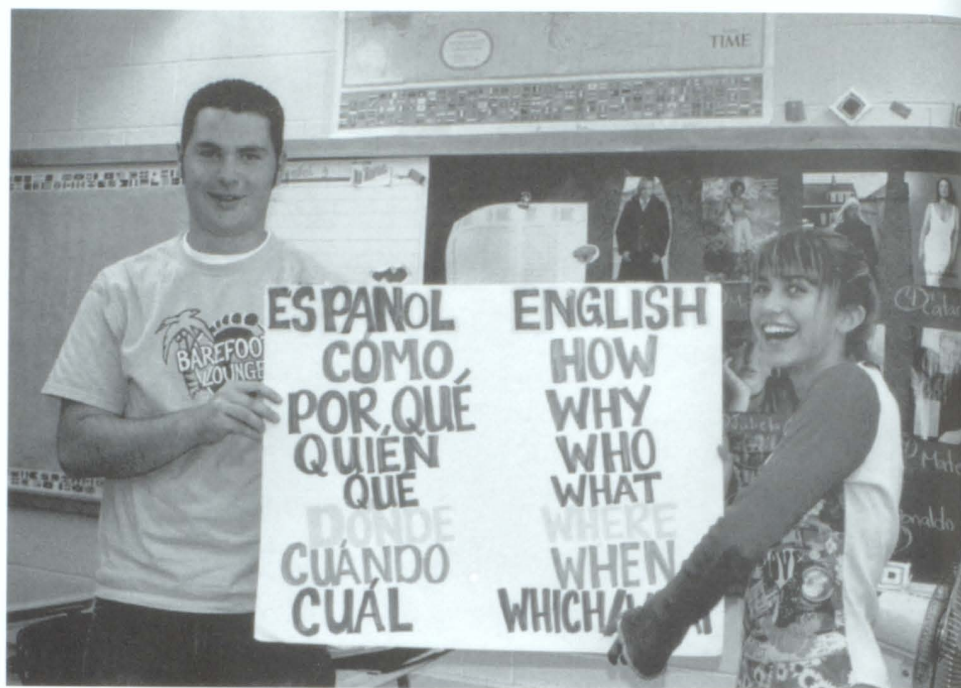

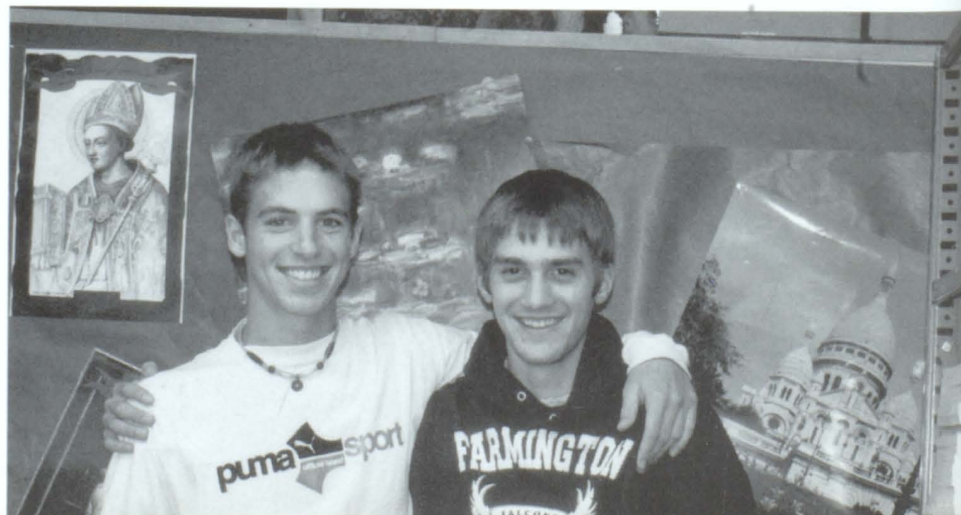

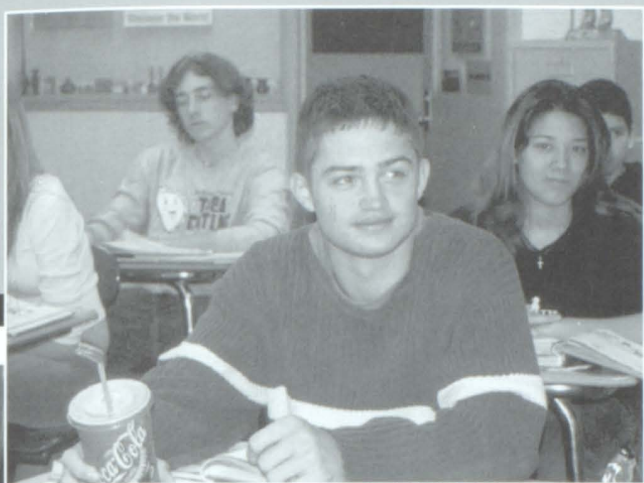

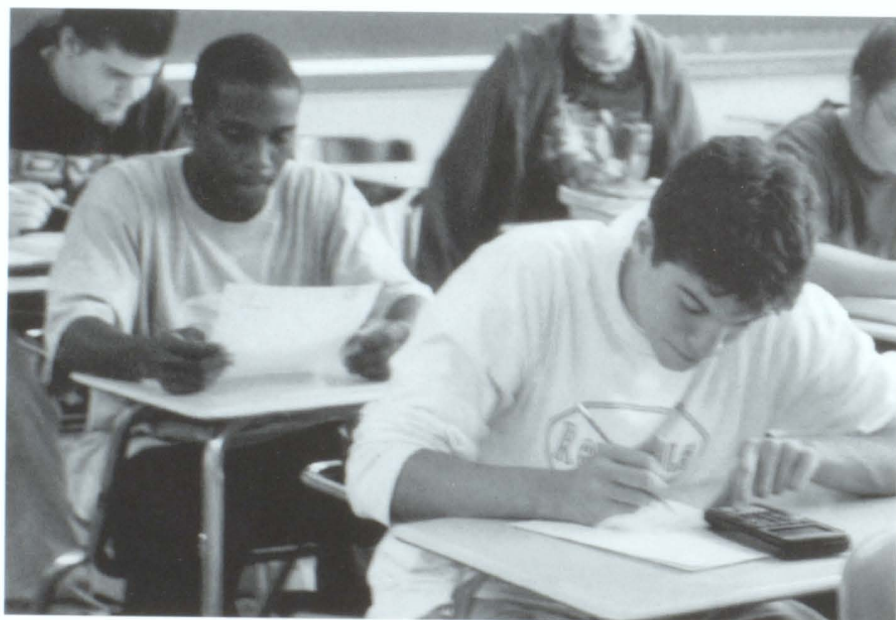
# 1+2= Cool

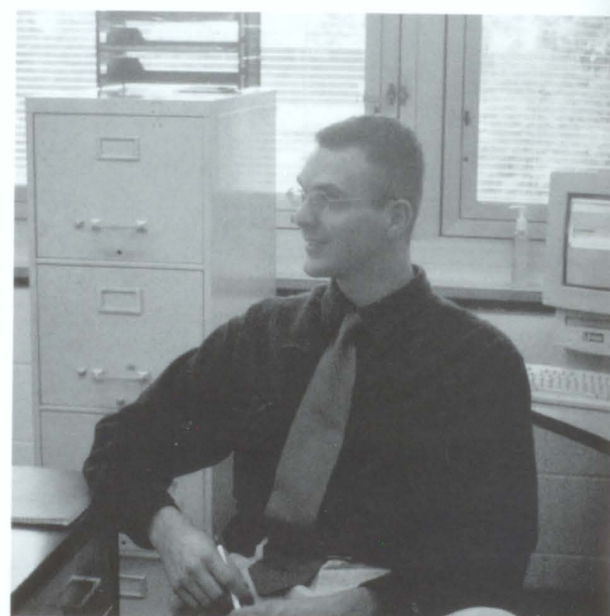

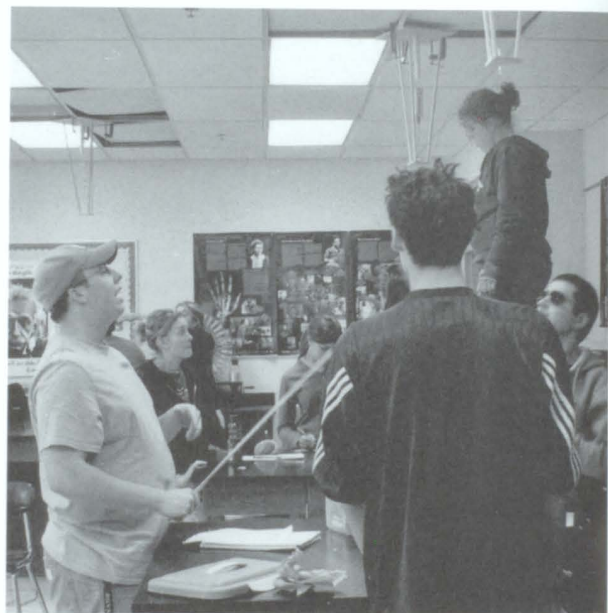

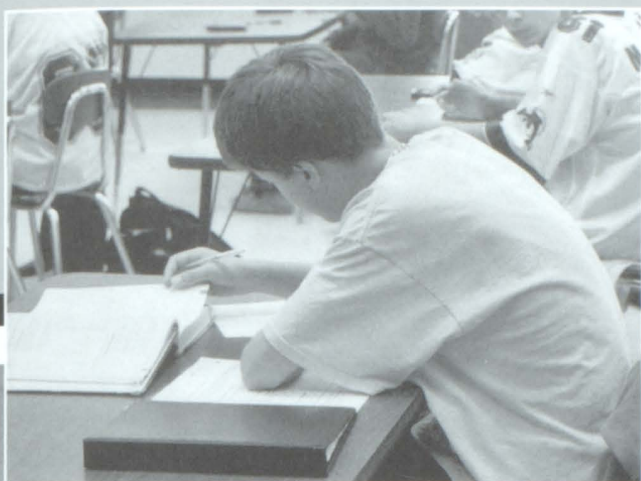

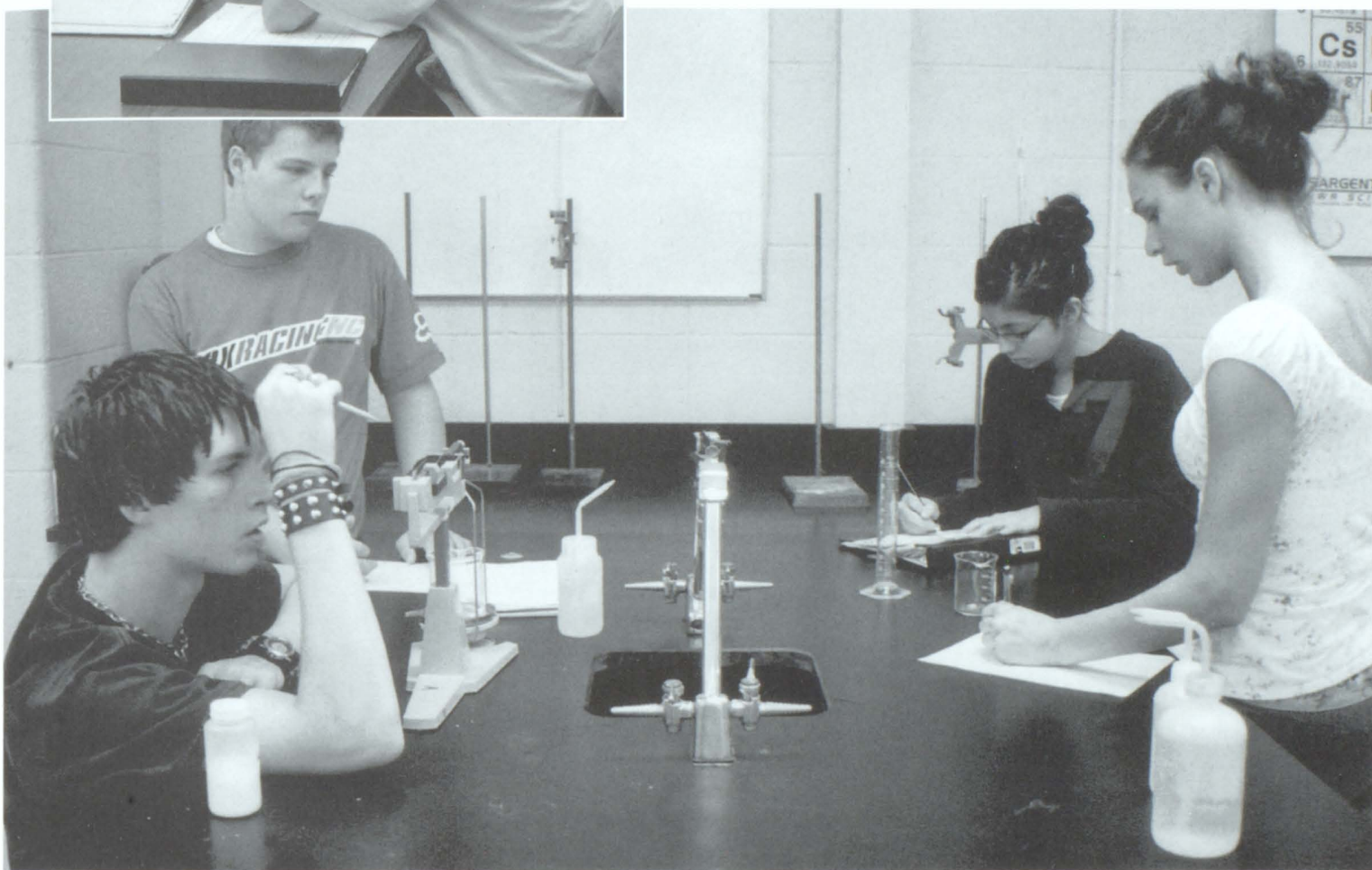

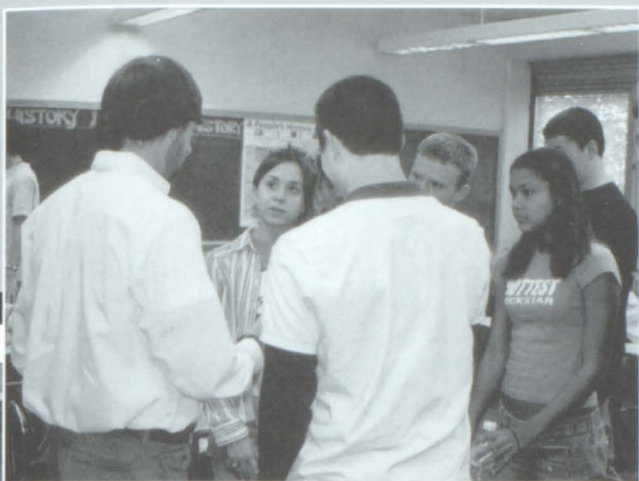

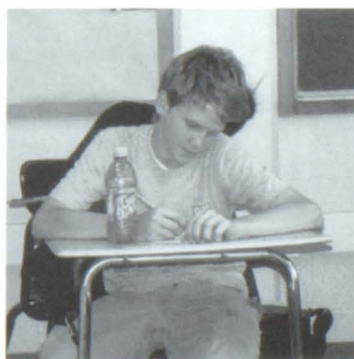

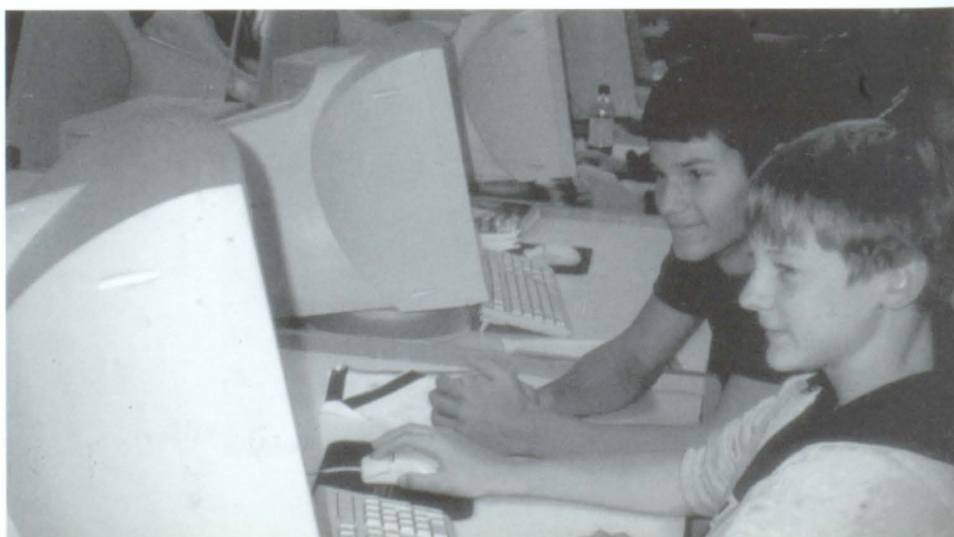

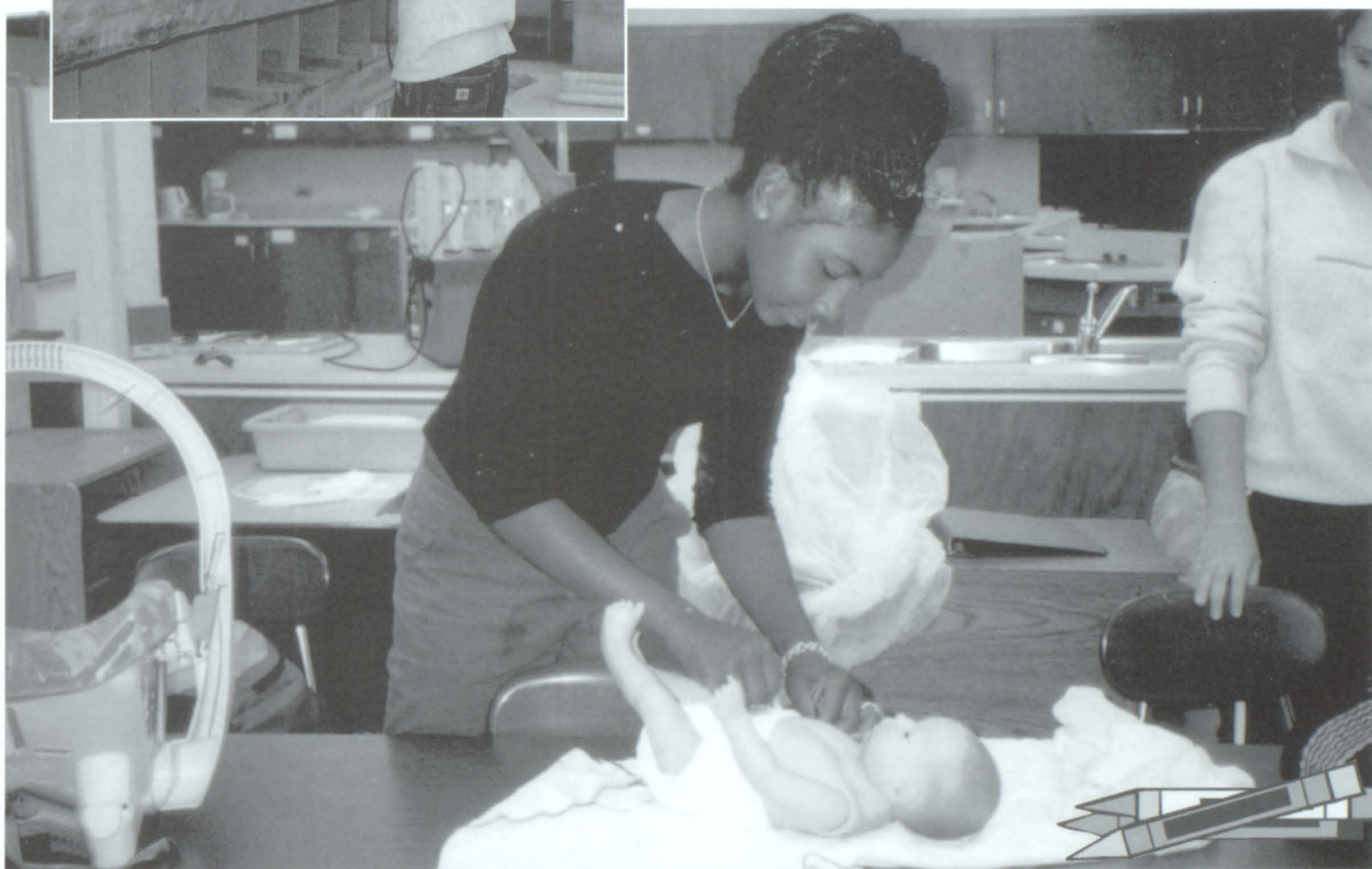

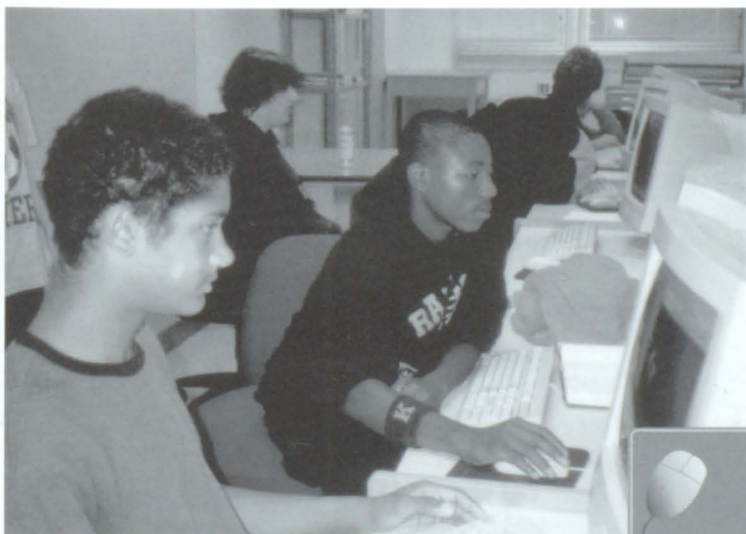

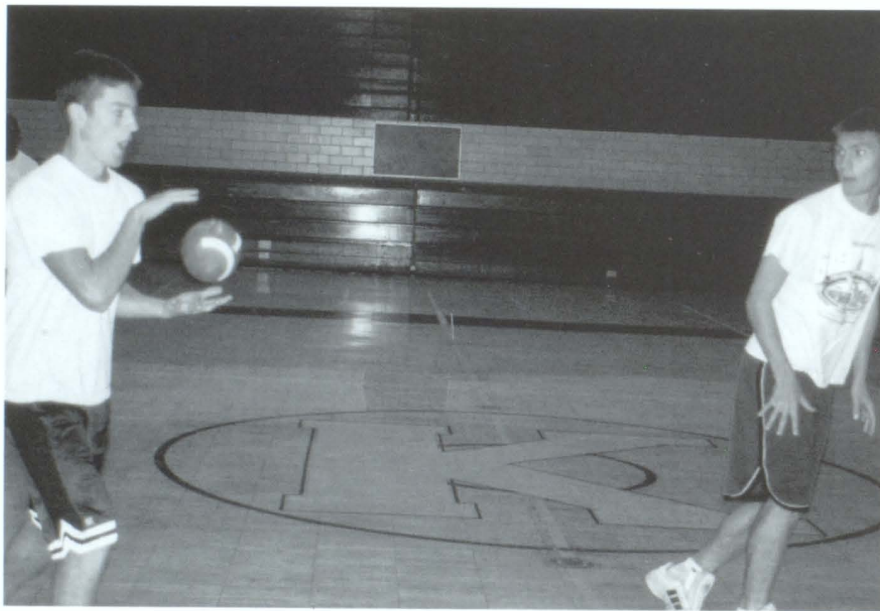




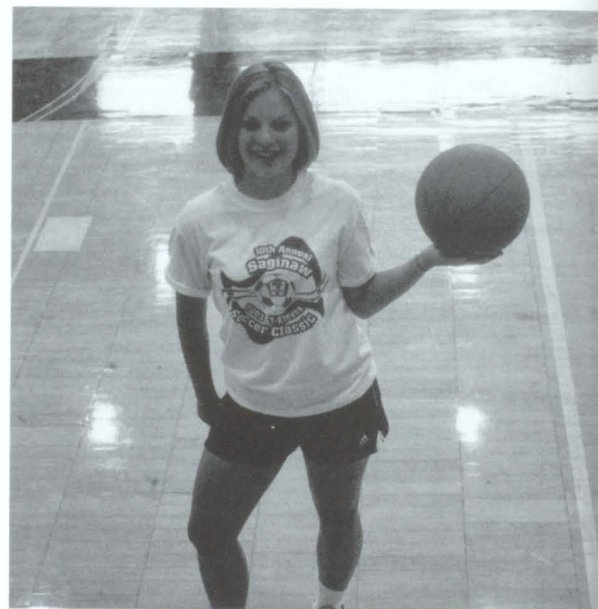
# Have You Had Your Break Today?

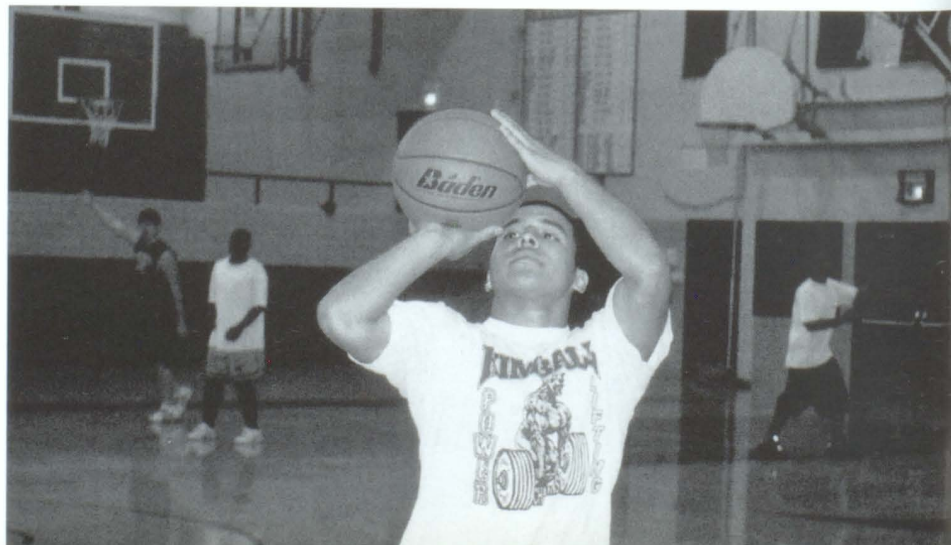

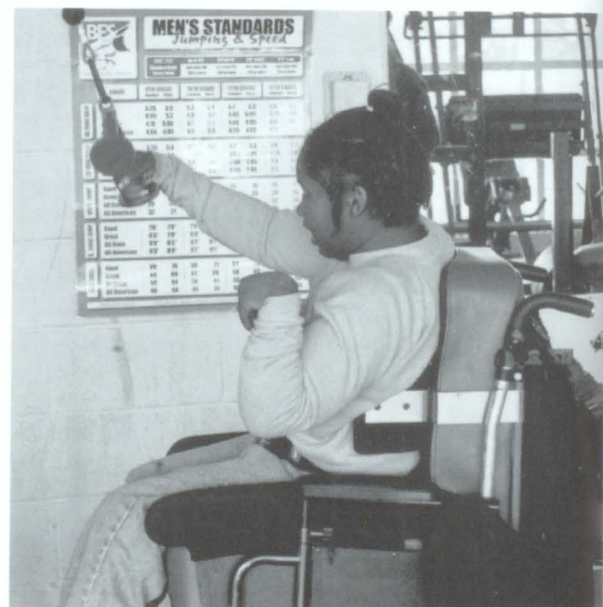
# Just Like You and Me

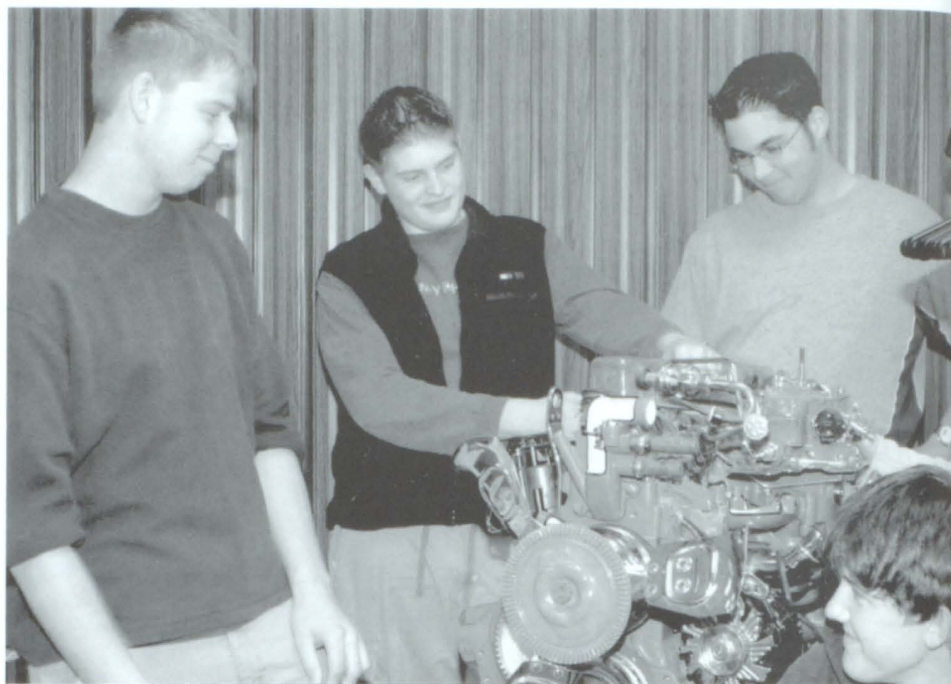

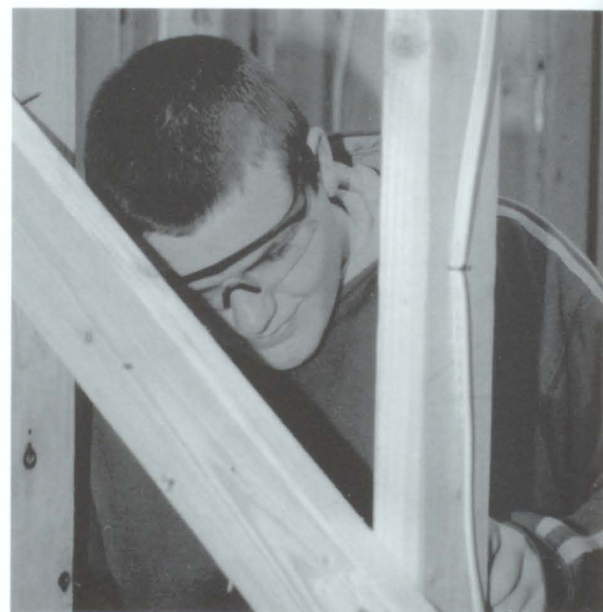
# Classes Get Real

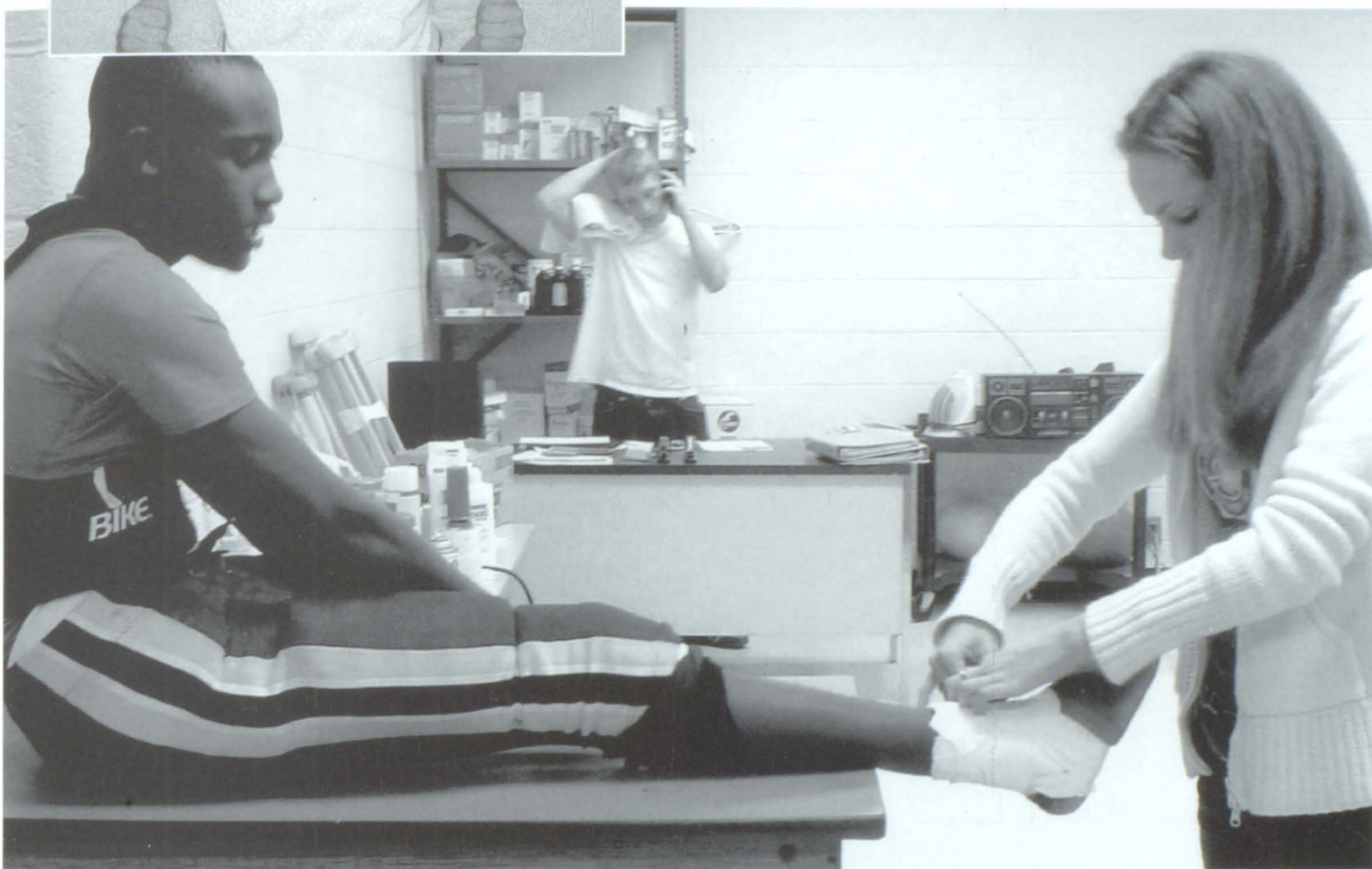

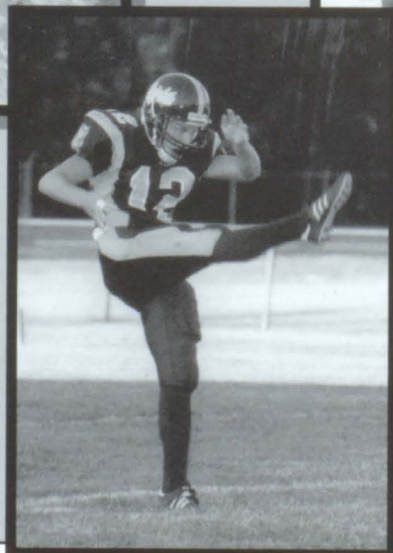

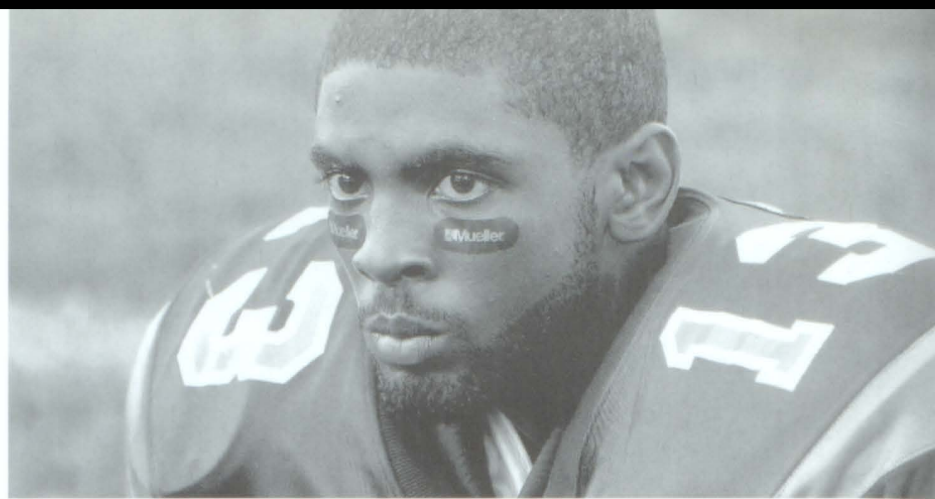

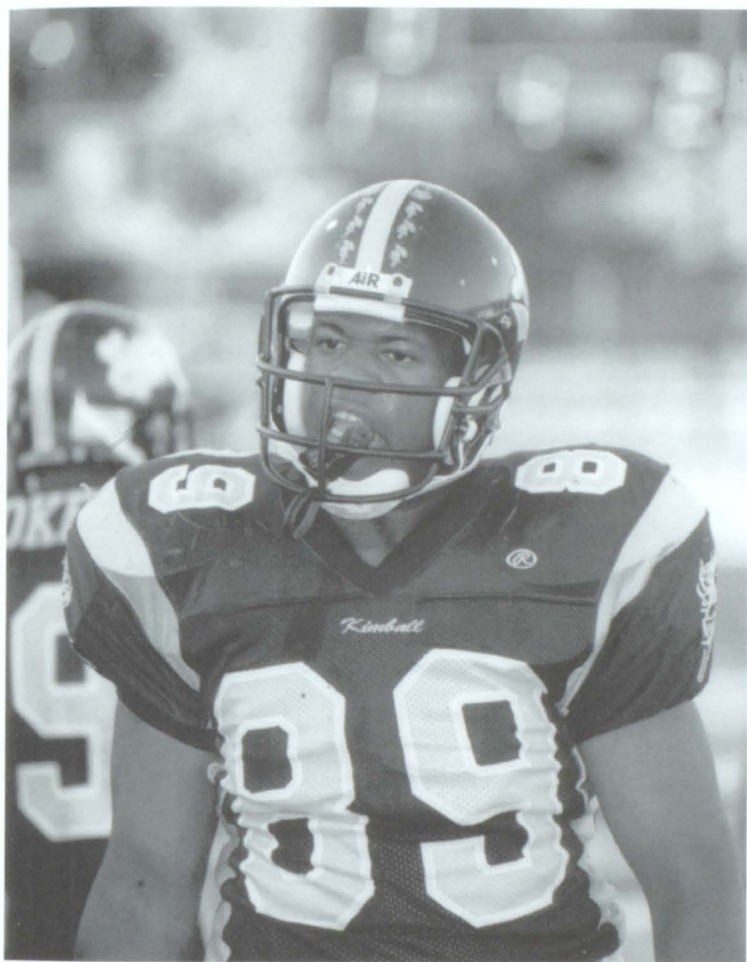

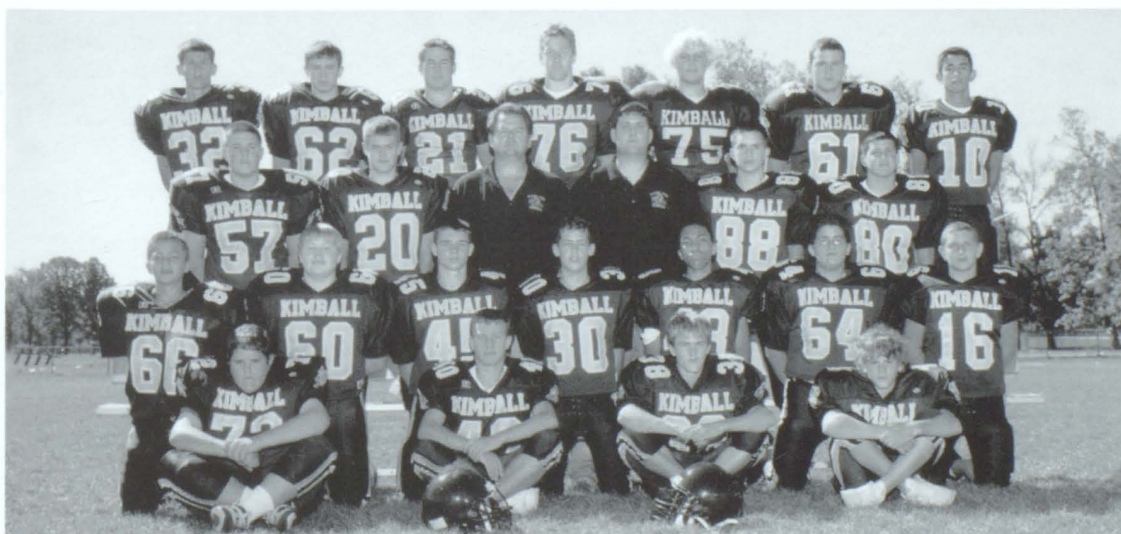

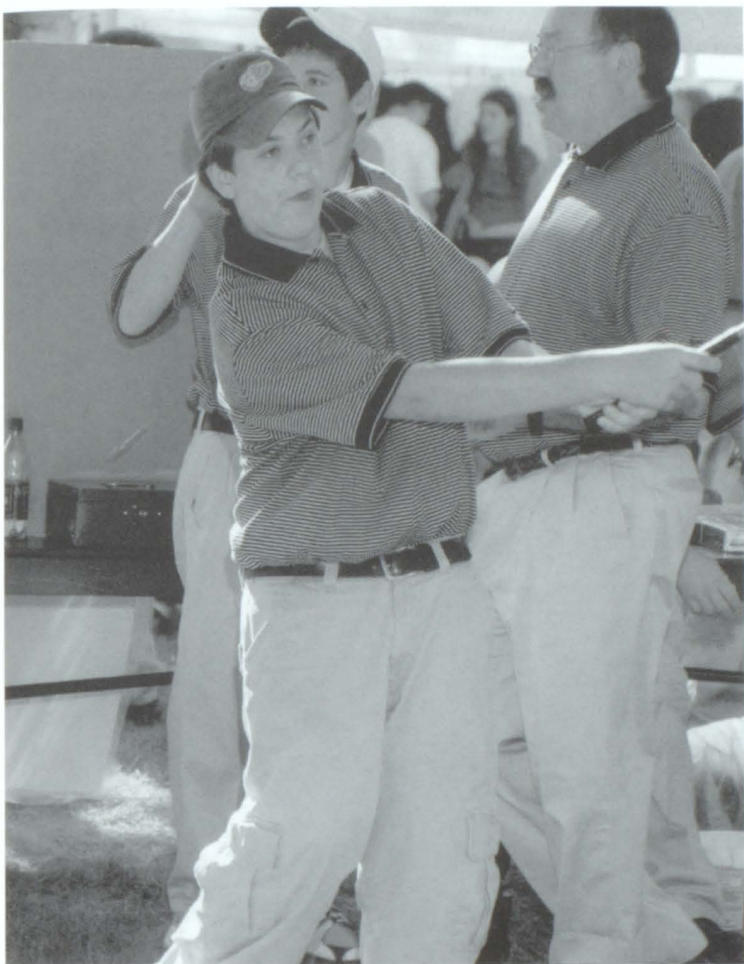
## Boys' Golf Follows Through

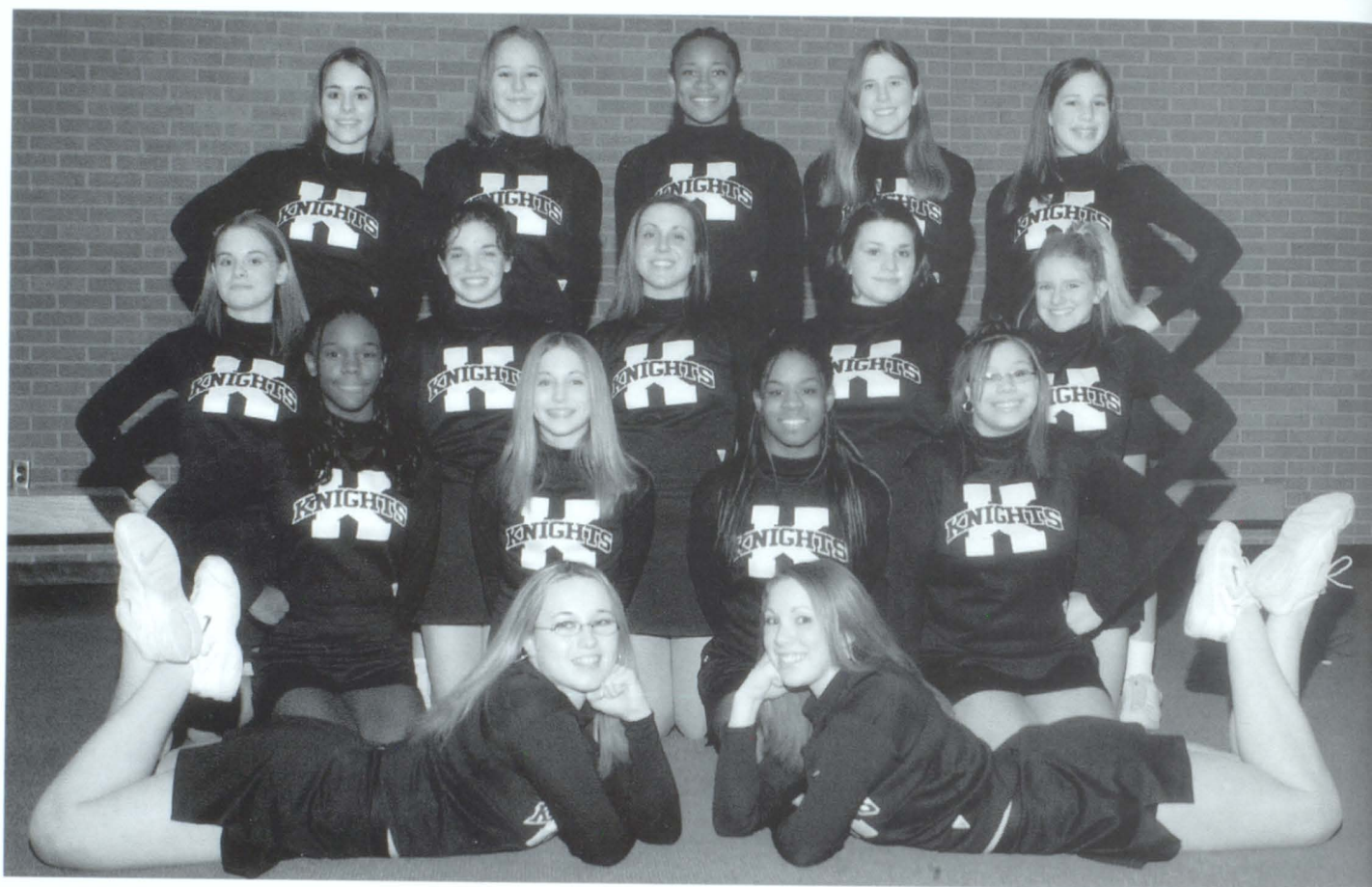

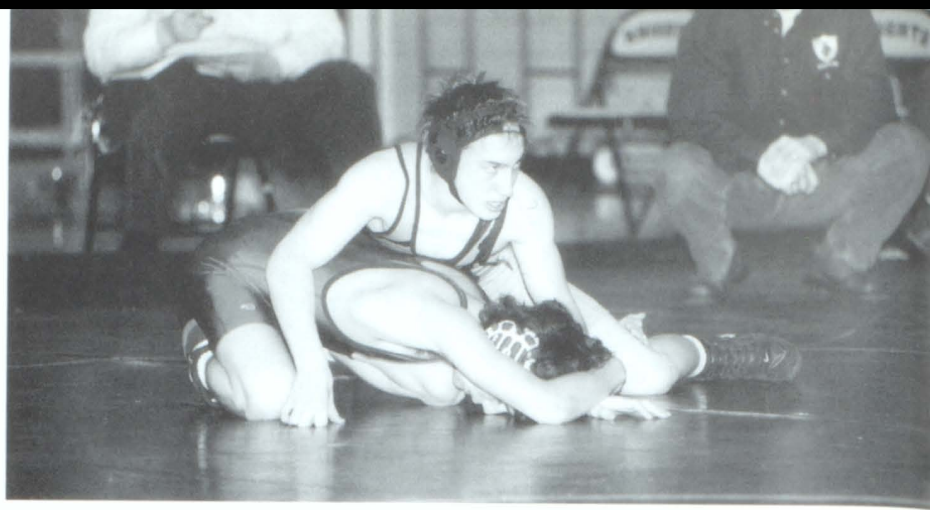

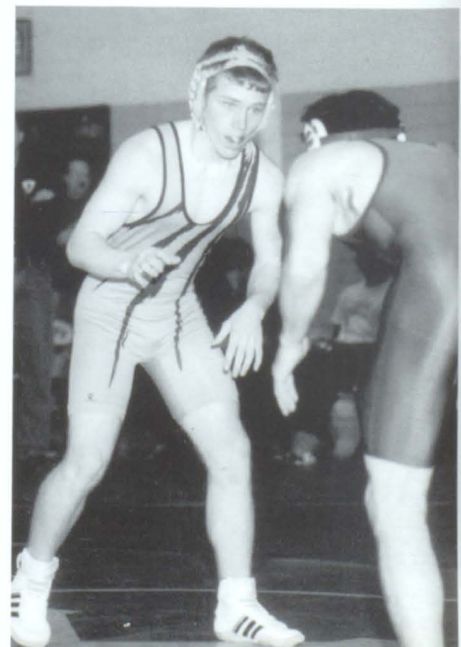

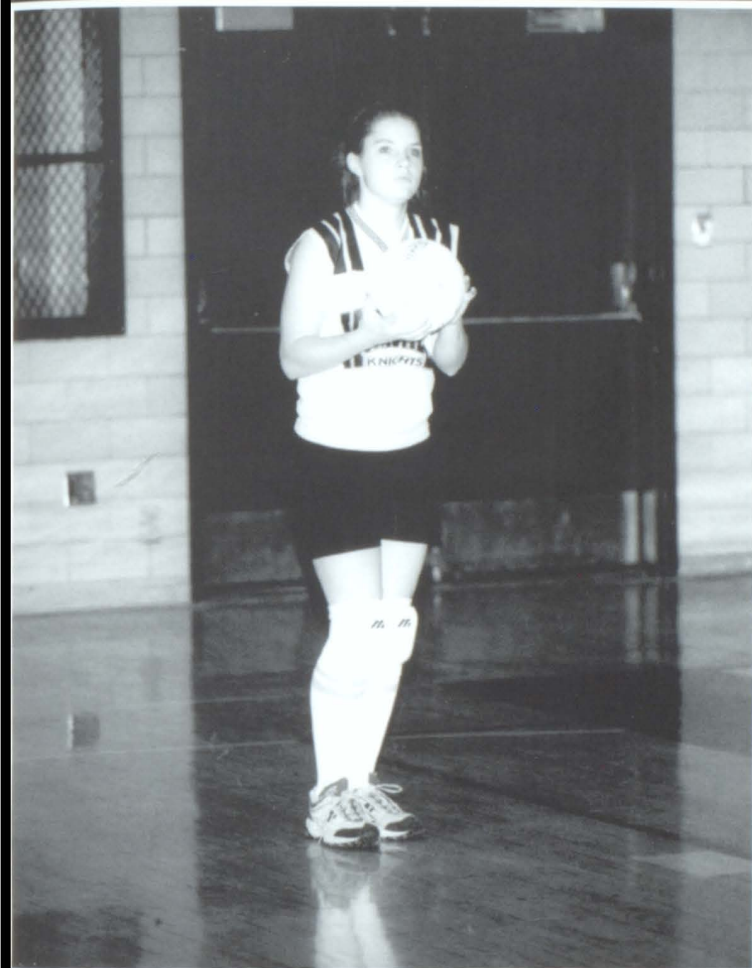

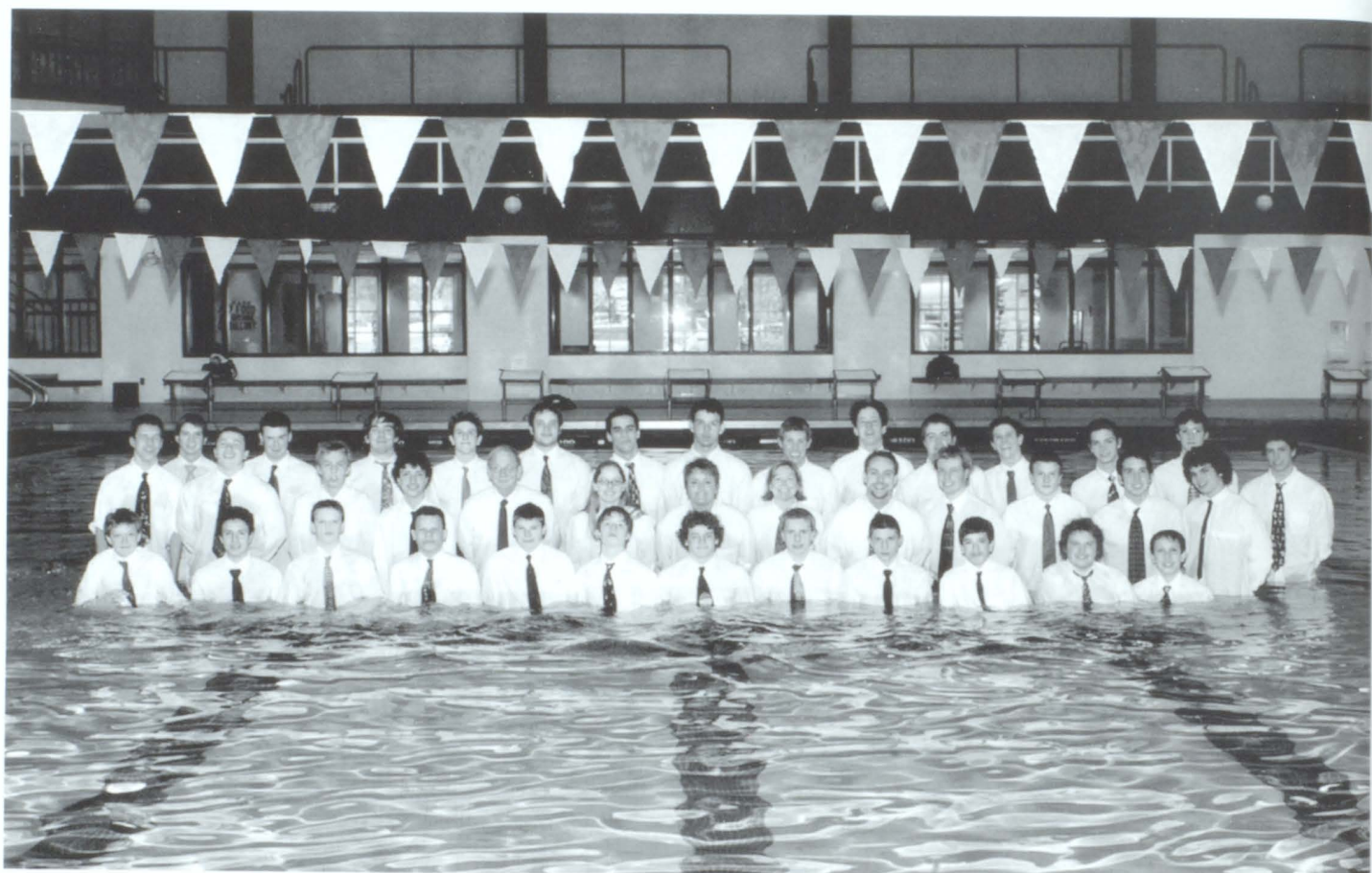

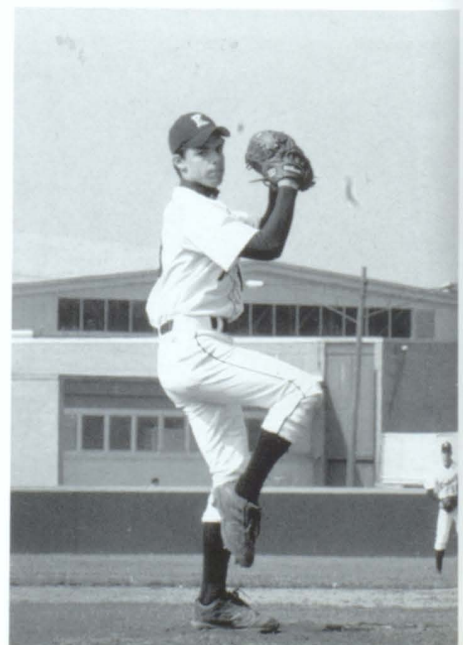

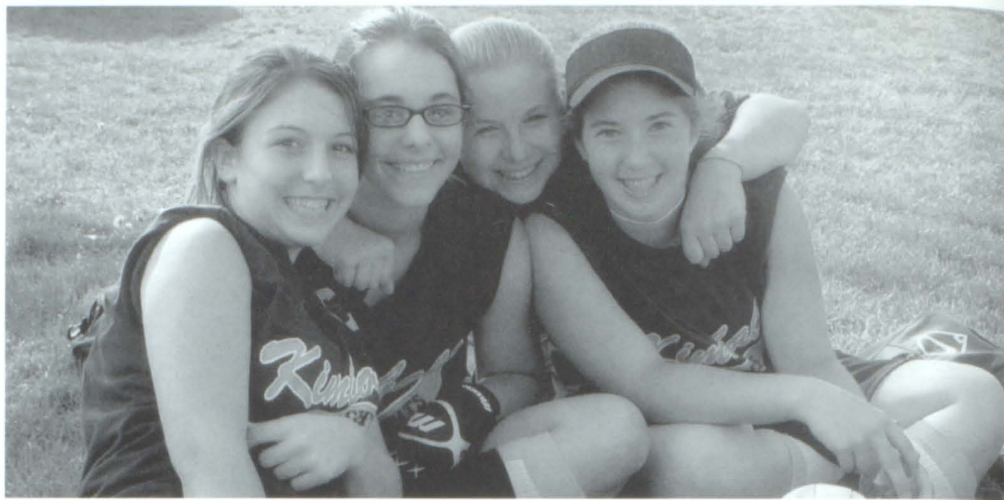

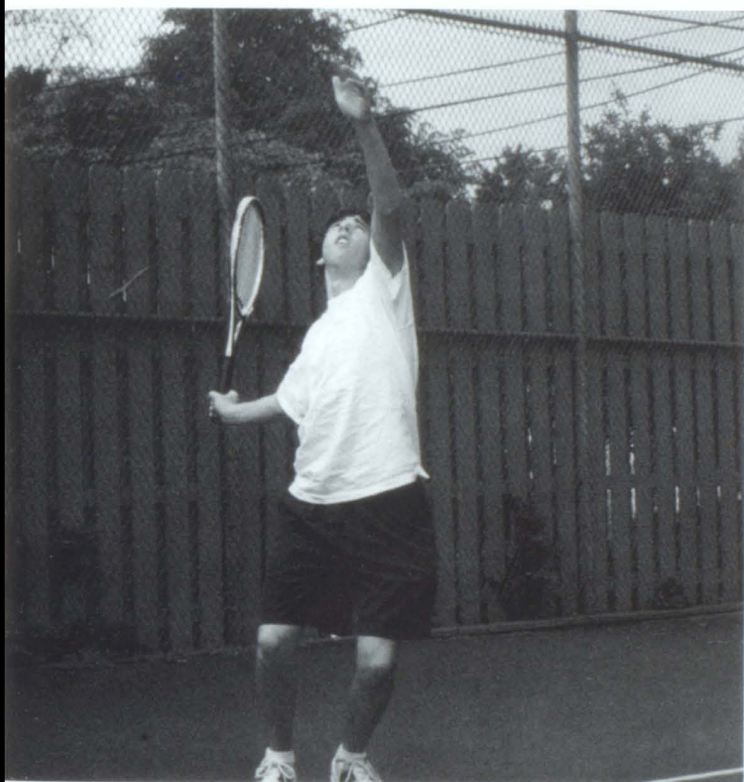

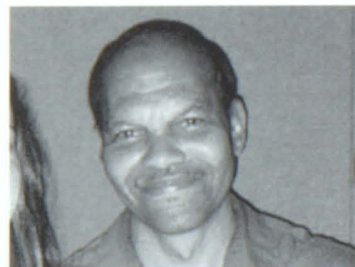


## Girl's Track Makes An Impression

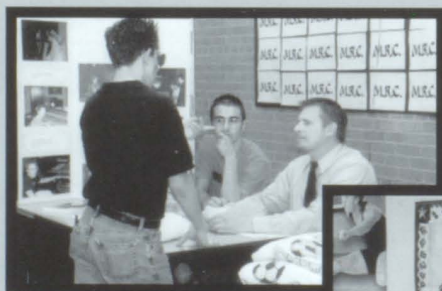
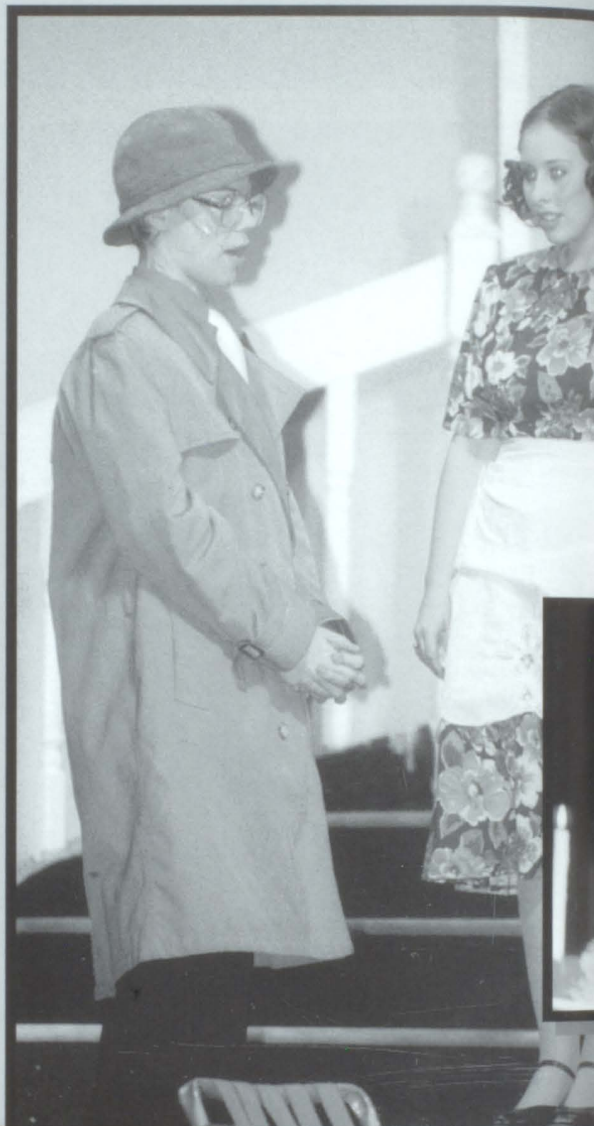

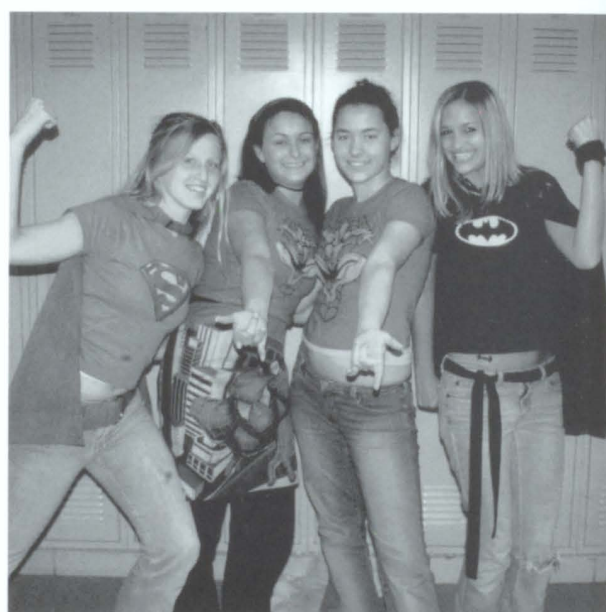
# SPIRIT SOARS

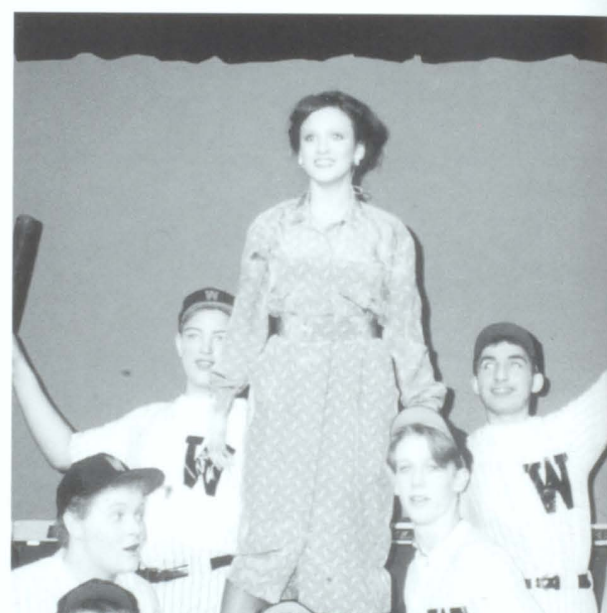

## HONORED FOR EXCELLENCE

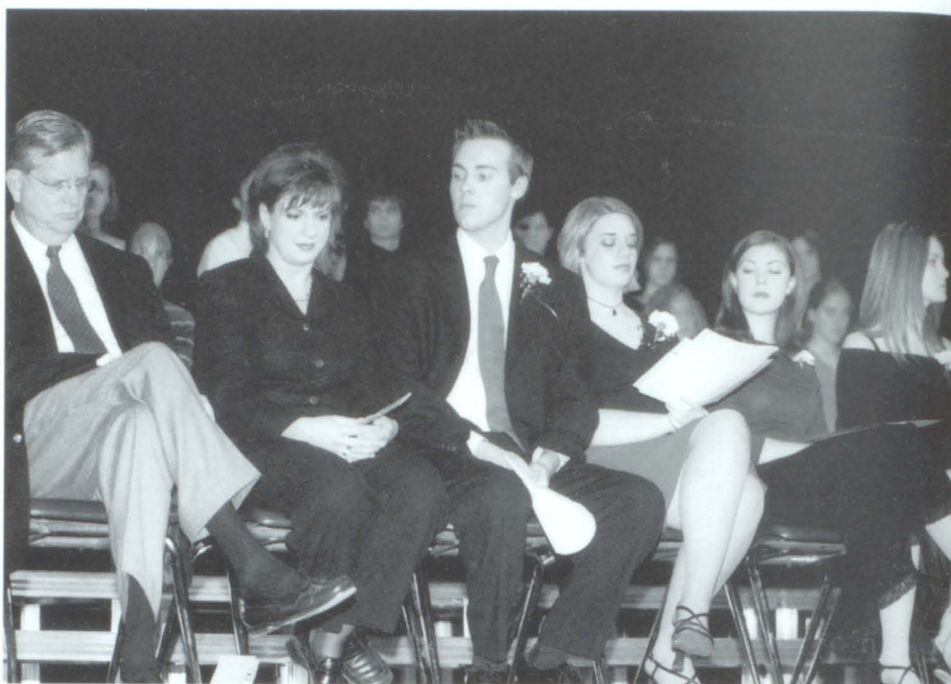

New member Shannon Guida'04 was glad when she was accepted into NHS because it "looked good on college applications, and it felt good to be recognized as a good student."

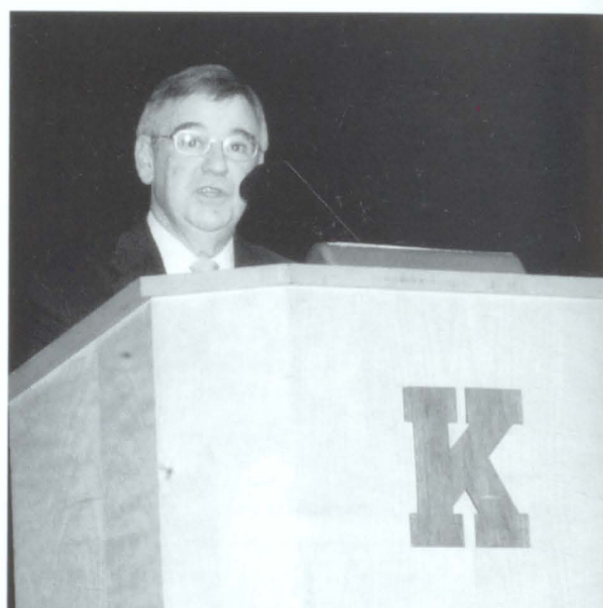

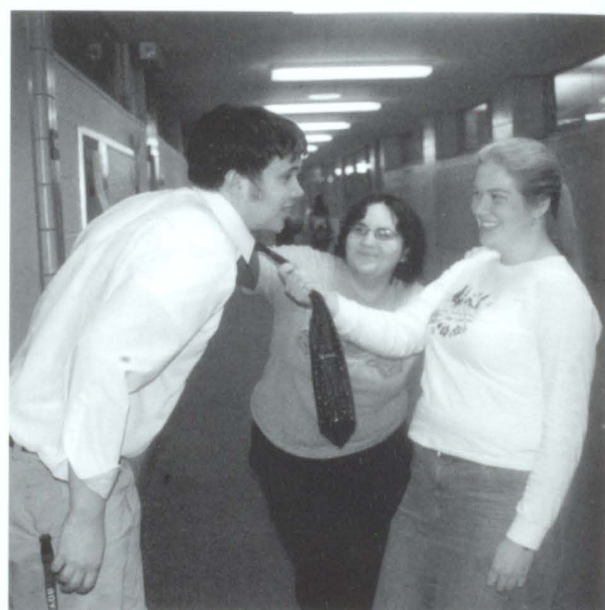

# TUTORING FOR THE FUTURE

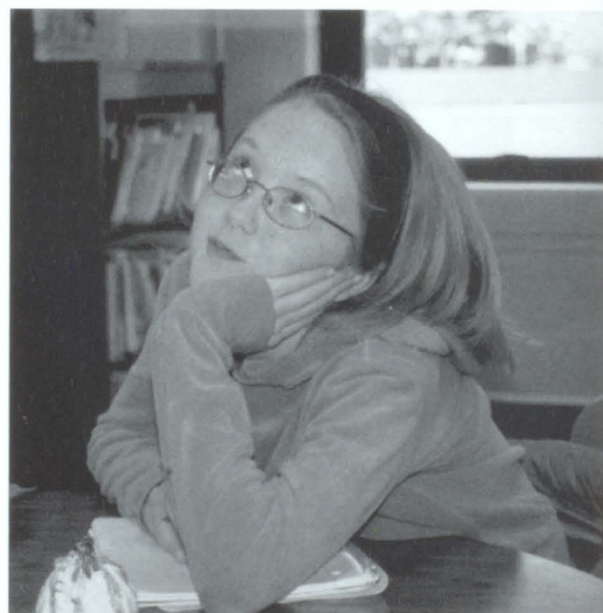

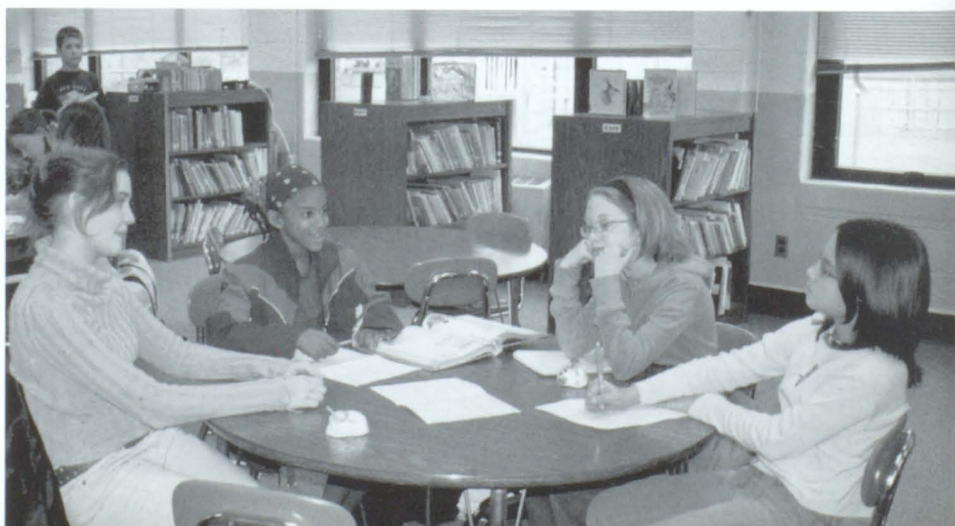

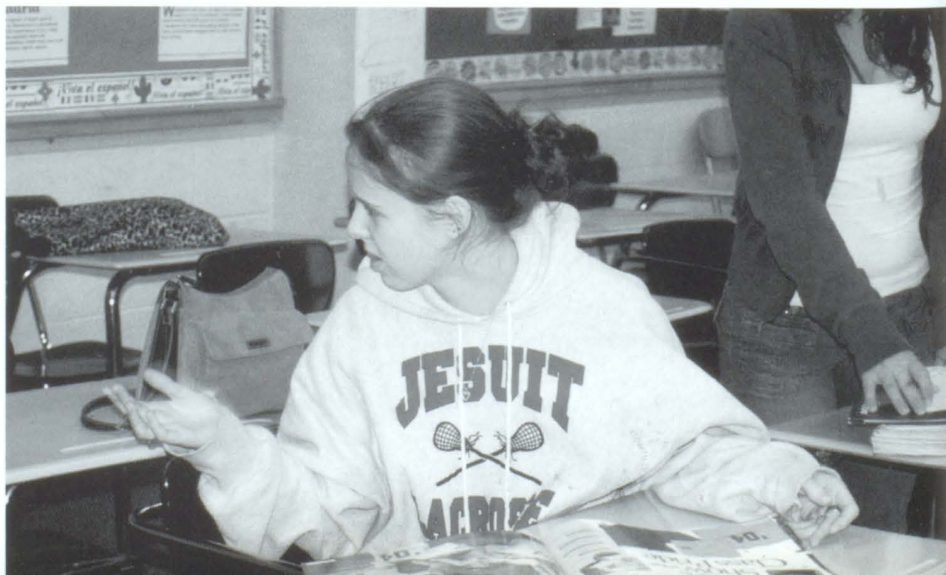

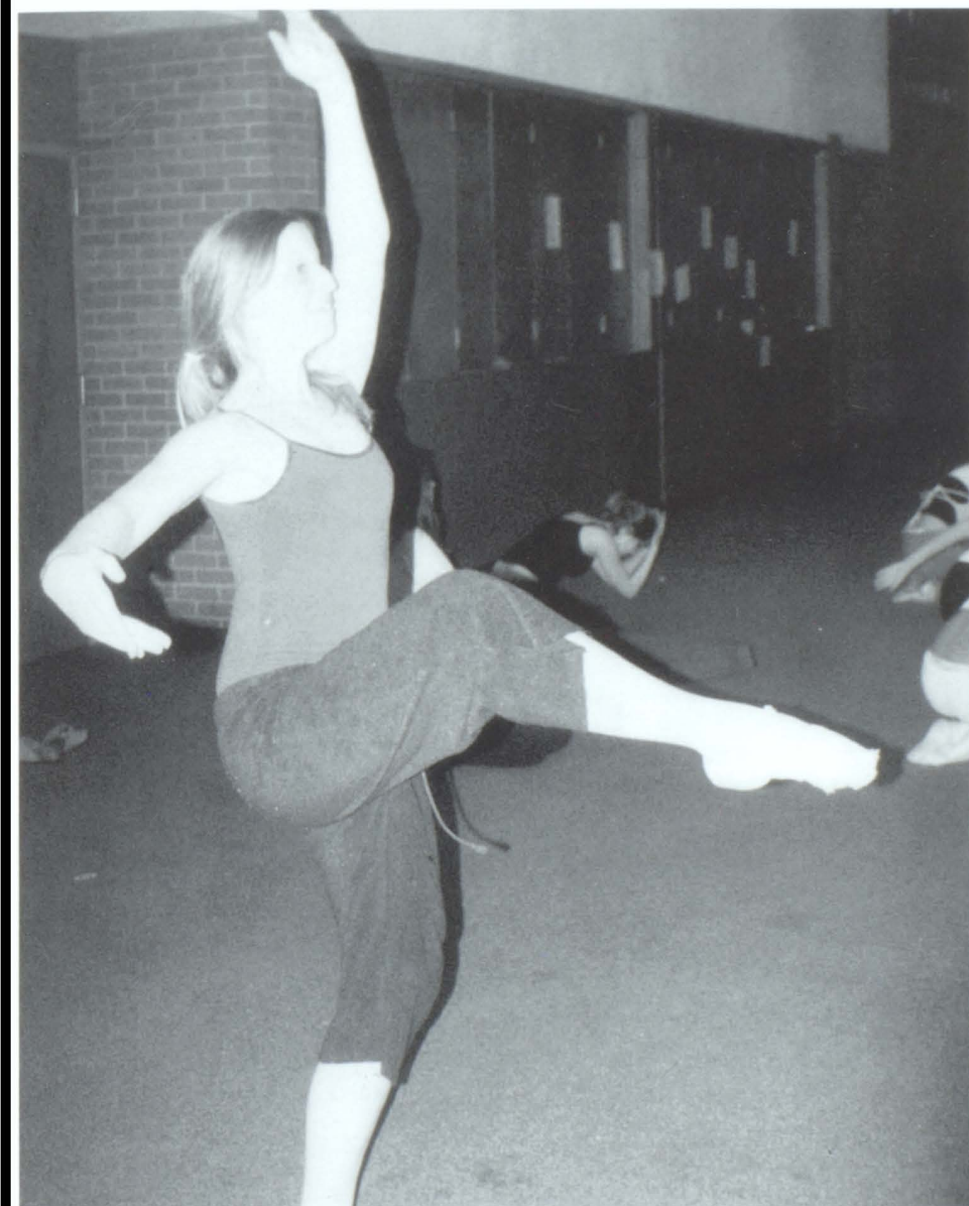

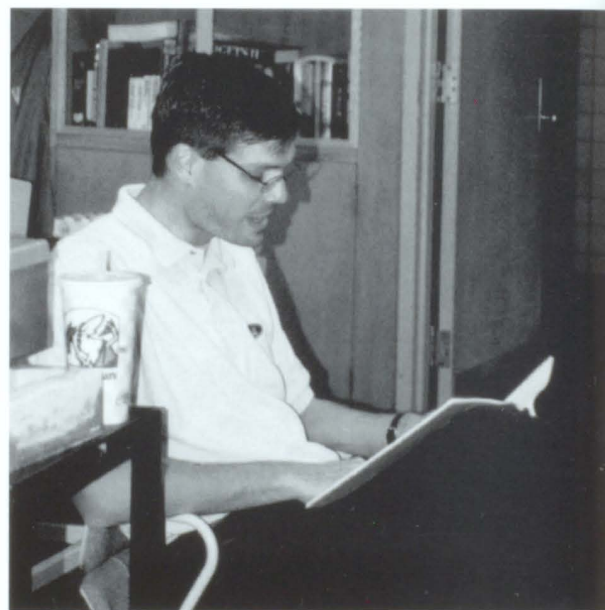

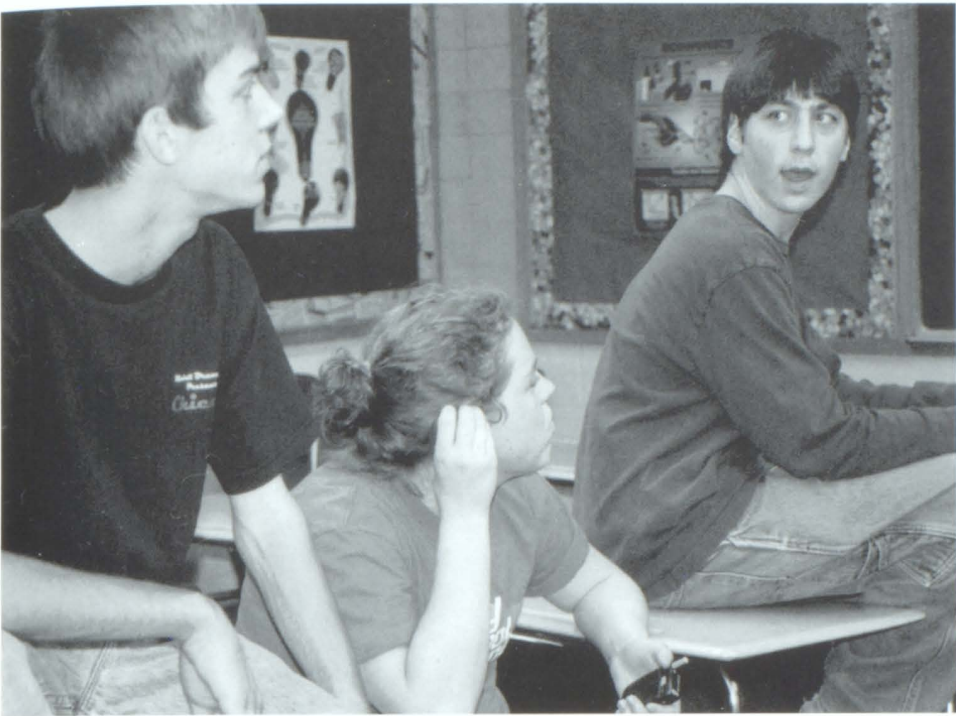

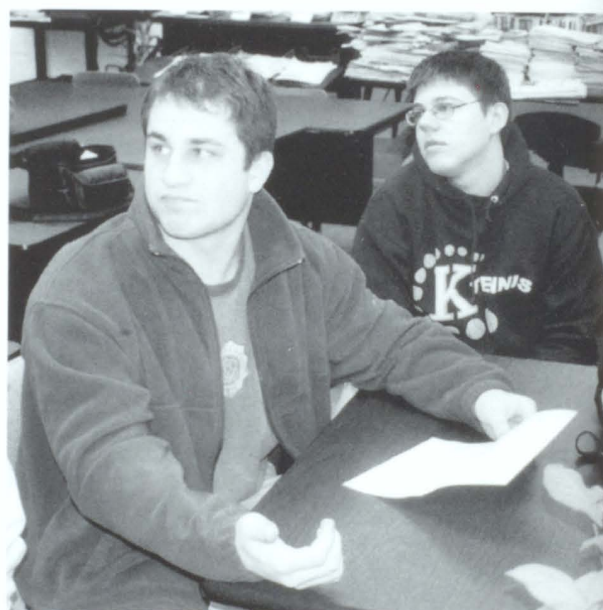
# FUTURE ENTREPRENEURS OF AMERICA

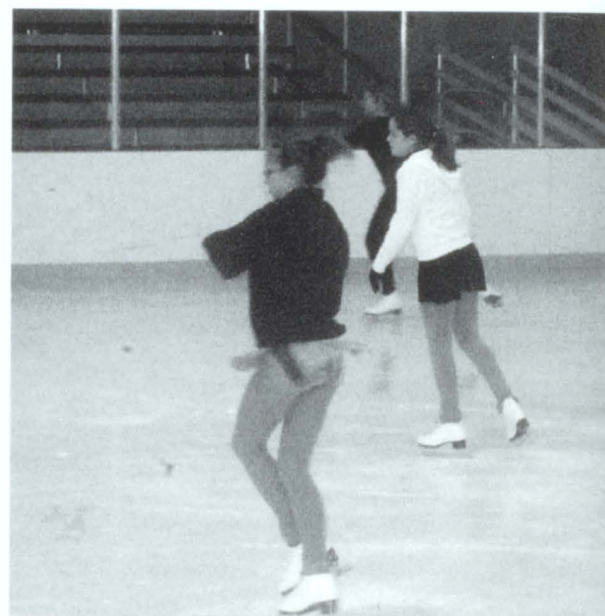
# THE INSIDE EDGE

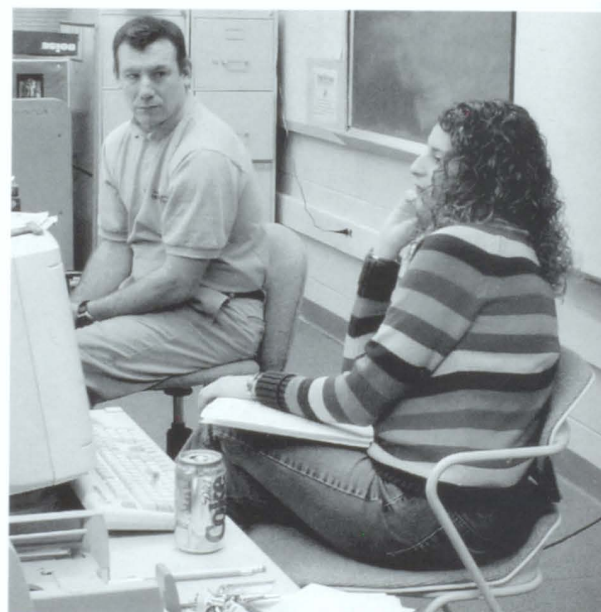

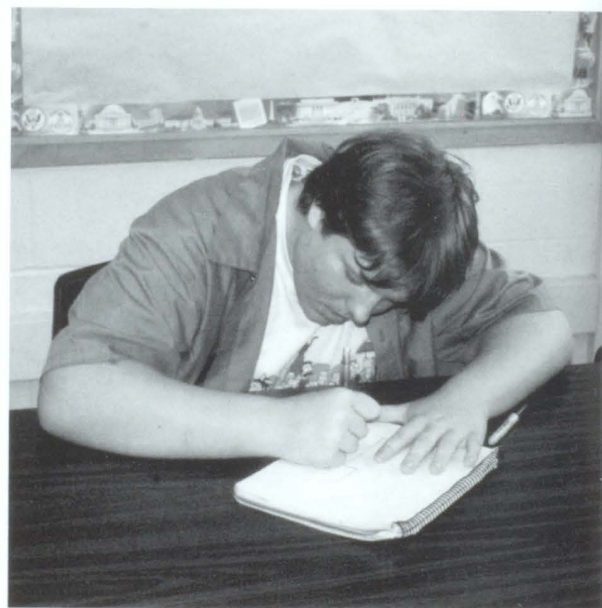
# AMAZING ANIME!

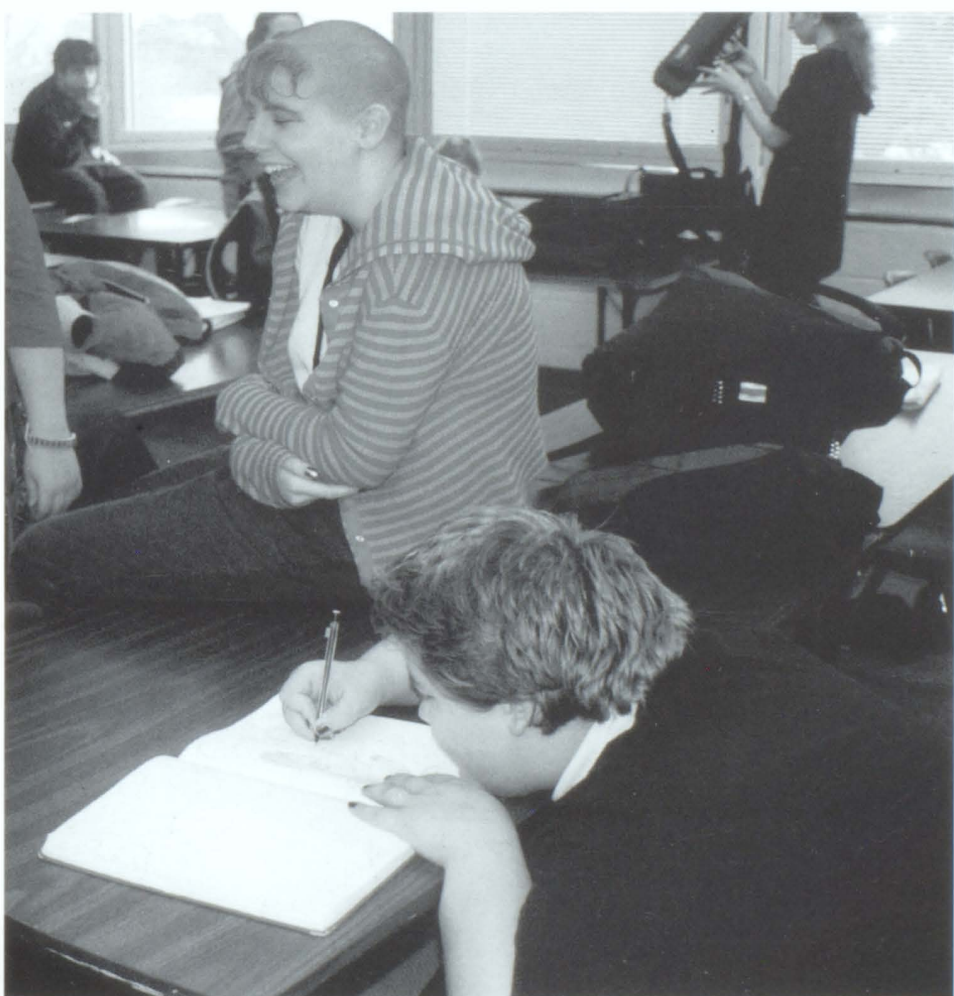

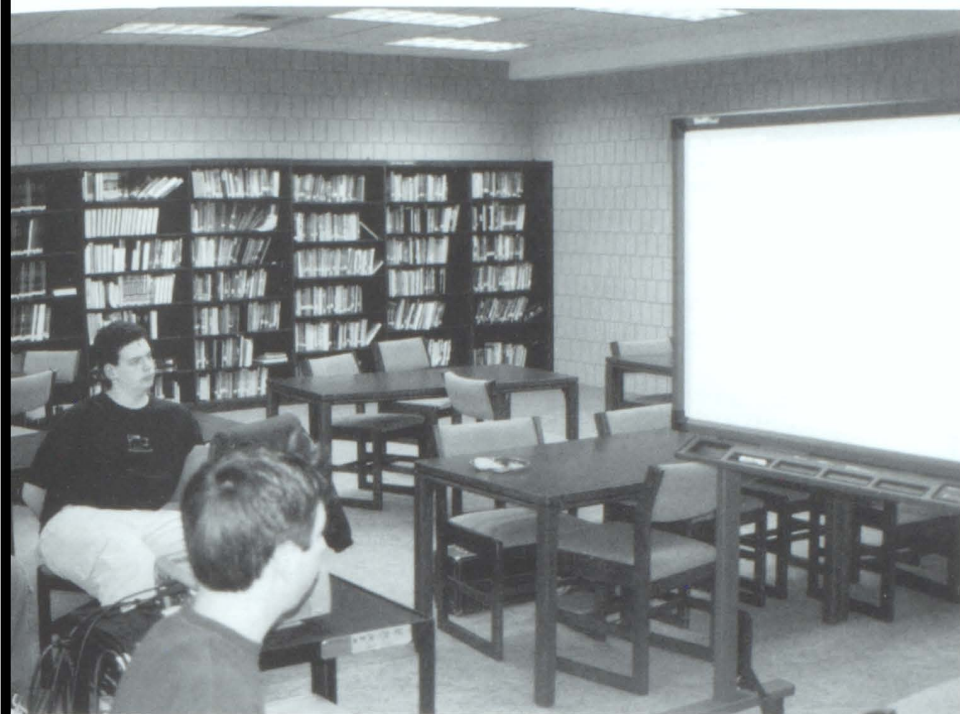

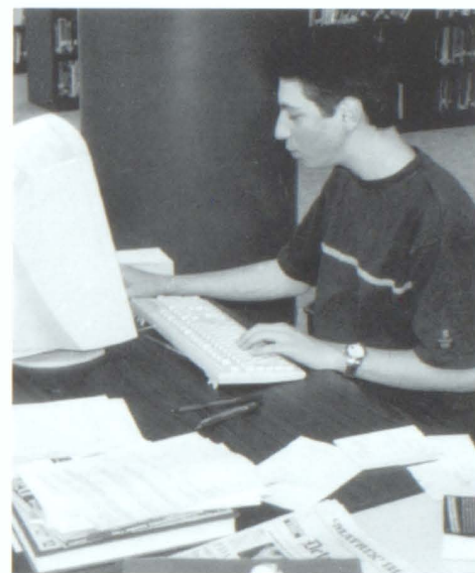

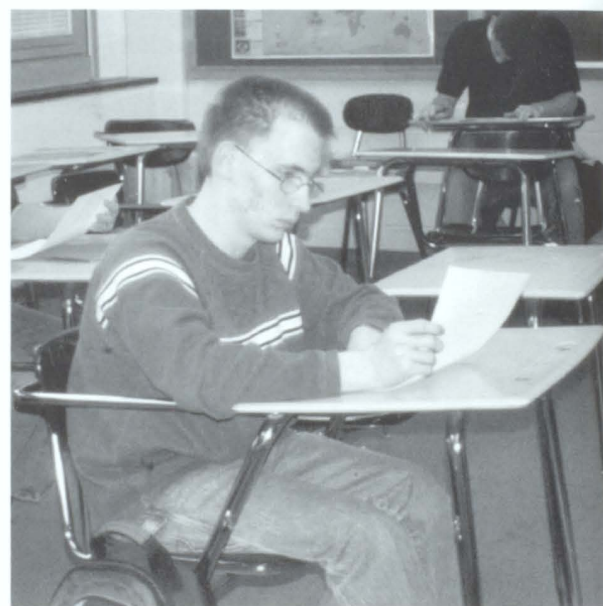
# MIXIN' IT UP!

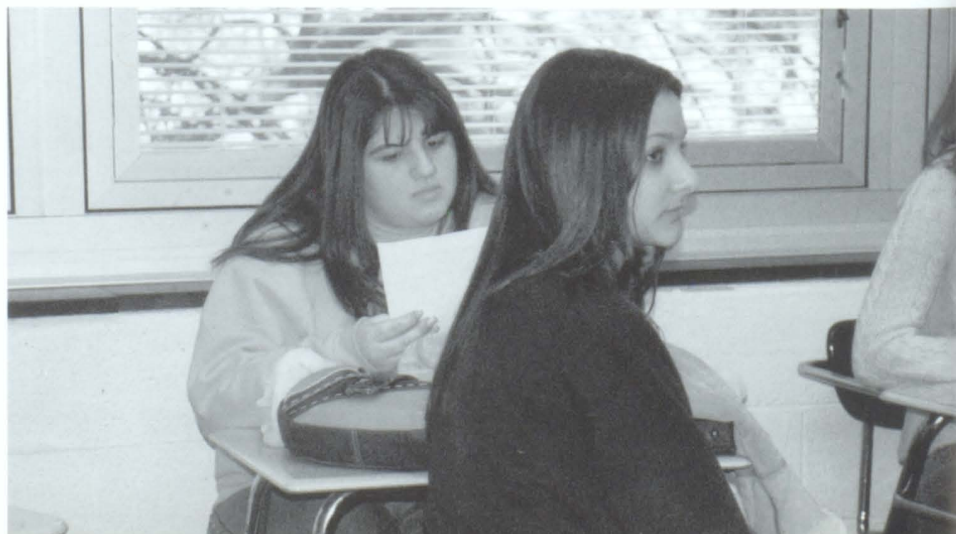

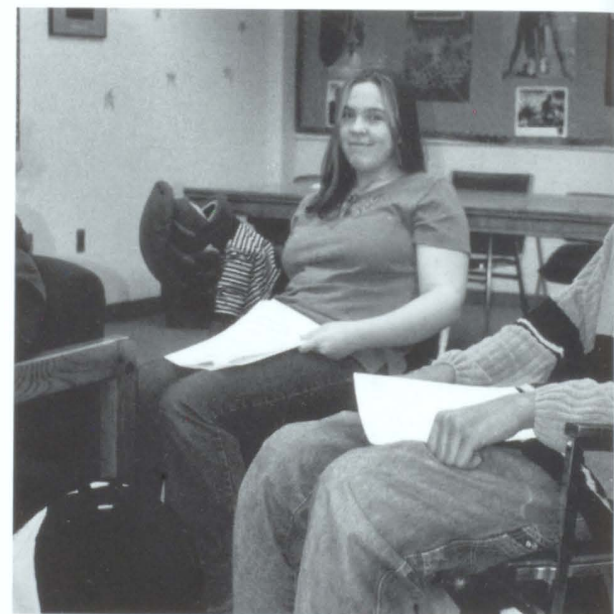

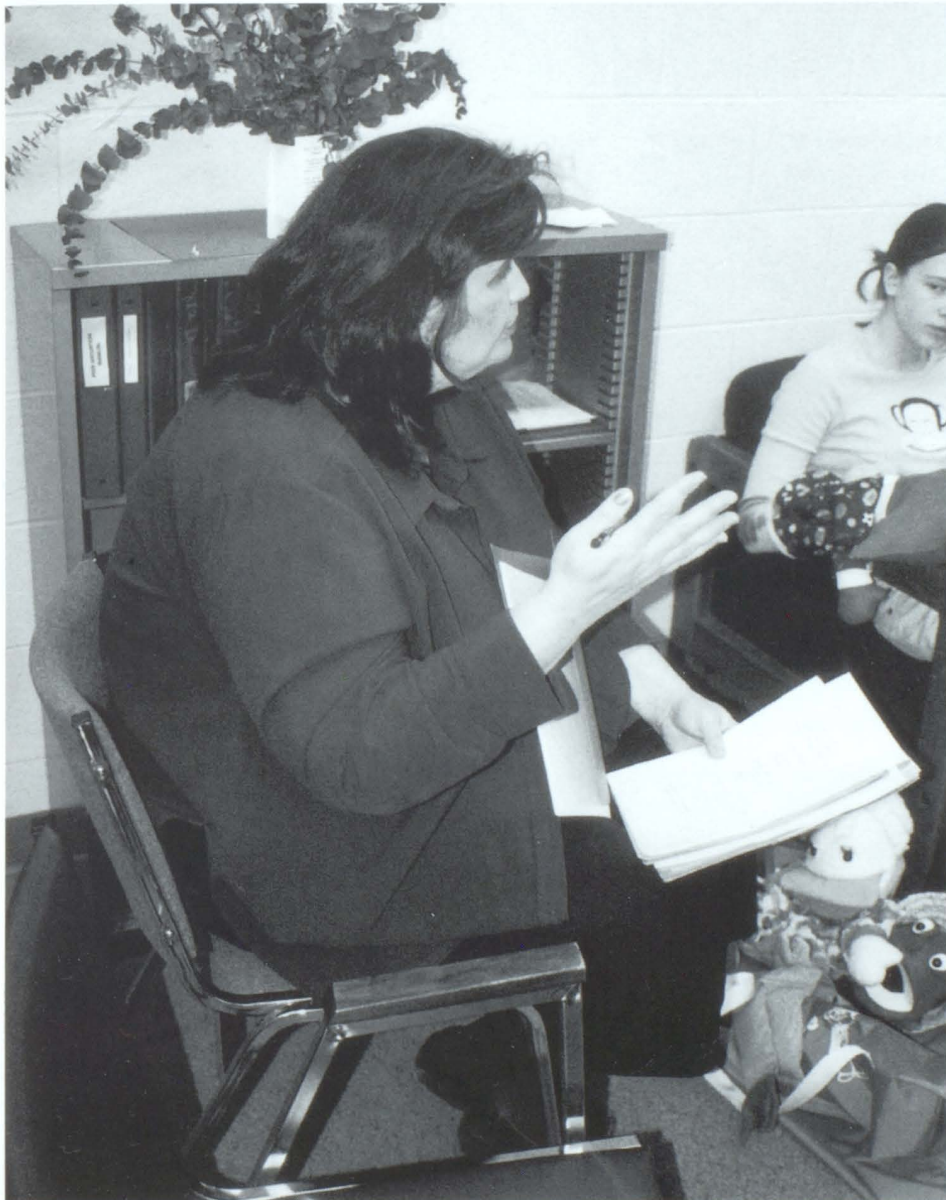

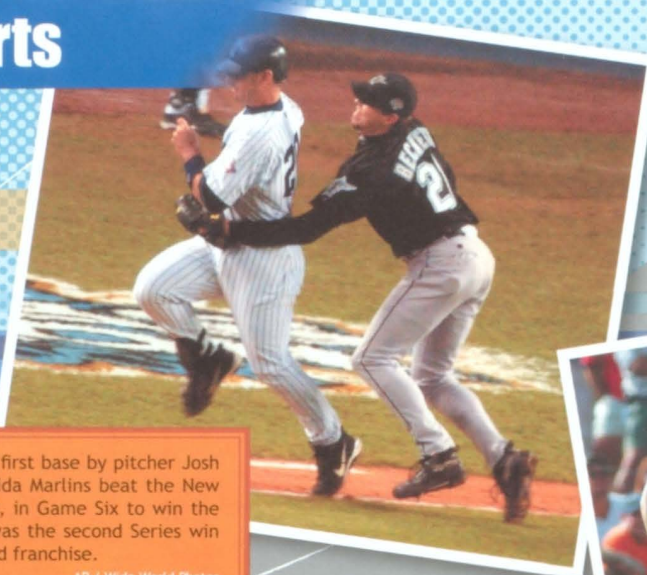

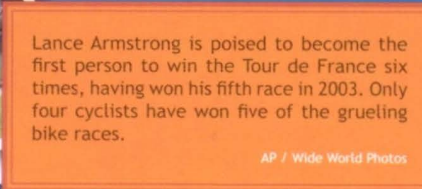

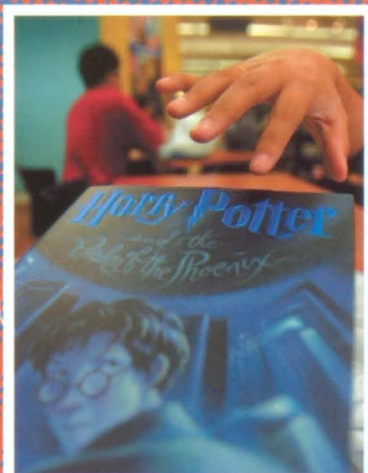

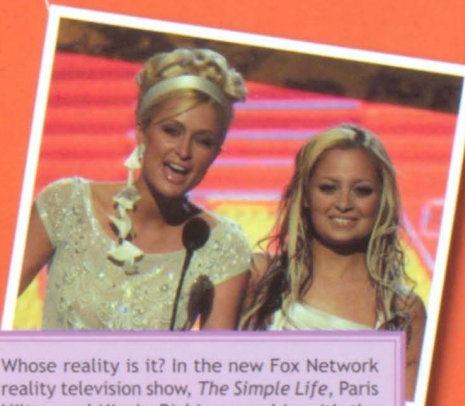
