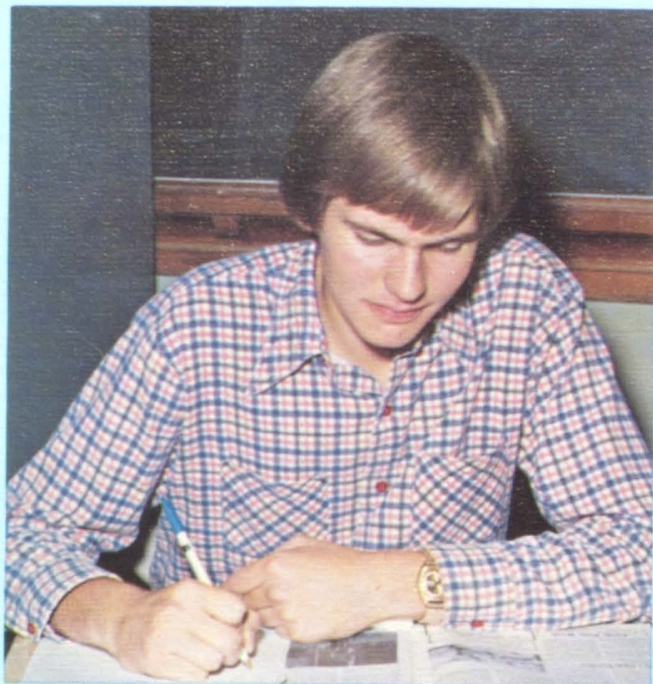

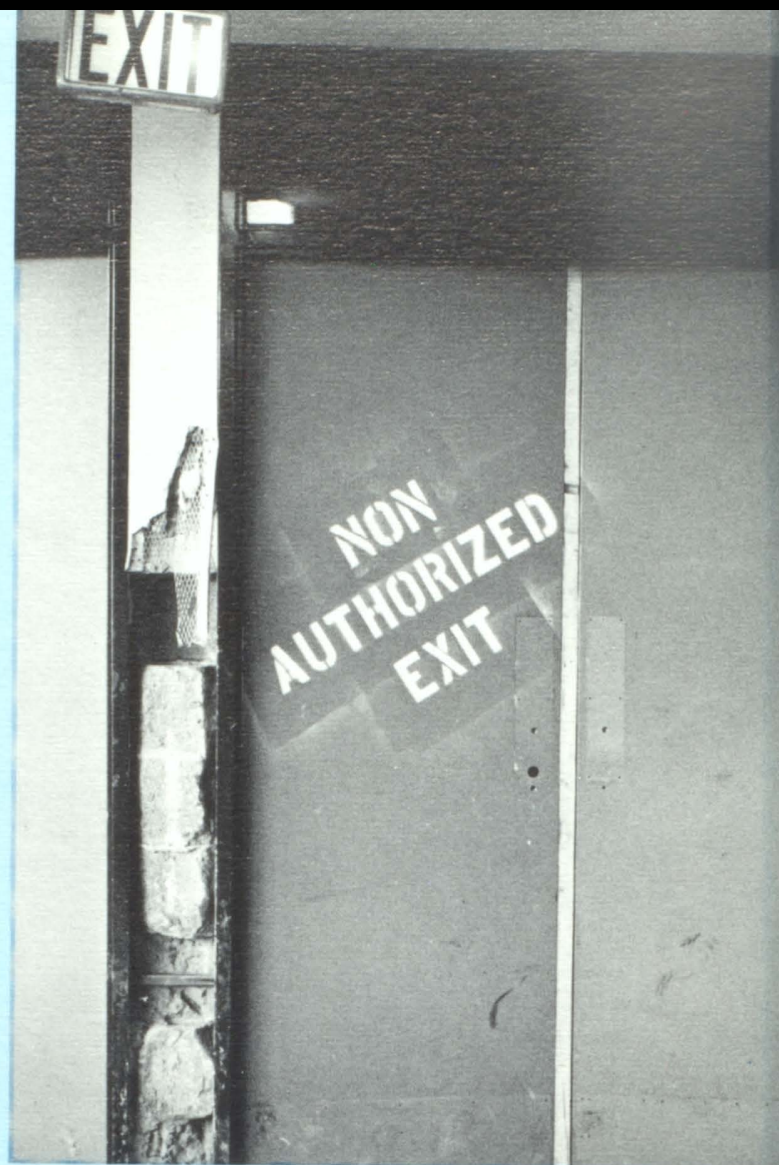

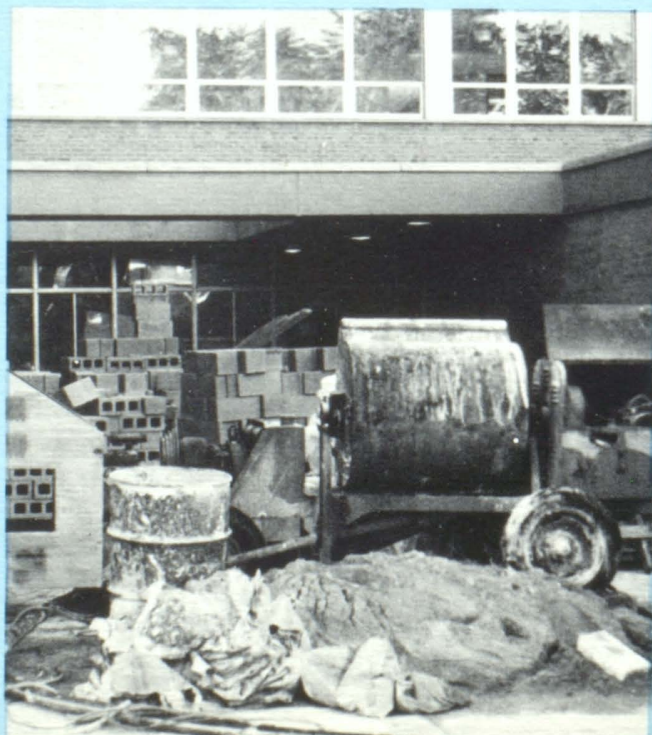


Renovation Completes New Science Wing

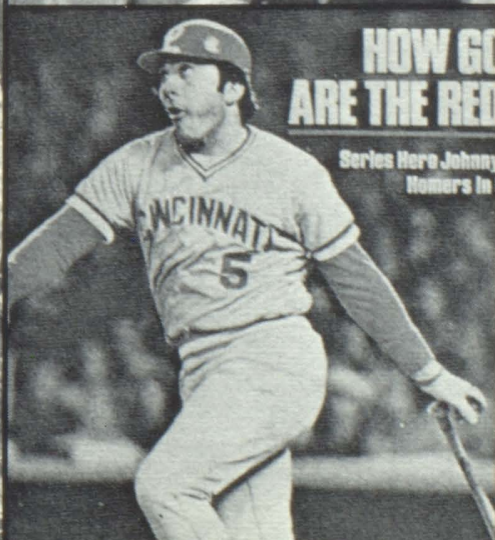
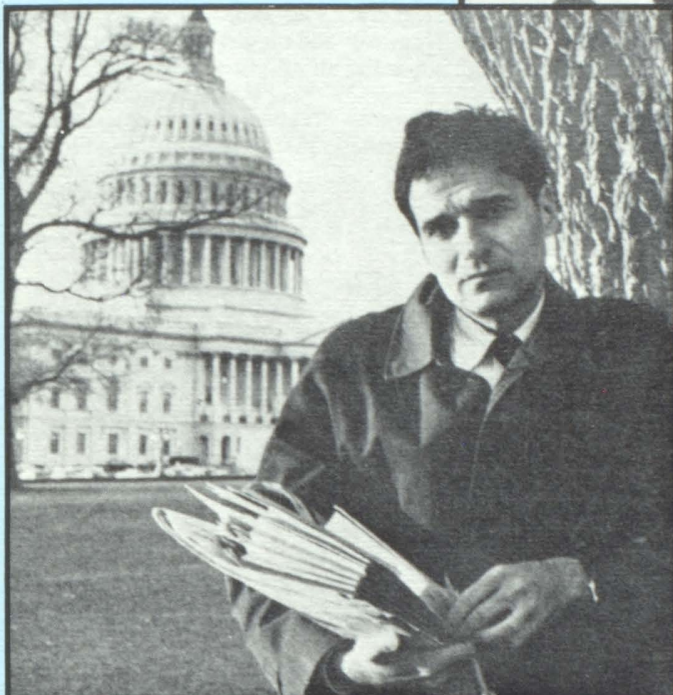

Debate . . .

It was a busy and rewarding year for the Dondero Debate Team. For the fourth year in a row, the team took second place in the MSAA League, losing out to Southfield-Lathrup, which won first place in the Michigan State finals at Grand Rapids. Even then in speaker points, Dondero beat Southfield-Lathrup by one point, while losing in debates.

For the first time, the team picked up four trophies in the Warren Woods Novice League, winning two of the top ten affirmative and negative awards, along with the usual school trophy and medallion. The squad also took sixth place out of 14 schools in the Middle Macomb Junior Varsity League. Varsity came in second last.

This year's topic was "Resolved: That a comprehensive system of medical care should be guaranteed by the federal government for all U.S. citizens." Next year the team will debate energy independence for the country. Besides competing with other schools in the Detroit area in three leagues, the squad also attended the Novice State Prelims at Grand Blanc. The debaters also staged demonstration debates before English and social studies classes to display their techniques and recruit members.

Named as Most Valuable Debater this season was Kim McLaughlin. Top Affirmative Trophy went to Cathy Anderson and Top Negative Trophy went to Mona Cocoli. Tom Hawkins won the Top Novice Trophy.

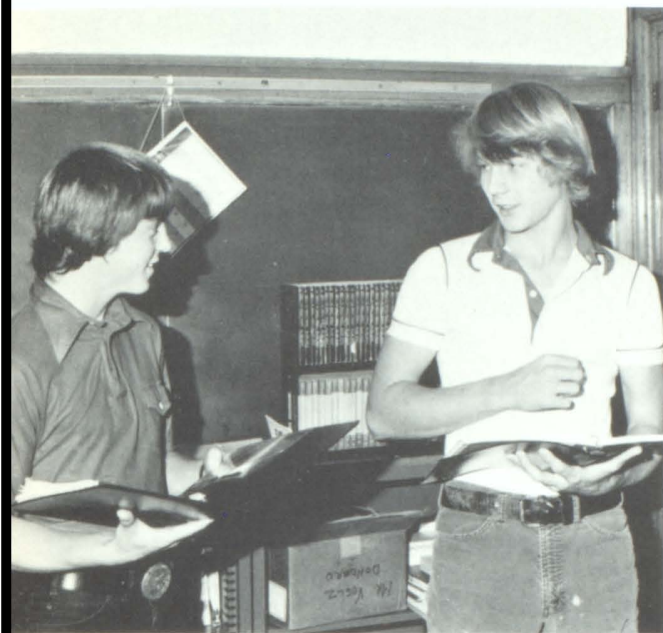

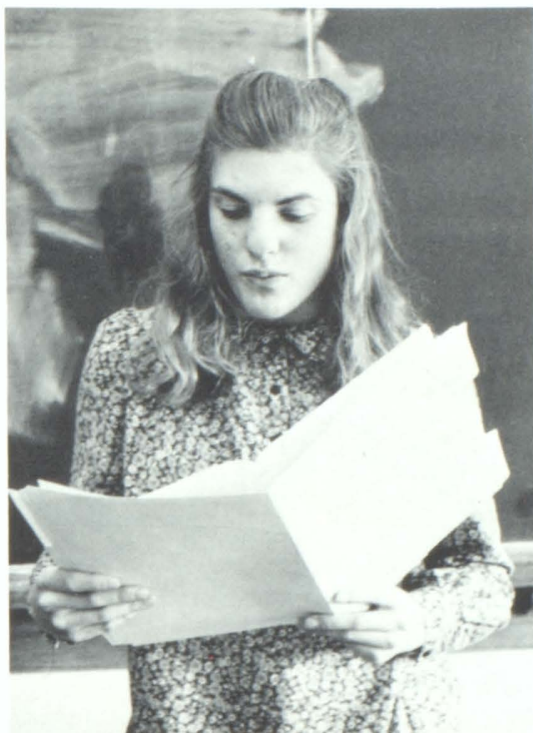

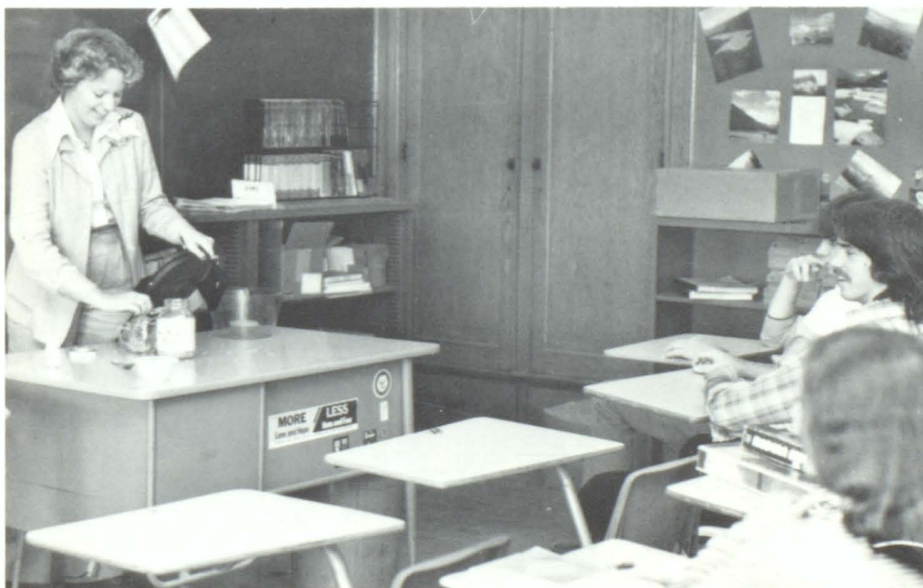

Math Department Adds Computers

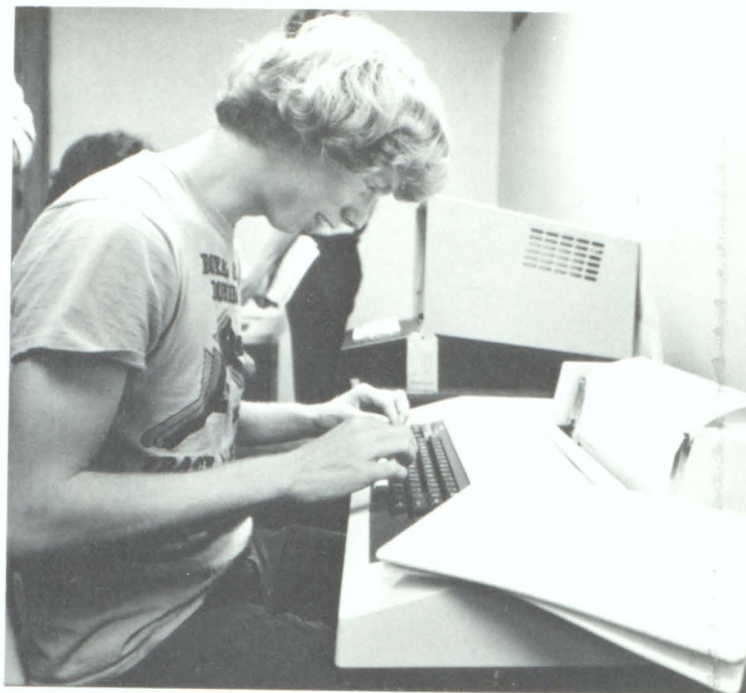

There are a total of ten teachers who conduct Senior Math, Honors Geometry, Informal Geometry, Algebra, Pre Algebra, and General Math.

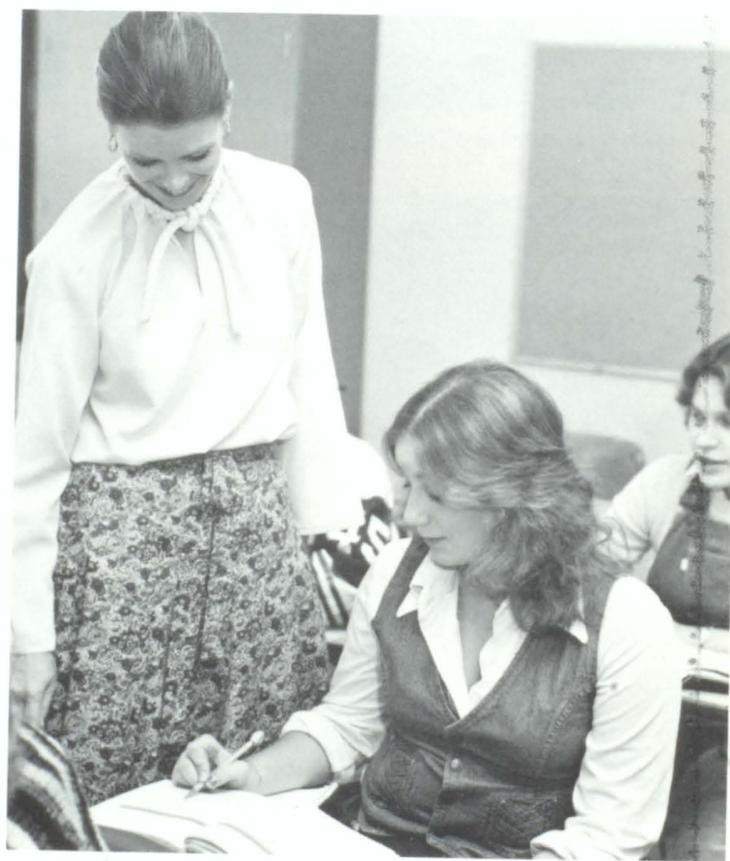

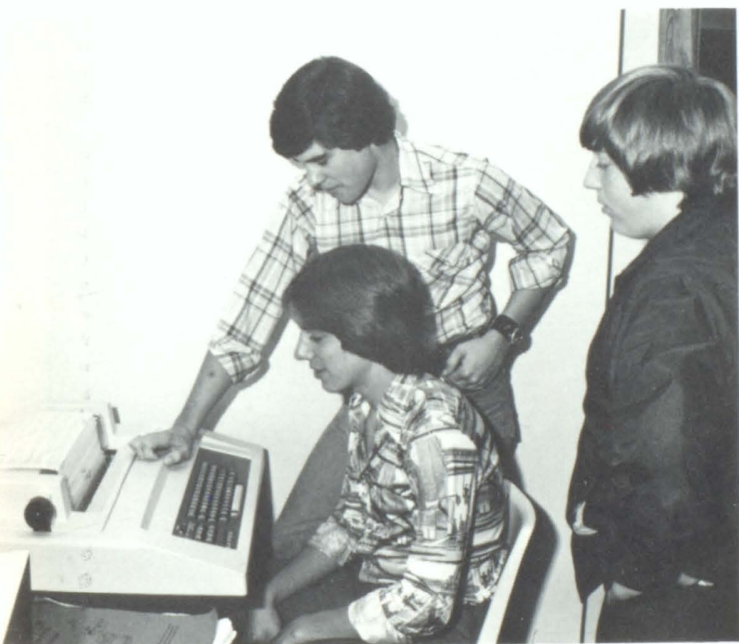

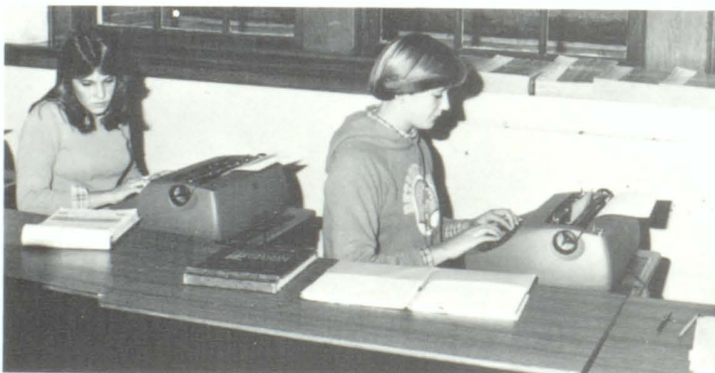

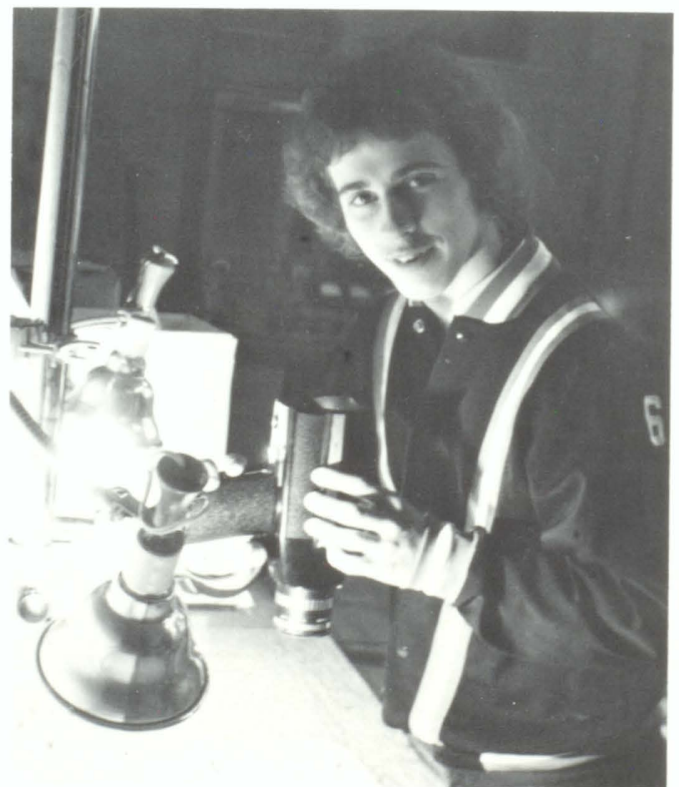

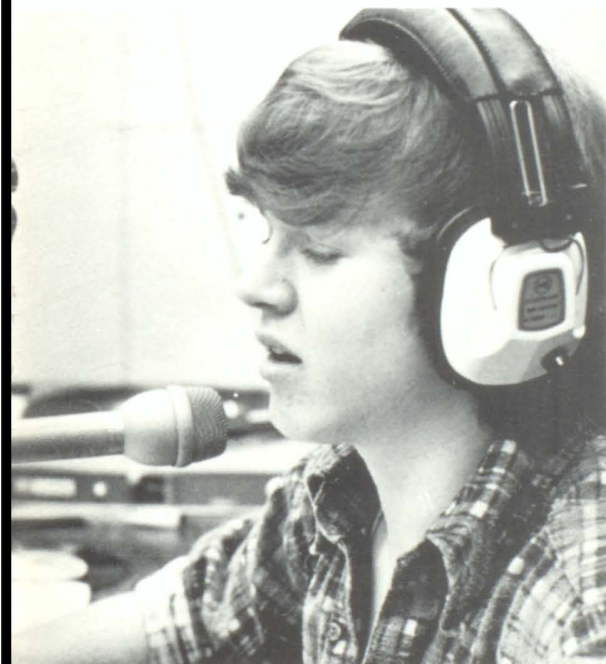

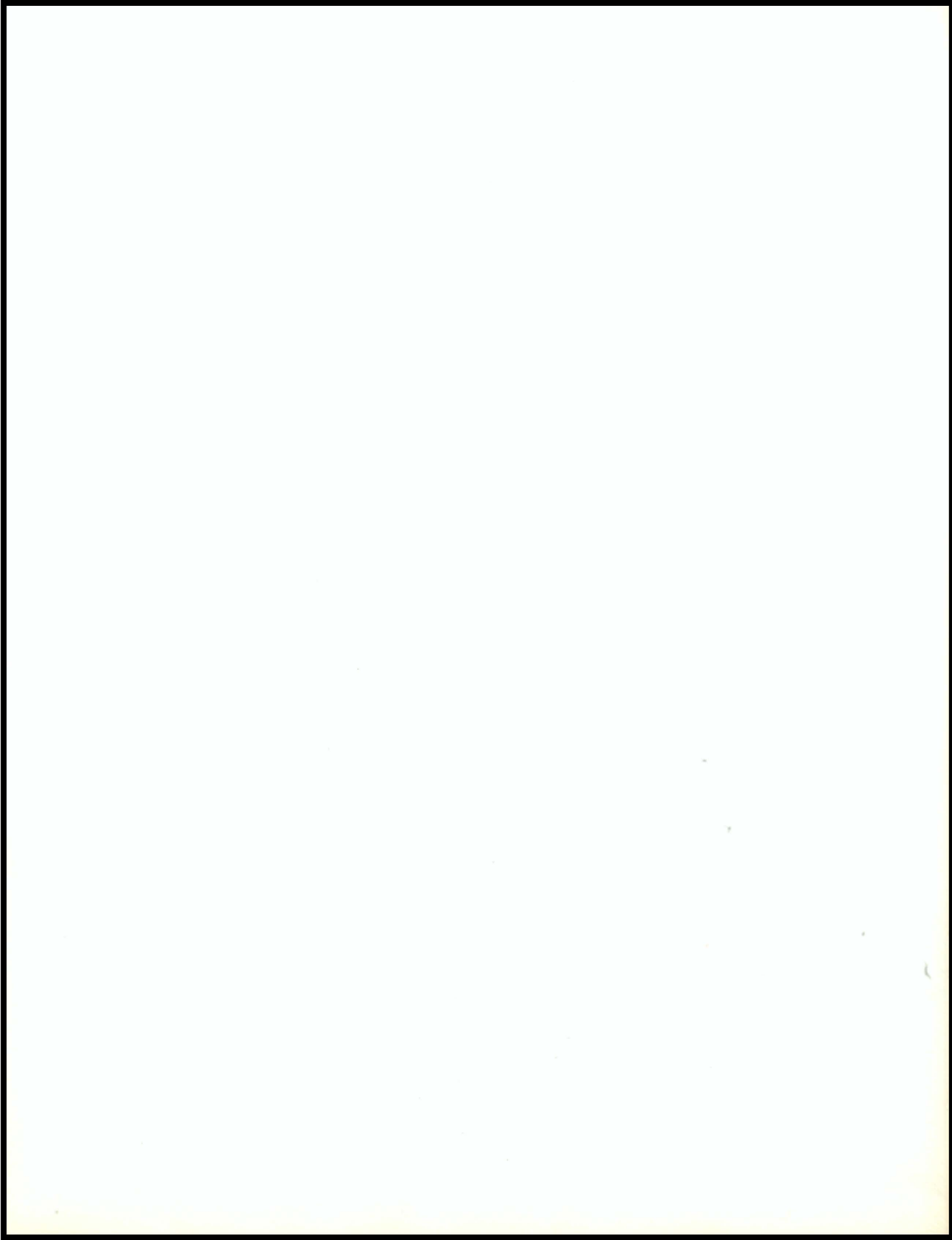

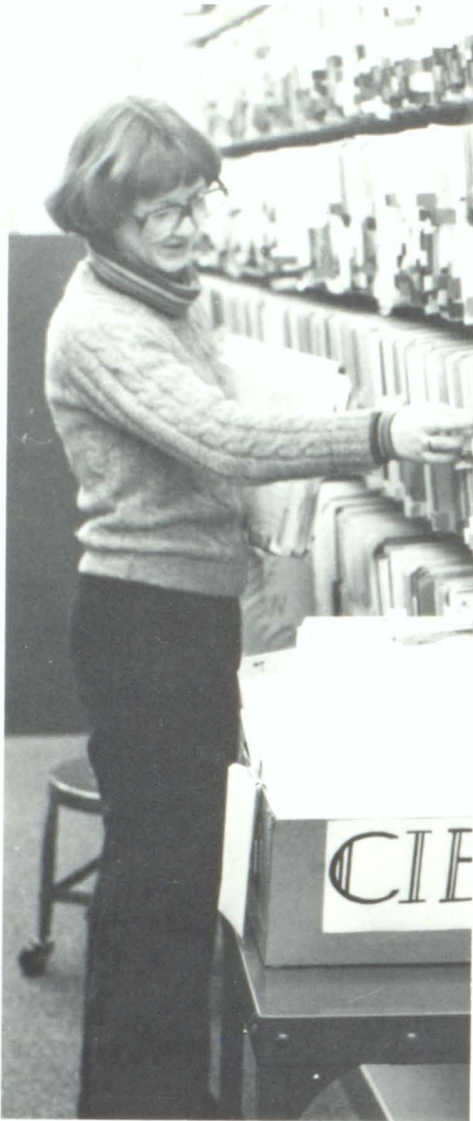

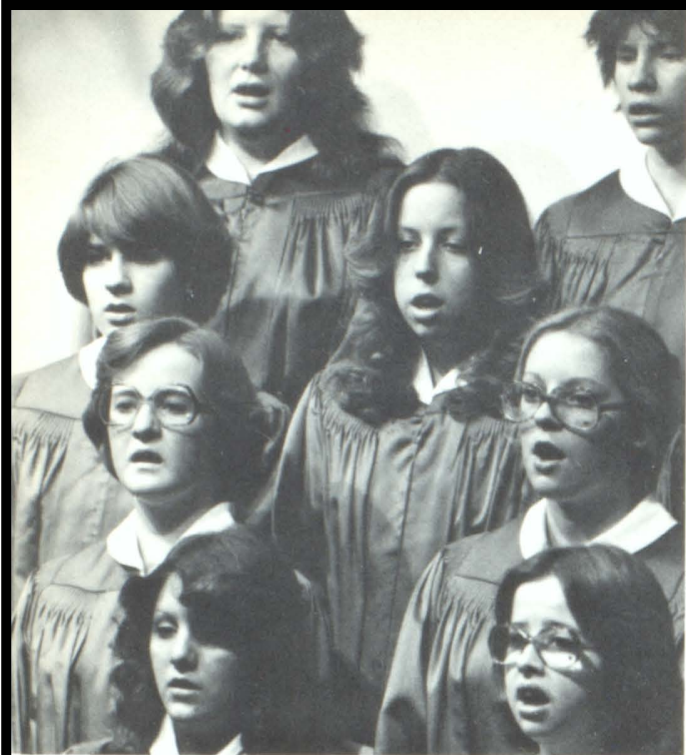

Besides learning pieces of music, the choirs worked hard on improving their musical abilities, such as, sight-reading, rythm and scales.

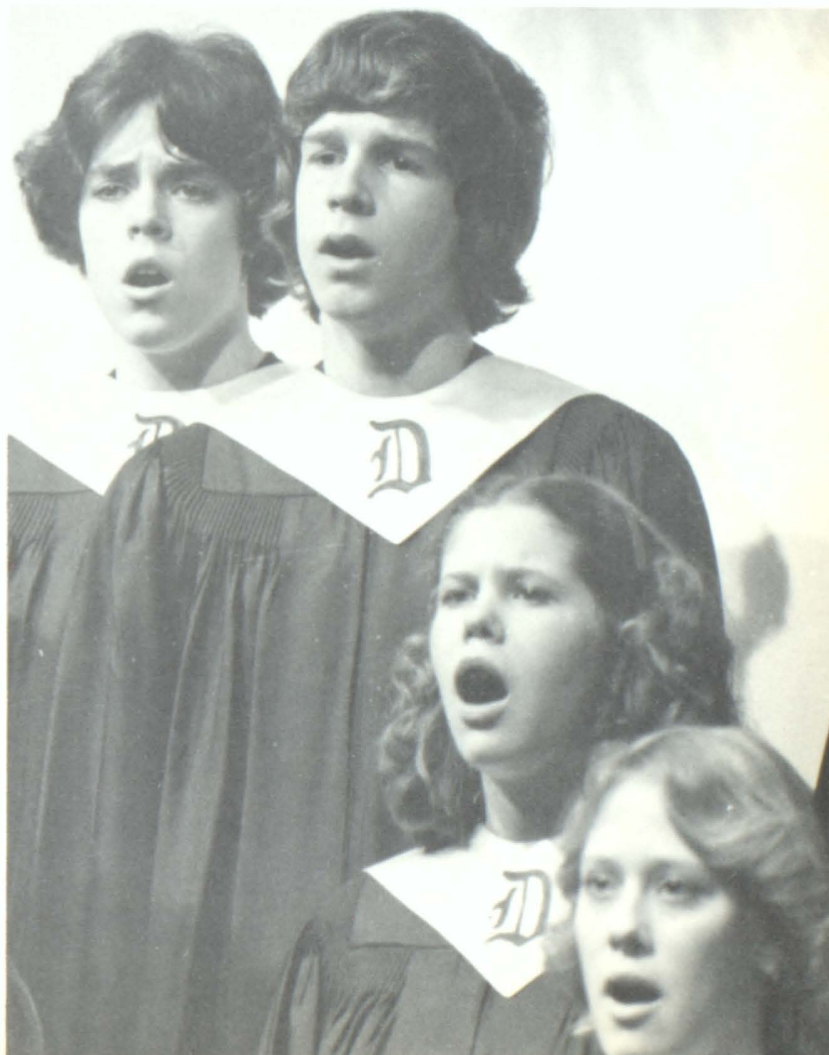

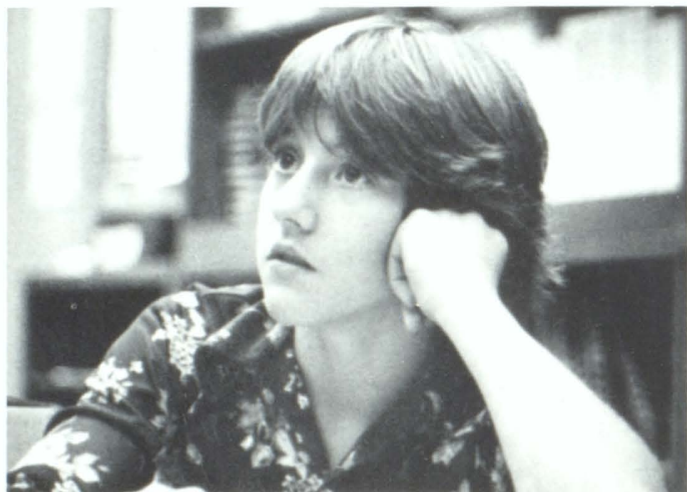
Student Senate Works Above and Beyond

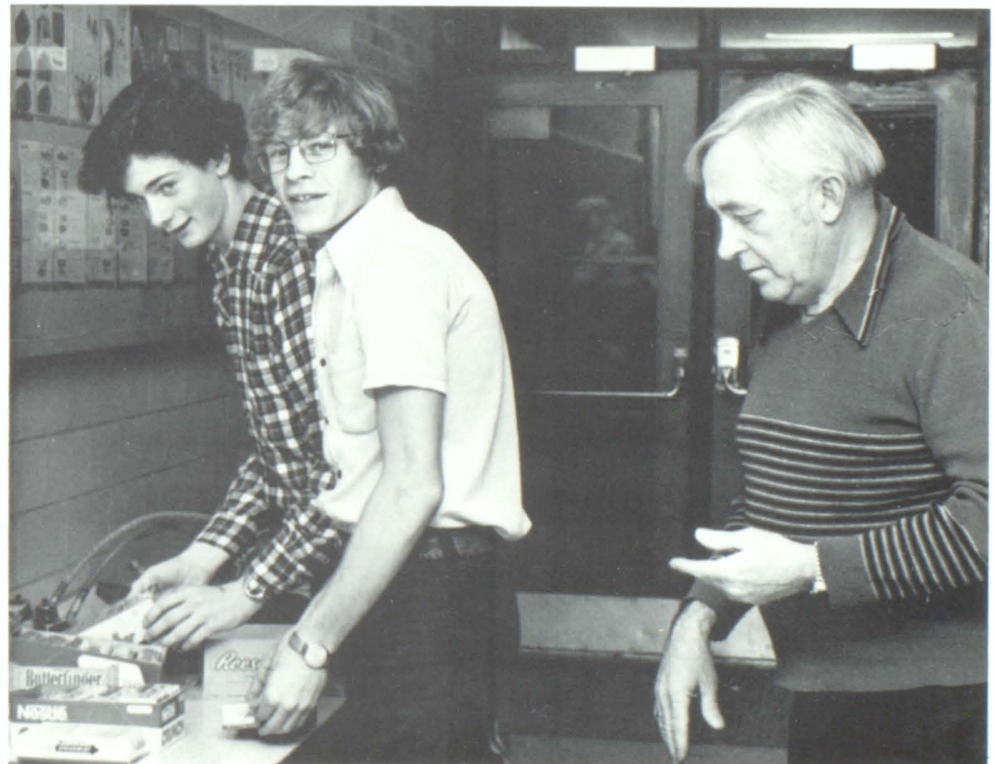

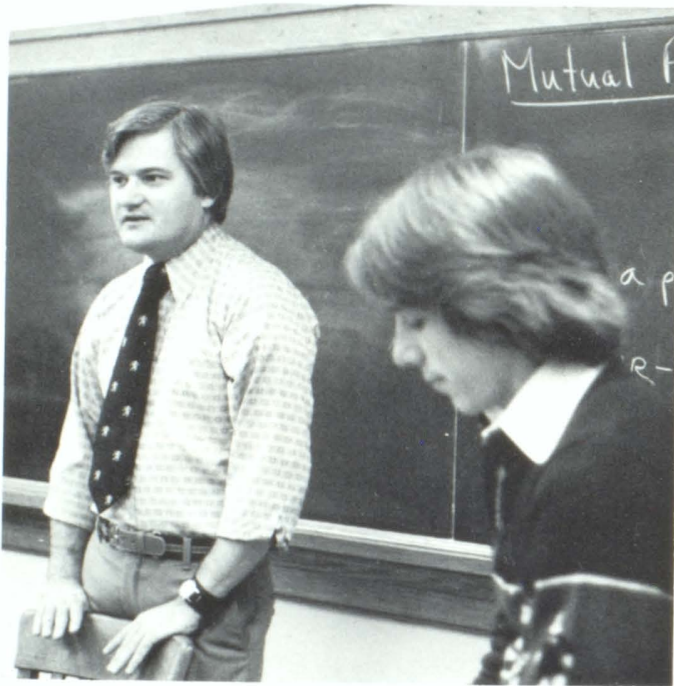

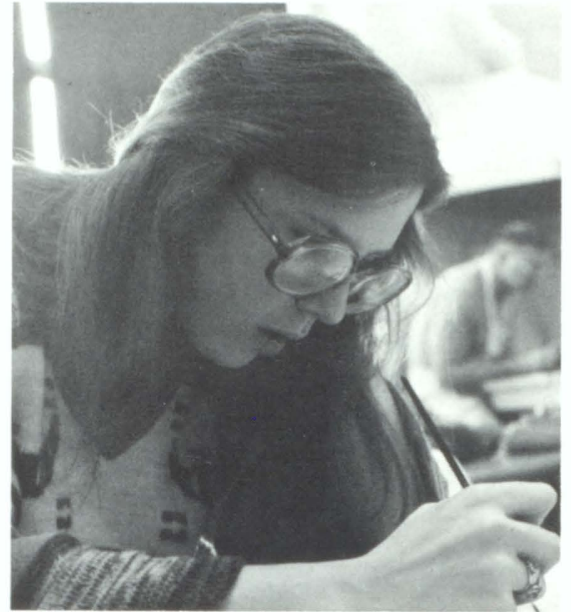

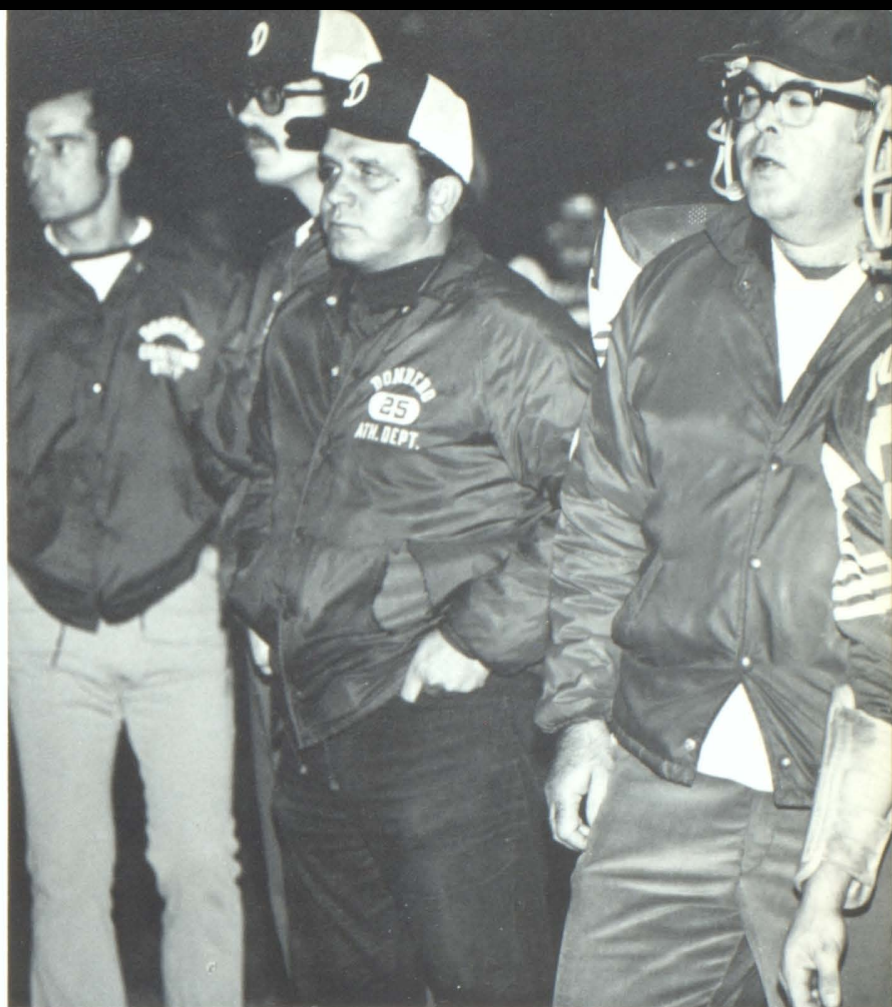

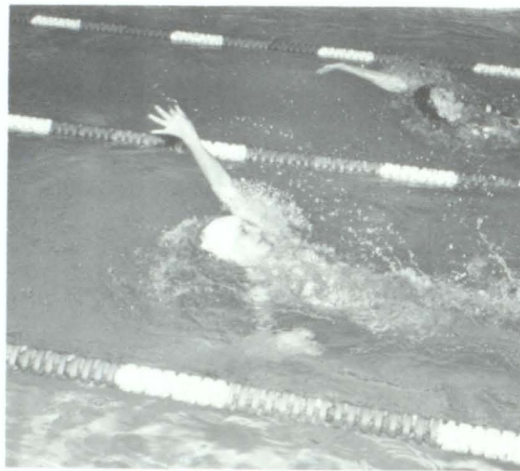


Girls Swim Is Fifth in State

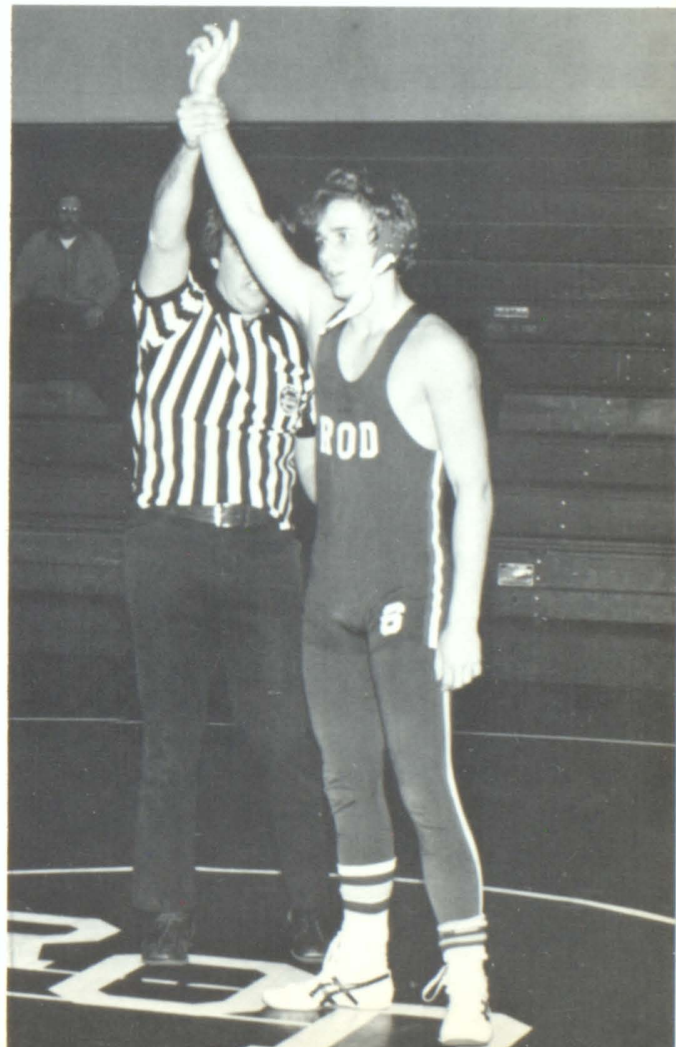

After the prom was over some couples chose to continue the festivities by attending parties at their friends' houses.



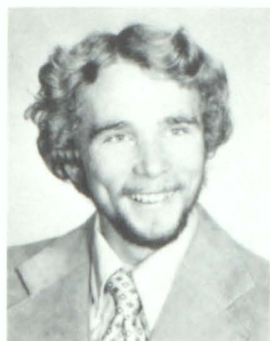

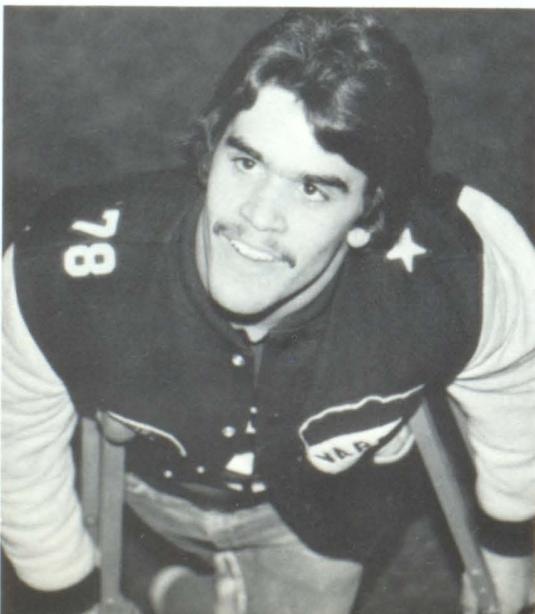

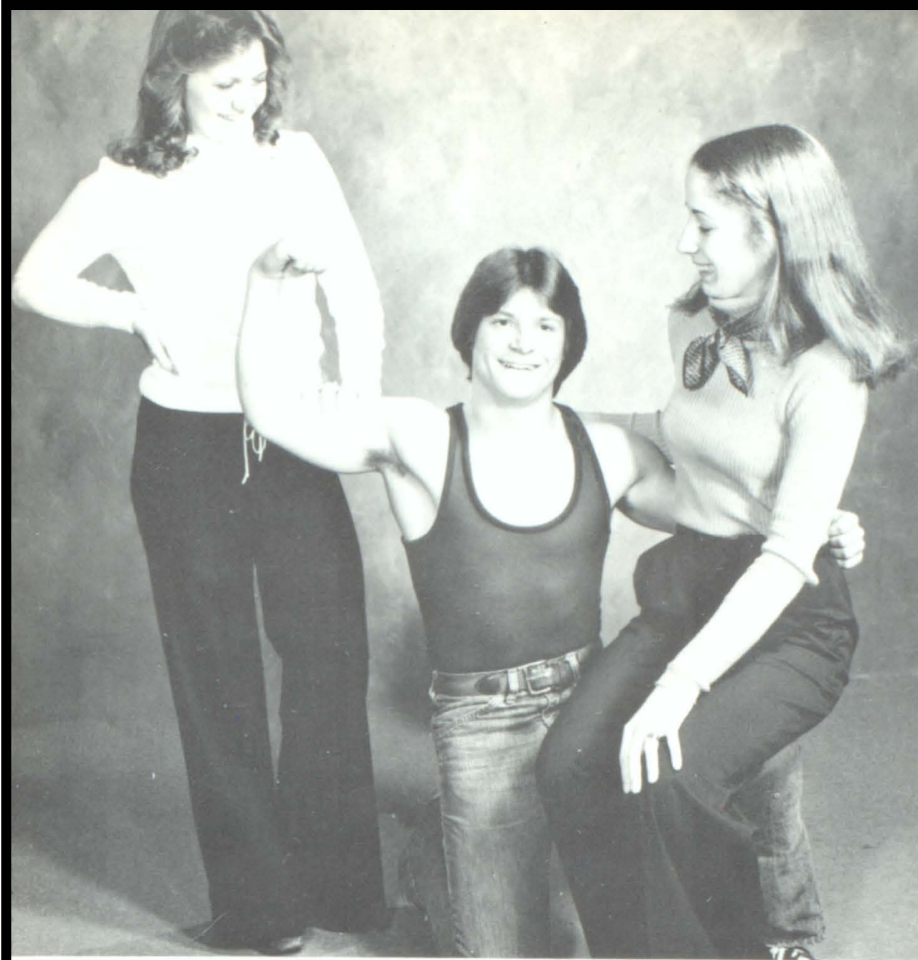

As Patti Doster put it, "It was a good experience, I learned to handle responsibilities and I developed self discipline." All the other officers feel the same way about this.

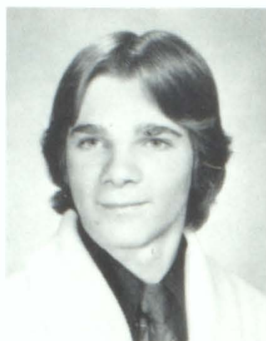

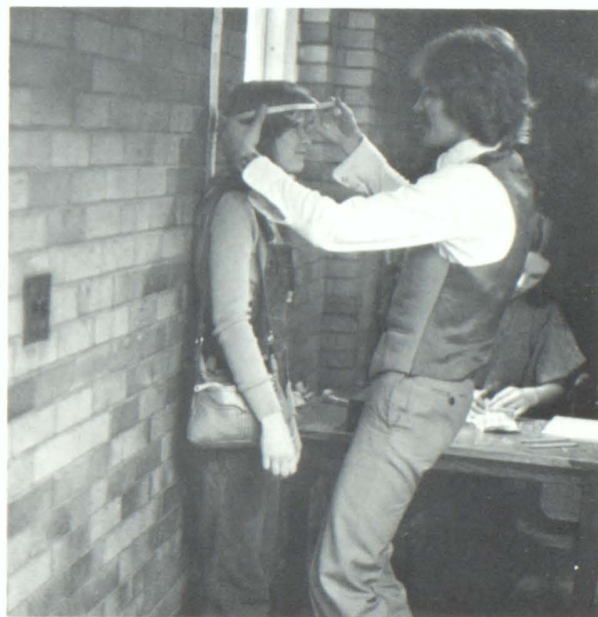
