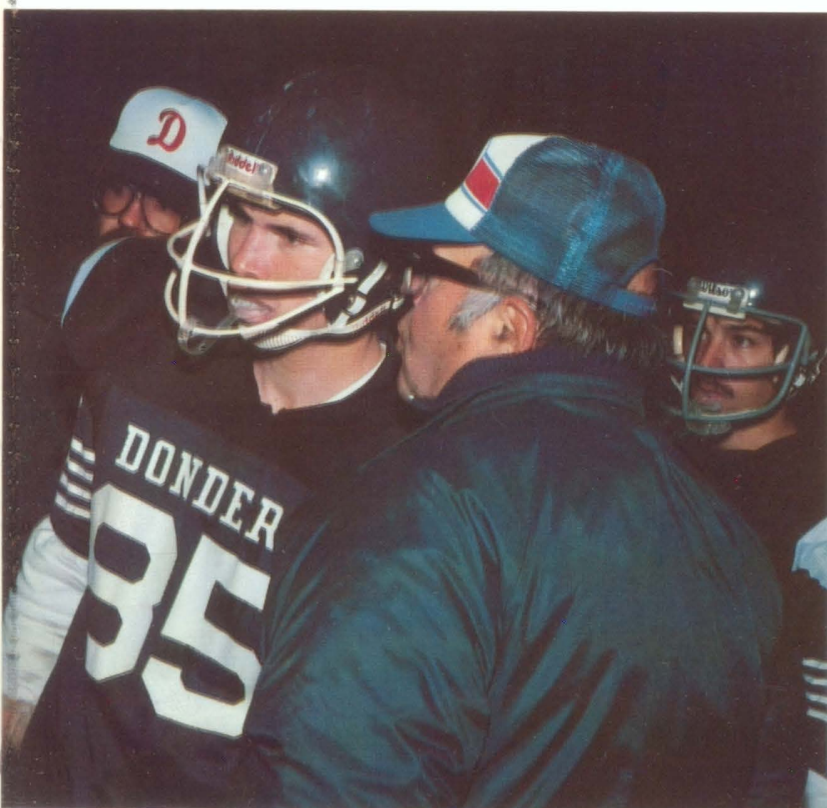
Once again the 1982 OAK is completed at its finest. The book was built step-by-step to provide memories of the 1981-82 school year for the students.

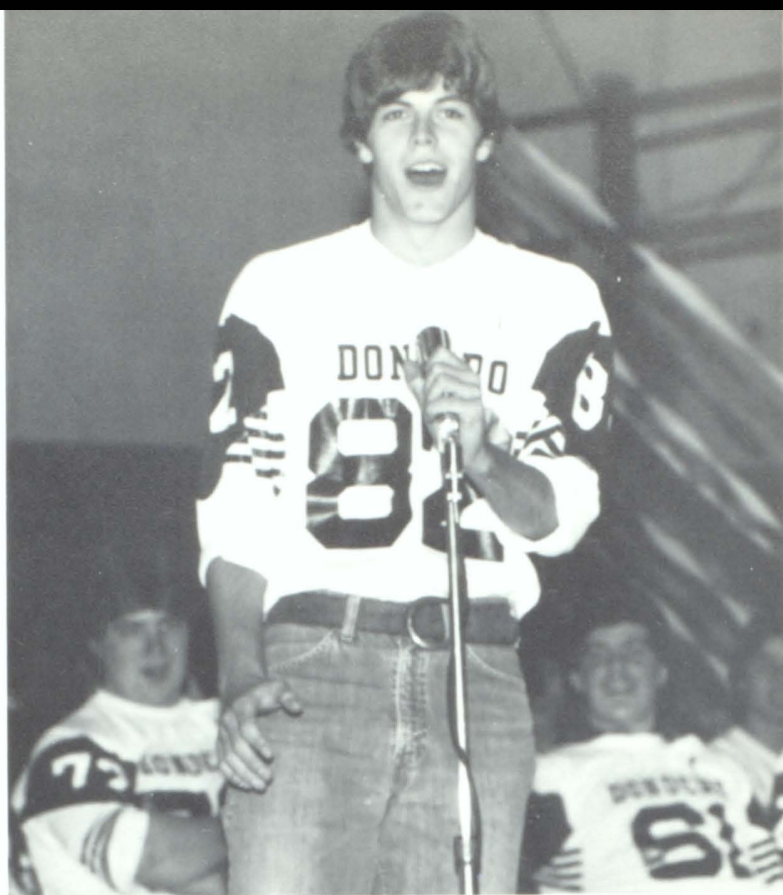
The class of '82 had an exciting year as Seniors. They received first place in the homecoming float plus crushing Lasher with a score of 27-10.

The theme followed was the Muppets with the senior class taking first place with their float of Miss Piggy. The game and parade provided an exciting evening for all.



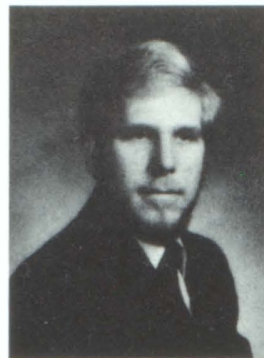

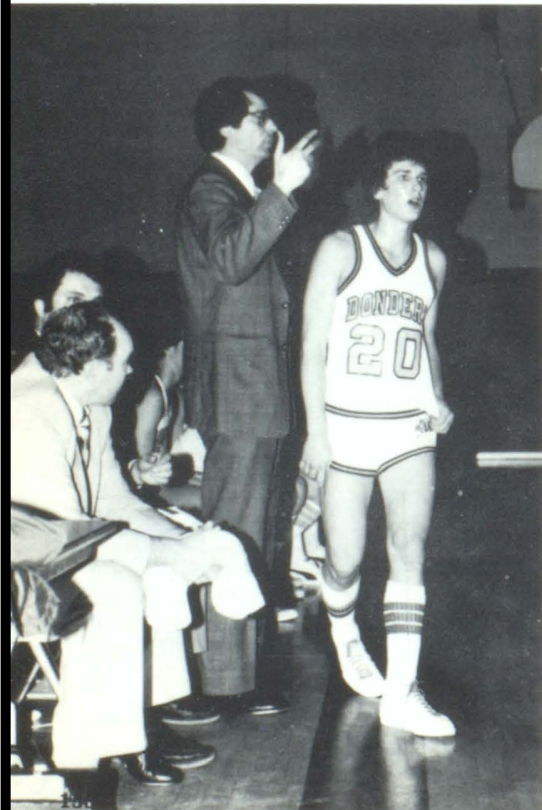

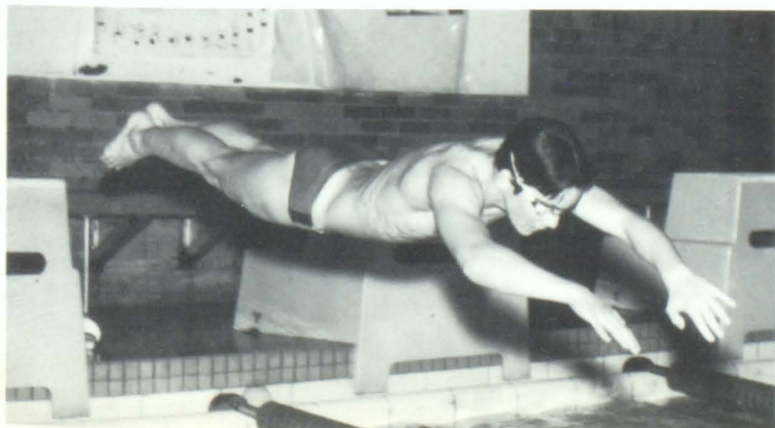

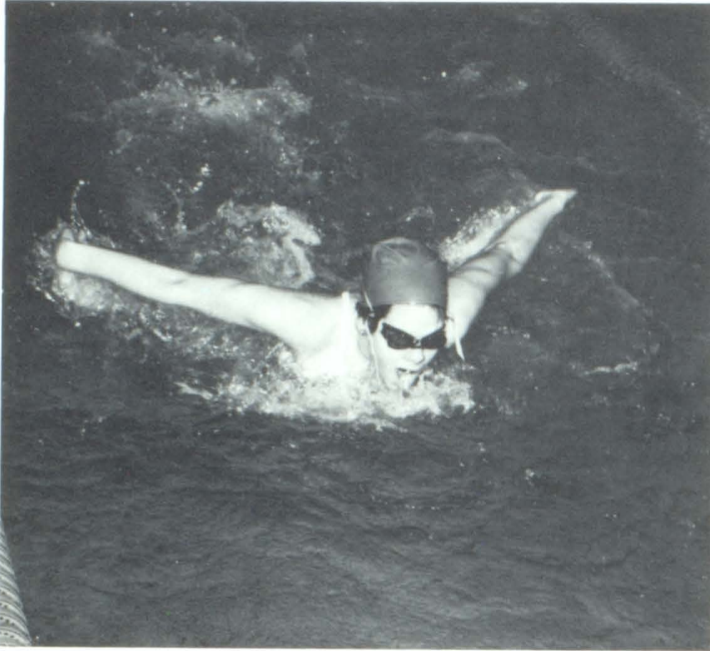

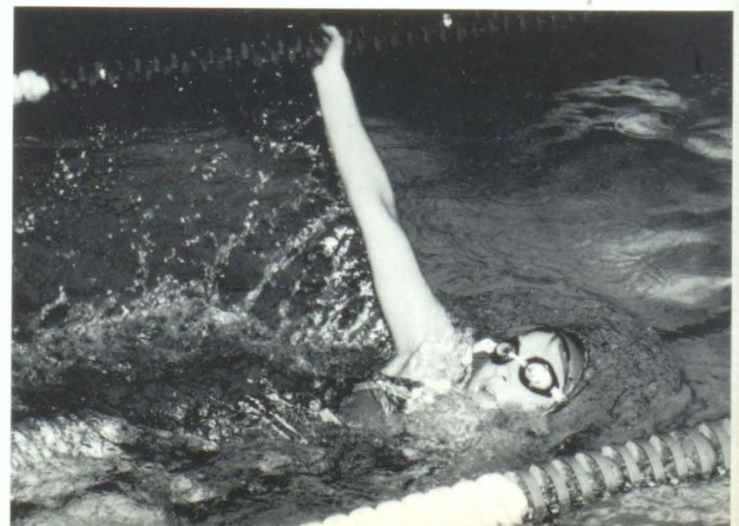

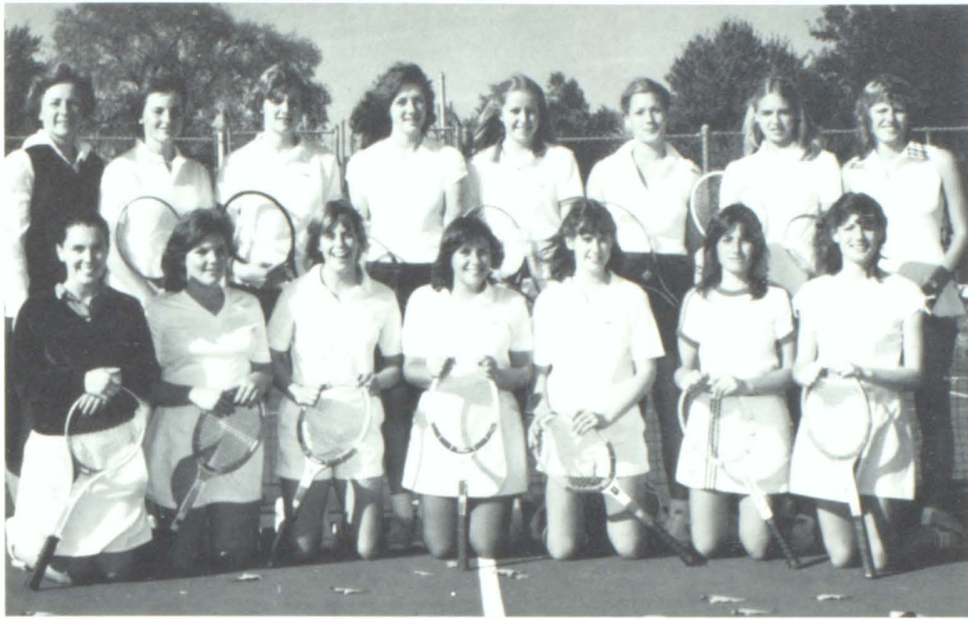

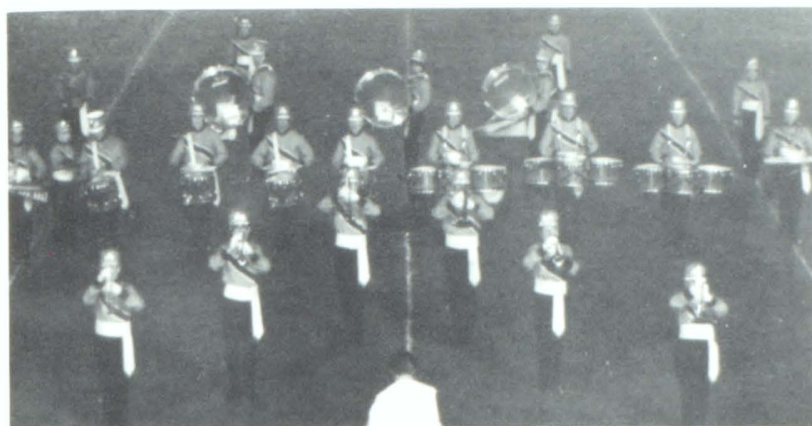

The Foreign Language Department offers four-year courses in French, German, and Spanish. The teachers sponsor clubs for those students interested beyond the bounds of the classroom.

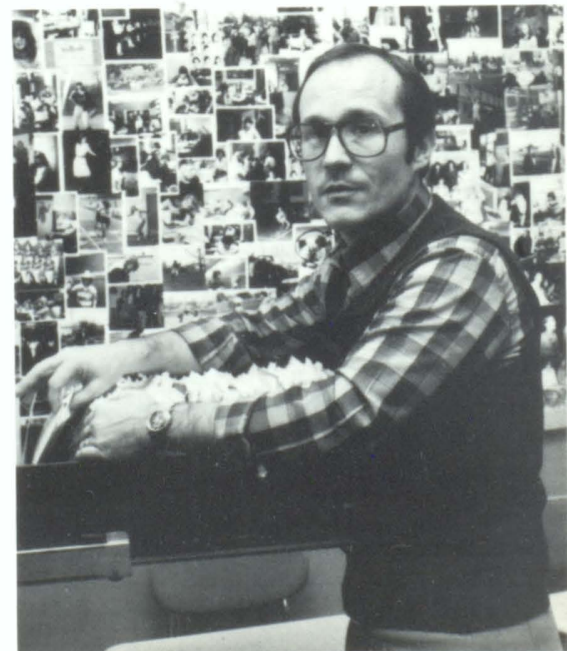
